State Capitol, Hartford, June 24 (P)—The Senate and House became deadlocked today on the question of how much money should be provided for state vocational schools. The differences were brought to a head as the Senate amended

a House bill to provide for schools projects in Hartford and Danielson, items opposed by Republicans and supported by Democrats.

As passed by the House yesterday, the bill authorized a \$7,034,000 bond issue. The Senate upped that figure to \$12,917,000 to provide \$4,798,000 for Hartford, \$85,000 for Danielson and \$1,000,000 for New Britain.

The New Britain item previously had been approved by the Senate in a separate bill, but it was decided to lump it in with the other vocational schools in a single overall wounded.

### **Attacks Seven Point** Russian Peace Plan

San Francisco, June 24 (P)-Secretary of State John Foster Dulles told Russia in blunt language today: The way to end the Cold War is to stop using force against other countries and to stop supporting subversion.

In a stinging attack on Communism, Dulles declared:

"To bring the Cold War to an end, seven points are no

eded; this one is sufficient." The Secretary spoke at the U.N.'s 10th anniversary meeting, which Wednesday heard Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov propose a seven-point program to liquidate the Cold

Dulles spoke with President Eisenhower's "full confidence and concurrence." The President himself said so on Monday when he addressed the opening session. He toid the delegates the Secretary would speak today "on appropriate elements in the foreign policy of this nation."

Increase the state gasoline tax from four to six cents a gallon.
Continue the state sales tax at three per cent.
Continue the rates set temporarily in 1953 for the corporation and unicorporated business taxes.

And authorize the state highway commissioner to increase parkway and bridge tolls, now 10 cents at each toll station, beginning July I.
