once, presumably at Geneva in July.
That a parliamentary delegation should be sent to Moscow to "feel the way."

U.S. Ambassador James H. Doolittle left today en route to the United States to be on hand for Adenauer's visit. Count is stopping overnight in London and flying from there to New York tomorrow.

A spokesman who related to reporters yesterday's government statement on the Soviet invitation replied that diplomatic and other relations could be established without Adenauer.

There are those who regard this as a mistake in principle. But responsible officials say it is still uncertain whether the Chancellor will make the journey to Moscow. Government spokesmen insist there will be no meeting with the Russians before the Big Four summit conference planned for July.

The federal republic under Adenauer's leadership is the far more important, powerful and important portion of the divided country.

Earlier this year U.S. officials have found an invitation for Adenauer to visit London to be a matter of a turnabout in Russian behavior.

One of the things which struck about the note to West Germany was the way in which it dealt with the problem of diplomatic relations between Moscow and Bonn as if existing relations and complete government with permanent fixed jurisdiction.

### New Floral Planting Graces Center Park

Have you visited the Center Park lately? If not, you'd better do so in the next few days while the rhododendrons and laurels in the new planting are in bloom.

This new planting, on the north side of the little hill near Myrtle St., can be viewed best from the area just to the west of the Mary Cheney Library. It is not a mature planting yet. It has been there only a short while but it gives present, hearty and great promise for the future.

Two years ago the Manchester Garden Club set aside a sum of money to be used for the improvement of Center Park. Last year another appropriation was added by the club to its park improvement fund. After considerable study and many conferences with Superintendent Murphy and the Garden Club's committee decided

that the club's first park project should be the replanting of the area. The Garden Club paid for the new shrubs. Some small trees along the steps were removed. The new hedge at the bottom of the path was repaired. Then at either side of the steps, just above the paved area at the bottom, a large number of flowering shrubs were set out. Considerable work was done in the planting area. It is a beautiful and interesting view to the north and east.

Trees were crowded. The north approach to the flagpole circle is by a series of low steps, rising from a small paved platform. Hedged with yews toward the top of these steps a number of small trees had grown, too crowded for proper development, and blocking the view of the hill top from the main area of the park.

Superintendent Murphy and the Garden Club's committee decided

For this committee Miss Chapman has done most of the work. She was formerly chairman of the Park Board in Manchester and contributed greatly to the development of the town's parks. 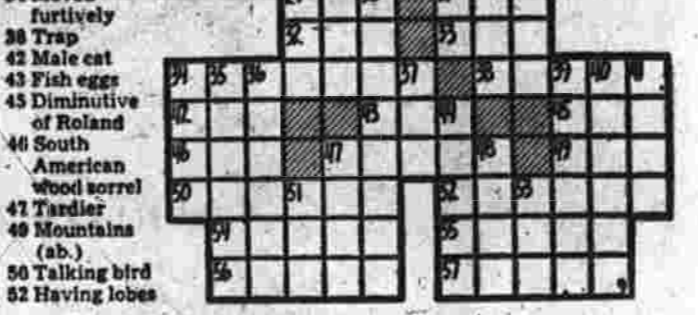

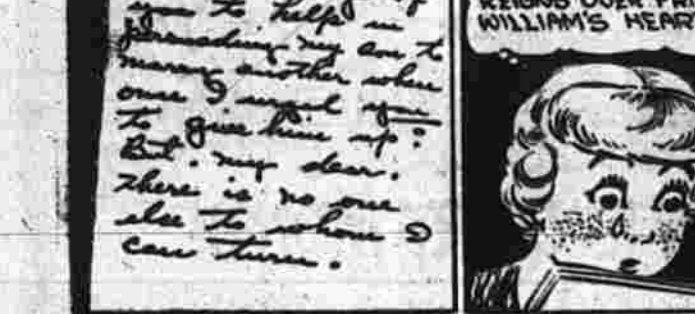
