In the confusion just before midnight, the Republicancontrolled House, while acting on relatively minor measures,
neglected to act on two big tax bills which would provide
about \$48 million in revenue the next two years.

Leaders shouted from the floore
for action on bills continuing the
3 per cent sales tax at its present
rate and the corporations tax.
But they went unheeded.

In the din, it was hard to tell
which bills were passed and which
were not.

Fiscal Failures But just before the clock ran out, the House passed a bill increasing the gasoline tax from four cents to six. Passed, too, in the final moments were bills increasing state education grants by \$19 million, giving state employes a \$180 across the board pay increase and a "baby budget" appropriating nearly \$7 million.
