Bishop Tato in effect has been acting leader of the Argentine Catholic church on a number of occasions since, Santiago Lais Cardinal Copello, the primate, was injured last September in a fall down an elevator shaft.

The cardinal, 75, has undergone frequent treatment since then and is now in the hospital.
