Senator Blasts Ike Plan to Use Vets To Build Reserves

Washington, July 7 (AP)—Sen. Russell (D-Ga.) today questioned the propriety of requiring veterans to carry the chief burden of the administration's new military reserve plan.

Russell, chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, today issued a statement prepared for the opening of committee hearings on the bill which has been introduced by President Eisenhower.

"Our price-conscious men and themselves right when they were at the time of Korea," he said, "the only men available to increase the great nation's stock of shoulder the heavy burden of an active combat-ready reserve."

Russell contrasted the situation with that he said was contemplated by the Senate vote for Universal Military Training (DPMR) four years ago only to have it die in the House.

The aim of that program, he said, was to build up a combat-ready reserve, not calling on the services of active duty.

"So let me make this one thing clear," he said, "if today, the situation facing this nation is such that we must force this added burden on these men who have already served, we are not only not being fair, but we are not being realistic."

But, I must insist that this obligation be imposed as a new and separate program.

As we were perhaps wiser to observe even during the 1952 campaign, the attitude toward centralized federal power and the doctrine of "state's rights" is likely to vary according to the political party in power.

The Democrats are a fine state's rights party until they get control of the federal government. Then they believe in having the federal government do those things it can best—and some better—do.

During the long reign of the New Deal, with its pronounced accent on having the federal government do everything, the Republican party faded slowly but conclusively, so far as its own history is concerned.

At last, this tendency reached full flower in the 1952 campaign, when the Republican party and its standard bearer made state's rights part of its crusade.

There was some opinion, then, that if the party which had elected Truman, it would, in its turn, come to think more kindly of federal functions, once it itself controlled them.

Perhaps the main finding of the Commission is that the states themselves ought to show more zeal in acting on problems, so the people will not call upon the federal government to take them over.

### Schuster - Losca Suit Against City In Son's Slaying

New York, July 7 (AP)—Max Schuster has lost another bid to make the city pay for the death of his son, Arnold, 24, who was slain in 1952 after helping police trap bank robber Willie (the Actor) Sutton.

The appellate division of the State Supreme Court ruled yesterday that there was no claim of contractual liability in the \$100,000 damage suit, which previously was dismissed by a lower court.

Sutton, now serving a life term for a Queens, N. Y., robbery, denied any knowledge of the slaying.

The appellate court said young Schuster was not employed by the police department and that police did not assume "the duty of a guardian toward him" after he formed them of Sutton's whereabouts.

Liability for the death could be based solely on the grounds that police had failed to give Schuster special protection, the court said. It was a member of the general public, no duty of special protection was owed him by police.

The elder Schuster claimed police had failed to provide protection although they were informed that his son received threatening notes and telephone calls after the slaying.

### Sound Barrier Flight Causes Stir in London

London, July 7 (AP)—A test pilot who started London's first sound barrier flight through the sound barrier, a test pilot, delighted the city after he had broken it.

The fun began last Tuesday when Dickie-Martin, pilot for the Gloster Aircraft Co., was test-flying a test plane, delta-winged jet-propelled, in a routine 100-mile an hour flight.

Suddenly Martin's oxygen tube got tangled in his parachute harness. When he tried to free it, the plane lurched, gathered speed and reached through the sound barrier.

Frightened Londoners phoned police that a bomb had gone off. Ballons on the river Thames prepared to abandon their ships, convinced the boilers had burst. Scotland Yard made extra inquiries but could find no explanation.

The Gloster company finally got in touch with the Air Ministry to explain what had happened, and relay Martin's explanation.

### Police Puzzled By Butcher Who Pays Pawnshop Money

Chicago, July 7 (AP)—A butcher who for about three years says he has been paying money—and getting cash and pawn tickets—in return for stolen goods.

But police said they don't know what to do about it.

Sgt. John Doyle of the police pawn shop detail says that pawn tickets are given out to make sense. But he added there is no law against paying money.

The man arrested in a South State Street pawn shop, Joseph K. Johnson, 45, admitted paying between \$250 and \$1,000 in 15 pawn shops in the last three years mostly in small amounts.

Doyle said Johnson told him he would pay \$20 for example, and receive \$27.50 and a pawn ticket. He never went back to redeem the money.

"What's the idea?" asked Doyle, who has been looking for the man who has been paying money.

"What do you think?" Johnson asked in reply. "There's nothing illegal about it."

Doyle said he found seven serial numbers clipped from coupons in Johnson's possession and decided he would turn him over to the Secret Service and have Johnson investigated for violation of currency.
