Agree on Relations With Soviet Union Washington, June 14 (P)—President Eisenhower and West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer formerly declared to-day that "the concept of neutrality" cannot be applied to

"As a result of their discussions they are reassured that there is a very broad field of understanding between them," the joint statement said.

It took up specifically the latest Soviet moves which for a time led some observers to think that a powerful appeal to Germany to accept neutralization in return for reunification might be imminent.

The Eisenhower-Adenauer statement said:

"A large part of their discussion was devoted to the relationship between the nations of the free world and the Soviet Union and particularly the recent developments such as the willingness of the Soviet Union to participate in the four-power conference and the invitation of the free with President Eisenhower today that he thought
