President Dwight D. Eisenhower has approved the resignation of Robert H. Taft, Jr., as director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and has named J. Edgar Hoover as his successor.

Mr. Taft's resignation was announced today by the president in a statement issued from the White House. Mr. Hoover's appointment was also announced in the same statement.

### What's Doing in Pratt & Whitney Aircraft—

NEW FIGHTER, NEW TRANSPORT TO HAVE PWA TURBOJET ENGINES



A NEW, supersonic Navy jet fighter and a new commercial jet transport plane will be powered by Pratt & Whitney Aircraft J-57 engines. They bring to ten the number of different aircraft models that are or will be powered by J-57s, a number that foretells a long production future for the big P&WA engine.

The new planes are Chance Vought's sleek XF8U-1 (top), a Navy day fighter now being test flown, and Douglas' coming jet transport, the four-engined DC-8 shown in this artist's conception. The DC-8 is scheduled to be ready for flight testing late in 1957. It will carry from 80 to 125 passengers, and will have a top speed in excess of 550 m.p.h.

Another J-57-powered transport, the Boeing Stratoliner, is also available for commercial sales. The prototype of this airplane, the Model 707, first flew about a year ago, and a military version, the KC-135 tanker, has been ordered into production for the Air Force.

### BUILDING COMMUNITY BENEFITS

The Hartford Tool and Die Company, Inc. of Bloomfield, provides another example of how Pratt & Whitney Aircraft's local subcontracting program benefits both the community and the nation.

London, Aug. 3 (AP)—A British scientist said today American scientists will try to create "artificial moonlight" 60 miles above the Earth during experiments in New Mexico, probably next month.

Prof. D. H. Bates made the statement in disclosing that British scientists are considering the same experiment, which involves release of sodium vapor from high altitude rockets.

There are difficulties in boiling the sodium vapor. Release of the metal requires the use of a special apparatus, which has been suggested but it has proved troublesome, he declared.

The upper atmosphere contains about 100 million tons of sodium which produces a great deal of light in the lower atmosphere, and the chemical reactions going on in it.

Rewed Wife Faces Choice of Husbands

Cisco Grove, Calif., Aug. 3 (AP)—A thin 20-year-old girl today faced the biggest decision of her life: Whether to return to the airman husband she thought was dead or stay with the man she married later and loves. "I knew it was coming, but I didn't know when," said Mrs. Alfred Fine, who at 17 wed Airman 2C Daniel Schmidt, of Corsair 42nd, and bore his son after he left for overseas.

Now she is the wife of a 21-year-old logging camp tractor operator. They live in a small trailer a few miles from this tiny highway town in the High Sierra.

Only Monday she learned that Schmidt is one of 11 American prisoners of war and 17,204 civilians. No airman due for momentary release by the Chinese. Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek said Monday that 2 1/2 years of imprisonment on spy charges. He went overseas 30 months ago.

"She's living to meet Schmidt when he arrives in this country. With her will go her 2 1/2-year-old son, a dark-eyed youngster who has never seen his father. "I honestly don't know what I'm going to do," she told a reporter. "Naturally I'm tickled he is returning. Whatever I decide, the decision will be my own."

She said she married Fine two months before learning from the Air Force that her husband was alive and well as a war prisoner. "I made a mistake," she said, "but I'm not entitled to a mistake."

Never Told Husband Dead Mrs. Fine said she had never been officially told that Schmidt was dead. She received notification only that he was missing somewhere in Korea.

"I thought he was dead, you know, but he's never been in prison or ever been heard from again..." Schmidt indicated Schmidt doesn't know of her remarriage when she said:

"I think it's better to come home and find your wife is happily married than to come home and find she's still running around with everybody."

Of Schmidt, she says: "I loved him very much, but he was the father of my child. But I was only with him a few weeks before he was overseas."
