day in order to perpetrate wrongful acts in many parts of the capital.

"Any groups of persons found in the streets in a suspicious attitude will be treated by military authorities on the spot."

3. Rear Adm. Luis J. Cordero was sworn in as the new Navy minister by Peron to succeed Rear Adm. Amilob Ostia, who had to have disappeared after the rebellion started.

4. Everything is normal in Argentina. The General Confederation of Workers (CGT), which has supported Peron since the start of his rise to power in 1944, opened a 24-hour mourning strike at midnight.

5. Blaming the Navy for the revolt, Peron said the Naval Ministry—"twice the revolutionary command was located—had given up and that the chief 'culprits' were under detention. Peron's access apparently was due to Army refusal to go along with the revolt. "Not one corporal, not one soldier, has failed in his duty," he declared.

Uruguay's Interior Minister, Francisco Canavese, said 28 planes carrying 60 officers and men from Argentina's Naval and Air arms landed here yesterday and last night. The first known civilian refugees, Congressman Miguel Angel Zavala Ortiz, crossed the border Plata River to Colonia, Uruguay. He is a member of the opposition Radical party.

Canavese said all refugees were ordered interned and their weapons seized.

More of the rebellious Navy was reported being to Uruguay aboard the Argentine's three training cruisers, the 6,800-ton "25th of May" and the 6,100-ton coast defense ship Puyrredon.

5. The government has taken severe measures, and is fighting against Communists who "look advantage of the fight between the rebels and the loyal forces yesterday.

hower should go into the meeting with the Premier of Britain, France and Russia prepared to state the Free World's position on such vital issues as free elections in the Soviet satellite and the conditions under which Germany could be demilitarized.

"I think the opportunity will be there to demonstrate that the Free World is seeking peace," Knowland said. "The President could lay down a pattern by which peace could be achieved."

"That would put the Russians on a spot. If they refuse even to discuss elections in the satellite countries, for instance, the world will quickly see through the sham of their professed peaceful intentions."

Knowland, who originally opposed American participation in any such Big Four meeting, said now that one has been arranged he wants to see that it amounts to some offensive in the battle of ideologies.

He disputed in the Senate yesterday a charge by Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) that Eisenhower had made "a tragic blunder" in ever agreeing to the meeting.

Speaking in an almost empty Senate, McCarthy said Eisenhower had "argued to play an attached deck" with the prospect that the outcome would be a Communist victory.

Knowland replied that he, for one, was not going to take the attitude that only defeat can come out of the Geneva meeting.

Knowland's expressed confidence in the ability of Eisenhower and Secretary of State Dulles to do "everything they can to protect our interests" was accorded by Sen. Bender (R-Ohio) and Sen. Thye (R-Minn.).

Riker Invents Screen for 3-D

years ago in his campaign to win a "distinguishing audience."

"I saw Chairman, Chasen, Cope and Viciavision," he said, "but it all seemed too complicated. And it was obnoxious; everybody's equipment."

ED Without Glasses

Riker, who has been a home movie fan for over 26 years, started thinking in terms of providing home movies with 3-D, but without using glasses, as the 3-D movies then required, and certainly without Cinema's right sound speakers, three projectors of tremendous size.

Riker thought the idea he had in mind would provide a simple, inexpensive solution to the problem of how to give home movies the dimension of depth, so he started to work on it.

At this time—early in 1954—Riker already had a number of inventions to his credit, among them a rubber shoe insole used as a mounting for equipment in factories. He designed it for the Sea, Chain Manufacturing Co. of Bridgeport, and the insole has been credited with toning down a comparative whisper what used to be a deafening roar of machinery.

Riker also had a tradition of creativity behind him. His father, also an engineer, had been head of the Riker Electric Car Co. of New Haven from 1914 until 1931, when he developed a gasoline engine and became associated with the locomotive Co. in Bridgeport. It was an engine developed by the elder Riker that powered the winning car in the 1908 Vanderbilt Cup Race.

Never Gave Eyes a Chance

Despite his background and what had seemed a simple idea, Riker found translating that idea into a practicable design a difficult job.

"What I wanted," Riker said recently in discussing his invention, "was to be able to project a scene as it looked when the picture was taken. I believed the camera took what was seen but never gave the eyes a chance to see it when we projected on a screen. It was the looking at wallpaper."

"We always see things in relation to each other in nature, and I wanted a screen that would show a scene as it looked in nature." This was the requirement. For so, for himself and his wife, he started working on it in earnest in February of 1954. A month and his wife remember as the beginning of a hectic period.

Spare Time Project

The problem, Riker found, was not only to design a screen that would provide depth, but one that would provide it without distortion.

potential in the field of professional movies.

Since it was designed for conventional film, camera and projector, it could mean that professional movies, already shot in the conventional process, could be given the dimension of depth without any more expense than the cost of equipping a theater with a Riker screen.

This use, however, depends on whether the screen can be adapted to movie-theater size, and Riker has never attempted anything that large. But he sees no reason why the adaptation can not be made, and he is confident that screen's use in movie theaters will be an outgrowth of home projection.

Although Riker's invention was built primarily for the person who wants to project movies or slides in his home, it has an interesting and shown movies, acted as consultant to groups on movie projection.

Amazed at greater depth than he had ever seen, Riker had brought along a traveling kit of a hunting trip in Canada, which he has used for test purposes, and he said later that he had never seen the film projected so well before.

"I never thought you could throw a picture on a curved screen without distortion," he said, adding, "I was amazed at the greater depth" Riker's screen provided.

In fact, so impressed was Harp with the screen that he has also drawn up a list of names of persons connected with the movie industry whom he has suggested that Riker invite to view his screen.

Riker describes his screen as being "a combination of planes and curves so arranged as to provide the illusion of depth without distortion." And that's how it works—out-depth without distortion.

A colored slide of a wood scene, while picture on the flat screen Riker uses for contrast with his own, takes on a new dimension of depth on the curved surface, with each of the trees having a definite relationship to one another.

Illusion of Reality

In some slides the curved screen actually reveals elements that aren't even suggested on the flat surface. A Colorado scene of mountains, rocks and trees, for instance, is found to contain a gorge when shown on Riker's screen. On the conventional screen, the gorge had been flattened invisibly into the surrounding green.

Movies take on a similar illusion of reality, and a small group of people who attended what was probably the first public showing of Riker's screen at the recent Saturday night came away impressed.
