



Lloyd Stryker Passes at 70. Defended Hiss

New York, June 22 (A) Lloyd Paul Stryker, one of New York's foremost trial lawyers, who handled the defense at the first trial of Alger Him, died yesterday at the age of 70.

Stryker was renowned for dramatic and clever courtroom techniques long before he won national attention at the 1949 Him trial. In that case us got a hung jury.

For reasons that H'ms never explained, Stryker did not defend him in the second trial at which the former State Department official was convicted of perjury and sent to jail for five years.

Regarded as a master of cross-examination, Stryker was the author of several law tooks. He was born in Chicago and practiced law in New York since 1909.
