Special Lamb Roast 4 to 5 lb. leg of lamb with salt and pepper, place in roaster and add 2 cups water. Roast 40 minutes. Energy tenderloin (water is almost evaporated at this point). Spoon all fat from drippings, add 1/2 cup water, Worcestershire sauce, catsup to drippings, scrape all brown solids from sides of pan and heat to slightly thick. Serve over hot sliced lamb. Enough for 8.

Washington, July 29 (AP)—The government said today it has begun producing weapons whose design is based on the spectacular 1954 hydrogen bomb tests in the Pacific and hinted these are of several types. It said also that the prospect for developing an atomic power plant have "considerably brightened in the last six months."

The Atomic Energy Commission (AEC), which made these disclosures, was a co-sponsor of a report in its 18th semi-annual report to Congress. The report covered the first half of this year.

The commission said that all of its activities—which include production of atomic and thermonuclear weapons—continued during the period of its report and with increasing effectiveness.

Some scientists have speculated that one device tested in the AEC's "Operation Castle" at the Pacific proving grounds in the spring of last year may have been a "hydrogen-thermonuclear bomb."

This speculation has been that such a device would be a conventional A-bomb to trigger a hydrogen bomb, which would be a jacket of uranium pretty much as it occurs in nature. The theory is that such a weapon would produce much more radioactivity than even an H-bomb with its deadly clouds capable of covering a 7,000-square-mile area.

There was nothing in the AEC's report to support this speculation, said only the following Operation Castle.

The weapons program was directed toward development of weapons whose design was based on the results of these tests.

"During the first six months of 1955, weapons production continued with the President's directive included types including atomic designs."

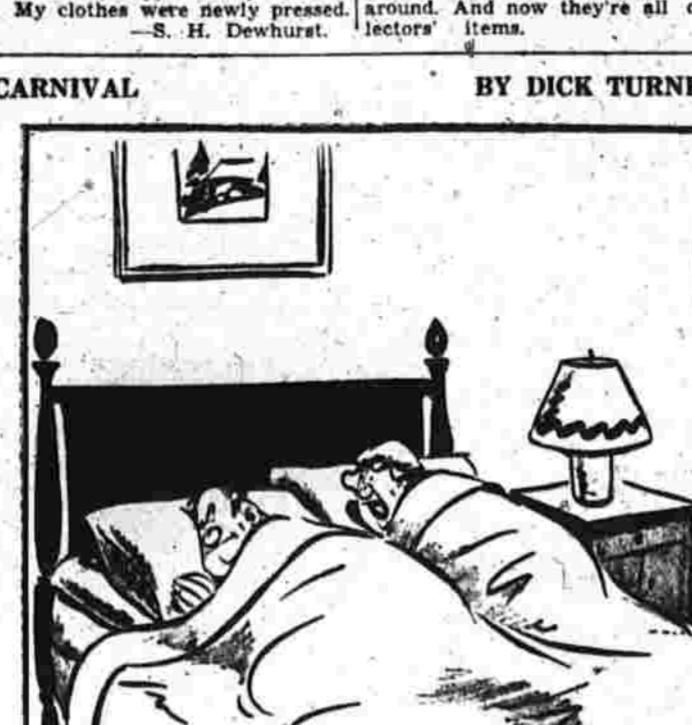
