Rockville-Vernon Park Removal Asked Again; Merchants to Meet Monday

Rockville, June 15 (Special)—The removal of Central Park, a whole or in part, may become a subject that will stir the current debate concerning the site for a new high school, following a meeting Monday which will air the proposal.

The elimination of the park is called in the center of the city, is a new idea. It has been officially discussed by merchants and residents for years, particularly when parking problems were being discussed.

Yesterday, Robert Rivlin, proprietor of the Rockville Hotel, which is currently undergoing a major improvement program, disclosed that a meeting has been called for Monday at 8:30 at the hotel to sound out the sentiment for the removal of the "Wildcat Green."

Rivlin said that a number of merchants, civic leaders and newspaper representatives have been invited to the meeting, adding that the sole purpose of the meeting was to get an expression of opinion as to the merit of the subject.

He pointed out that the oval shaped park partially divided the city's central business area, and summer, the park's numerous benches lend an old folks home atmosphere to the area.

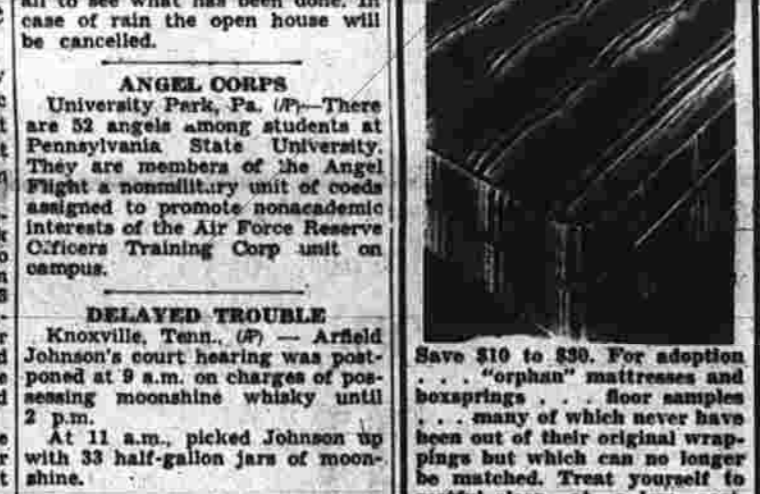

2. In the speech to congressmen, "I am assured you cost emphatically—Germany will honor her obligations... the neutrality or non-alignment of Germany would in a relatively short time permit Soviet Russia to extend her power over all of western Europe."

3. In reply to a question, "if there was a choice between re-confirmation of NATO and a German reneuvement with a very short time that would lead to Germany becoming a satellite state... we want Germany free and re-confirmed."

And the Chancellor maintained that the majority of Germans—even in the Soviet zone, share this opinion.

In their joint statement, Eisenhower and Acheson said they are "reassured that there is a very broad field of understanding between them." Acheson gave a demonstration when he virtually echoed the cautious Eisenhower and Secretary of State Dulles when voting against expecting anything from the Big Four quinquennial.

On disarmament, for example, he said it was out of the question, so complex a subject could be finally dealt with in no short meeting. But he said it would be desirable if Eisenhower and the chief Russian representative were able to declare their determination to transfer into reality the idea of controlled disarmament and not only to talk about it.

Such an approach jibes with Eisenhower's expressed concept of the July meeting as one intended to test the atmosphere and see whether it offers hope that some problems can be solved by diplomatic methods.

Going further, Acheson appealed to free world public opinion to "show great discipline" subject to the President's approval. He said that the position of the United States would be home in the west should not weaken the negotiating position of their representatives—and thereby strengthen them—"by being overcautious."

The 78-year-old Chancellor seeks his strenuous schedule today, planning a visit to the National Gallery of Art one of his regular stops in Washington. Late today he'll leave for Boston. Tomorrow he'll receive an honorary degree from Harvard University.

Krishna Menon resented newsmen's efforts to draw out any detail of his talks. It was known in general he would urge the government to make some conciliatory gesture toward Red China.

He did say his conversations "were about China—the situation in that area—the area of Formosa and the State Department's position that neither the White House nor the State Department should provide any information on the substance of the talks.

Some observers who have known Krishna Menon said he was clearly putting his best personality forward. He has a reputation not only for leading to follow the Communist line on many issues but also for being sharp-tongued and on occasion, exceedingly sarcastic.

In Washington yesterday, he was perceived as being questioning, when he did not want to give factual answers, with good-humored comments and flattery.

This led in with word among diplomats here that Krishna Menon has been trying to develop a more middle ground position for himself in order to play the role of go-between more effectively. Clearly he is not trying to develop the most favorable relations with Dulles and the amount of time spent with him indicated that he had been successful to some degree.

