mean, however, that the invitation is not accepted. He said the next step now will be to wait and see what the Russians have to say to the German note.

Contents of the note have been sent to the United States, Britain and France, he added. Adnan has been reluctant to accept the Soviet invitation. For political reasons it will be difficult for him to reject it.

Apparently he wants to clarify just what subjects the Russians are prepared to accept before he finally agrees to make the journey. Meanwhile, the United States and West Germany signed a military assistance agreement under which the Germans will receive hundreds of millions of dollars of American equipment for their new armed forces.

The agreement calls for the United States to provide equipment, materials and services to help West Germany build up the 500,000-man force promised to the Atlantic Alliance. West Germany in turn pledged that it will use American aid to promote "an integrated defense of the North Atlantic area in accordance with defense plans formulated" by the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO).

U.S. Ambassador J. M. A. B. Conant and West German Foreign Minister Heinrich von Brentano signed the agreement. The United States will set up a military assistance advisory group in Bonn to supervise the distribution of American weapons to the Germans.

The U.S. Embassy in its announcement said: "The agreement follows closely the general pattern of the military assistance agreements under which the U.S. is supplying other NATO countries with military assistance pursuant to the Mutual Security Act of 1954."

Chamber Board of Control Indicates 'Go-Slow' Policy

The Town Planning Commission will have to wait a while longer before the Chamber of Commerce endorses any aspect of its plan to develop the shopping center on the Chamber of Commerce site. Members of the Board of Control of the Chamber of Commerce are making their views known to the plan until they know more about it.

The Board did authorize the Civic Affairs Committee, which has been representing the Chamber in matters pertaining to the Commission's long-range program, to publish the plan "through, every possible means" and to cooperate with town agencies in doing studies in connection with its execution.

But the Board failed to put in the form of a motion a proposal that the Chamber should advise the Civic Affairs Committee, that the Chamber should advise the steps involved in the program. "These would include a study of parking conditions in the Main St. area."

Motion Falls to Pass

It failed also to vote on a motion to place the Chamber president Bruce Watkins and moved by Board member Walter Perry — that would have permitted the Civic Affairs Committee, with the approval of the Chamber's Board of Directors, to conduct further study. The executive committee serves as an advisory to the Board of Control and the Chamber's various committees.

This second proposal was advanced in the interest of saving time. The Board of Control will not meet again until September, and both Broderick and Watkins are on the plan at yesterday's meeting, and Phillip Harrison, a member of the town's Board of Directors as well as of the Board of Control, indicated they regarded time as being of the essence.

But the Board preferred reserving to itself the final decision on endorsing any aspect of the plan. It directed that the executive committee relay any endorsement proposal to the 29 Board members for a vote. This vote would be taken either at a telephone poll or at a specially called meeting.

Stands Necessary

Although the Board did not take a position yesterday, Watkins put the matter on the agenda for the future, have to take stands on various controversial issues. He said such stands would be necessary if the Chamber of Commerce is to fulfill its mission of active participation in town affairs.

At the same time, Watkins said the Board would take a stand only after a definite recommendation by a Chamber committee and a vote of the Board of Control.

In this connection he advised Broderick that the latter's position on Tuesday's meeting of the Board of Directors should be nothing more than "inquisitive and neutral." The Directors Tuesday are holding a public hearing on the question of whether the sidewalk on Purnell Pl. should be moved from the east side of the sidewalk to the west. Purnell Pl. is in the heart of the downtown area, as discussed in the Town Planning Commission's program for the area's development.

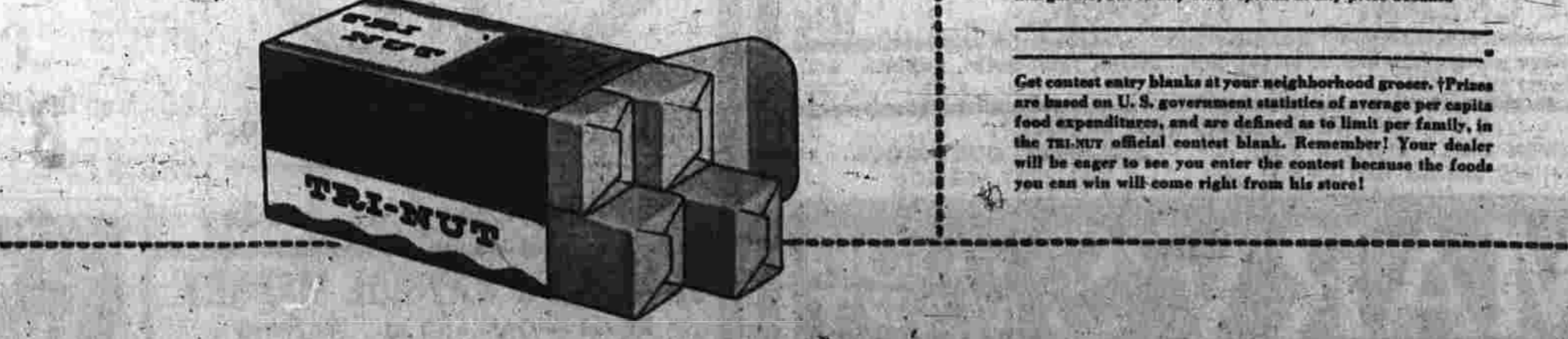

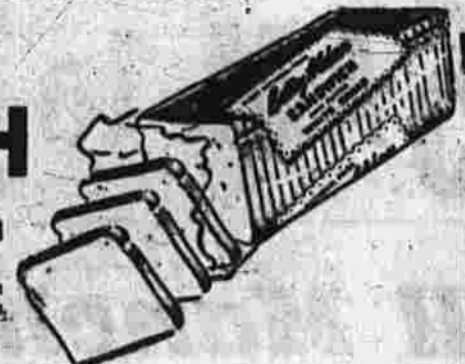
