A long conference in the program.

He added, however, that this was purely a theoretical conclusion but that no one can say whether the amount of impurities in the vaccine would be enough to cause damage.

Salk said an extraordinary amount of kidney tissue was used in experiments on animals and that no kidney damage was demonstrable.

Mayer said that "experiments with 100 animals do not furnish enough material" to use them as basis for deciding what might happen when 20 million children are injected with similar materials.

Dr. Albert B. Sabin of the Children's Hospital Research Foundation, Cincinnati, told the House group that polio is most deadly to young adults between the ages of 21 and 30. It is "no longer a disease we should call infantile paralysis," he said.

Sabin also said paralytic polio strikes most frequently in the higher and middle income groups than in any other class of society.

Mayer said these impurities might well be harmful but that in his view this should be done in a "commercially feasible" way to reduce them sharply and that the question should be decided by Congress.

Dr. John F. Enders of the Children's Hospital, Boston, said "it is possible that the kidney protein may give rise to reactions in human beings."

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2.5 Million Quit Smoking in U.S.

Washington, June 22 (AP)—The Surgeon General today announced that 2,500,000 persons have quit smoking cigarettes in the past 2 1/2 years. A more complete report is expected in several months.

The study, based on a sampling of about 40,000 persons, was made on behalf of the Public Health Service's National Cancer Institute.

The health service said the data would be useful in the study of the incidence of cancer in the population—particularly lung cancer—in relationship to smoking.

There was no indication in the preliminary report as to how many of those who quit smoking did so because of concern of the possibility of a link between smoking and lung cancer.

Foreign Relations Committee members said at a hearing on McCarthy's resolution yesterday they also hope the conference may ease the plight of millions behind the Iron Curtain.

Johnson, who testified, quoted the majority leader, the committee as saying the McCarthy resolution would "blow up" the conference unless decisively defeated by the Senate.

Opposing the resolution, however, said it is "necessary to rely on the judgment and ability" of the President and Dulles.

Johnson told reporters he and George agreed it was essential to bring McCarthy's resolution to the Senate floor for a vote, rather than allow the Foreign Relations Committee to sidetrack it.

Johnson said that a decision struck on whether action should be confined to a limited group of 15 men or the whole Senate.

He predicted "some activity" in today's debate which might lead to a substitute resolution, Sen. Capehart (R-Ind.) however, said he didn't think any substitute could give a majority of the Senate to hand what he called "this touchy question."

House Votes 'Top-to-Bottom' Primary Bill Pinay Urges United Germany, Warns on Red Buffer Bid

Sees Arms Curb Pact Far Ahead

San Francisco, June 22 (AP)—French Foreign Minister Antoine Pinay today called for a unified Germany but declared the West must reject Soviet efforts to turn it into a neutral buffer.

German unity must be established with equal security for all, the French Foreign Minister declared today in a news conference. He said the West must not be lulled by a neutral Germany, for a great people cannot indefinitely be subjected to the whims of a few.

Pinay said the German problem is one of the main pretexts that divide the East and West. The French diplomat made no specific mention of yesterday's speech by Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev, but in effect his remarks on Germany answered at least one of Khrushchev's points.

Pinay dealt with the disarmament problem briefly, but with cautious optimism that some progress was being made. "An agreement on disarmament (Continued on Page Twelve)

