Air Force Secretary says **Nuclear Engine Laboratory** will be "finest"

"The finest laboratory of its kind in the world." That's the way the Air Force's new Connecticut Aircraft Nuclear Engine Laboratory was described by Harold E. Talbott, Secretary of the Air Force. Pratt & Whitney Aircraft will operate the facility, which will be built at Middletown. In a recent appearance with Senator Prescott Bush, Mr. Talbott said construction bids would be called for sometime after July 1. The Middletown site was selected, he said, to be convenient to Pratt & Whitney Aircraft's present facilities and to the engineering group that has been working on nuclear aircraft engine development for more than three years.