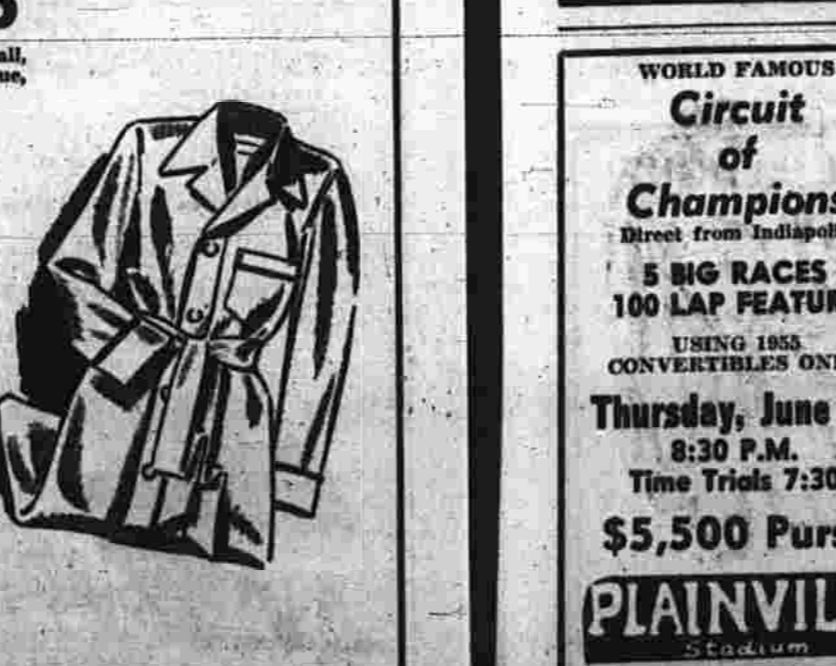

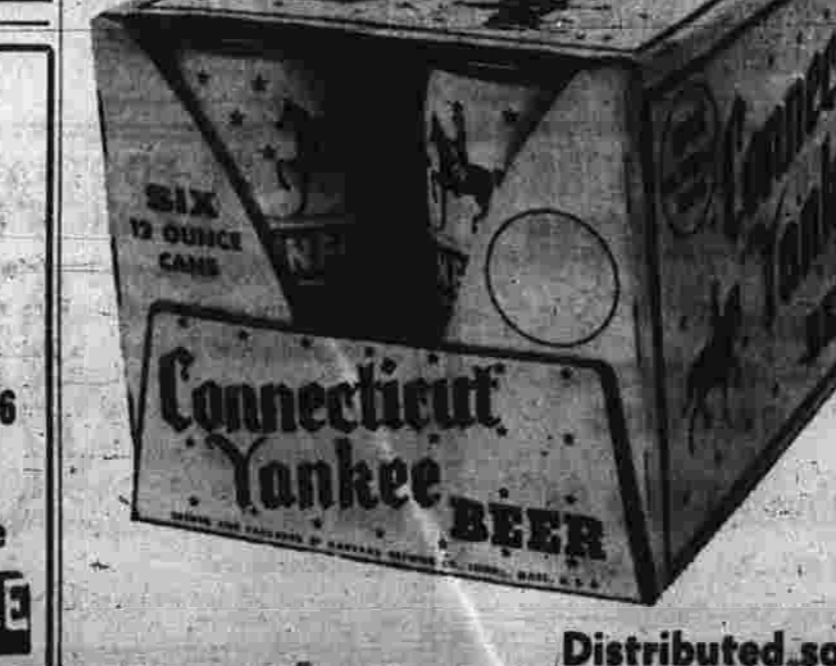

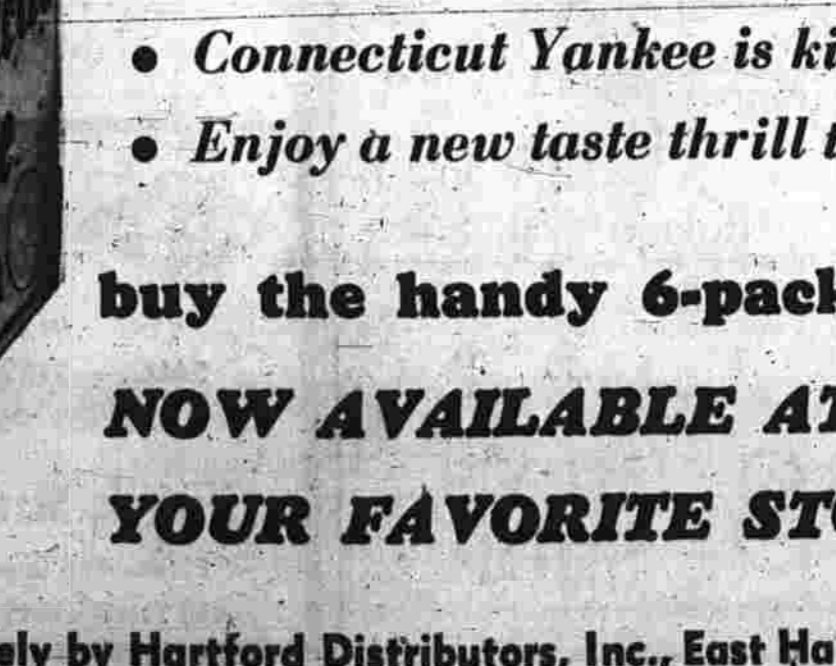