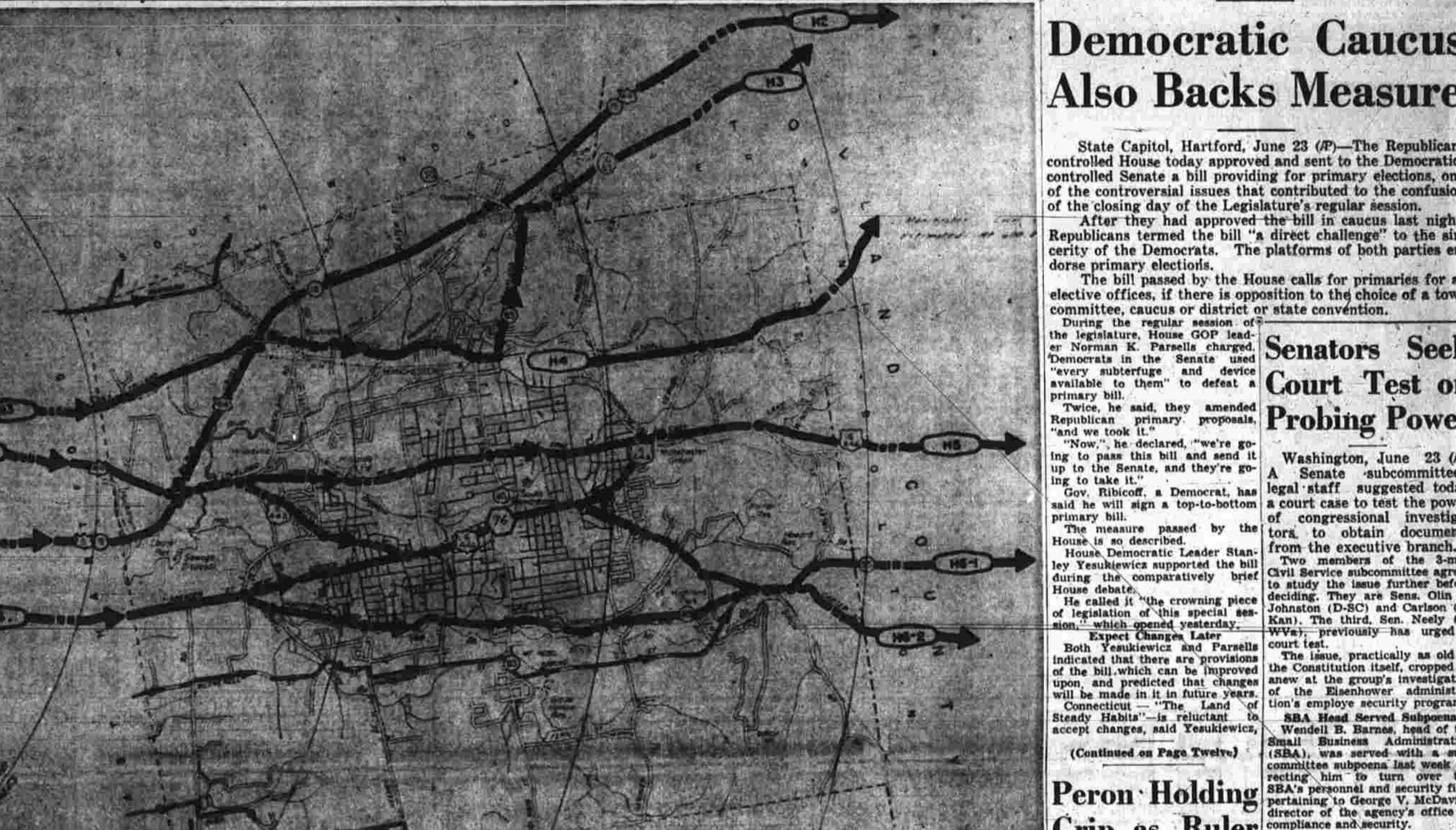
Nehru Agrees With Bulganin On Coexistence

Moscow, June 22 (AP)—The premier of India and India's chief minister today agreed to a ban on nuclear weapons and the Communist China and the Soviet Union.

The declaration was signed last night by Indian Prime Minister Nehru and Soviet Premier Bulganin and published in the Communist Chinese newspaper today at the end of Nehru's 17-day visit to the Soviet Union.

Nehru and Bulganin called also for a "simultaneous and substantial reduction of conventional armaments" with "effective international control." They criticized Soviet disarmament proposals as a "substantial contribution to peace."

The document was published here today in the Communist Chinese newspaper. It was the first time they had said together.
