Wyoming, too, got a new drenching yesterday afternoon, with hail, and the river started to reach out further as it did great damage to rich sugar beet lands.

Winds reached 80 miles an hour in several sections of Carlsbad, N. M. Telephone and power lines were ripped down and heavy rajns flooded streets. Five inches of rain fell in four hours at Canadian, in southeastern New Mexico, near the Texas border.

Scattered showers and thunderstorms sprinkled the great plains and parts of the southern and southeastern states.

Skies were generally clear from the Mississippi Valley eastward to the Atlantic and west of the Continental Divide.

Temperature variations were slight, compared with the previous 24 hours. Early morning readings ranged from 42 at Bryce Canyon, Utah to 85 at Blythe and Needles, Calif. Other temperatures:

Before the exorbitant new salary demands were made of the motor truck operators, the industry was paying out nearly 55c of every truck shipping dollar to labor. THINK OF IT! Do you know of any other industry that pays such a high proportion of their earnings to labor? And the excessive wage increases that were being asked would have forced at least a 20% increase in truck shipping rates to compensate for the new salary-demands, as well as for fringe benefits and vacations.






