









### Roadblocks Seen Ahead For Annual Wage Plan

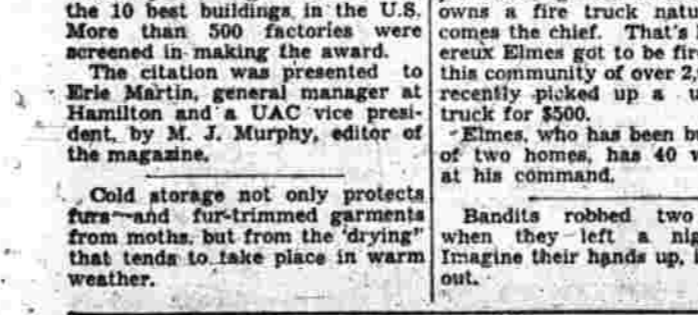
