### U.S. Better Invite Reds-- Or They Will Invite Ike

Washington, July 28 (AP)—President Eisenhower wants to let the Russian leaders mingle with the sweating proletariat in his country, they may best him to the punch by asking him to Moscow. They already seem fully launched on a public relations job that has the rest of the world started and guessing.

Eisenhower told his news conference yesterday that at Geneva last week Western and Russian leaders discussed exchange visits "throughout the whole ecstasies of government." That means all the way from the top to the bottom.

### Alliance Winning Malayan Election

Kuala Lumpur, Malaya, July 28 (AP)—Voting in remote jungle districts continued today in the Federation of Malaya's first national election. Contests already decided gave an alliance of Malay, Chinese and Indian groups a landslide victory.

In votes counted so far from the halting yesterday, Alliance candidates had won 53 of the 54 legislative council seats decided.

Nearly a million people, turned out to vote.

There are 52 elective seats in the council. The other 6 of the 58-member group will be appointed by British high commissioners for the protectorate. Sir Donald McCallum, he also retains a veto on council decisions.

South Central state groups had slight decreases.

In a special discussion of polio involving persons who had been given Salk polio vaccine, the report said that October 20 there had been 210 confirmed post-vaccination cases, including 132 paralytic and 78 nonparalytic cases. The total included 10 between July 13 and July 20.

"Conclusions can be drawn from these case reports with respect to the efficacy of the vaccine," the report said. "The 1954 field trial showed that the vaccine was effective in preventing paralytic poliomyelitis." The report said that some paralytic cases can be expected in vaccinated areas, however, because the vaccine is not 100 per cent effective.

Some 6 1/2 million children have been given the Salk vaccine since it was licensed April 12.

The special discussion did not list "accepted," or confirmed cases among family and other contacts of vaccinated persons but a spokesman said they totaled 203 through July 20, up one from 202 through July 13.
