harmonious spirit of Geneva. "That is also our wish," Bulgarians declared to further emphasize. "There can be no doubt that the summit conference had positive results and led to the adoption of important decisions." Bulgarian Deputy after deputy look the need to express support for Soviet actions at Geneva and for Soviet policy in general. After Bulgaria finished the deputies unanimously voted their approval of his Geneva report.

In an address which would have been credited as few years ago, Academician Nikolai V. Zaitsev said the Bulgarian Soviet Union has much the same as the Soviet Union. He believed that the Bulgarian people have "no need to be anything but a free people."

Urges Data Exchange. The Bulgarian agricultural expert who has been director of the all-union agriculture fair and a State member of the Council for the wider exchange of scientific information between the East and West, said many other deputies have similar speeches.

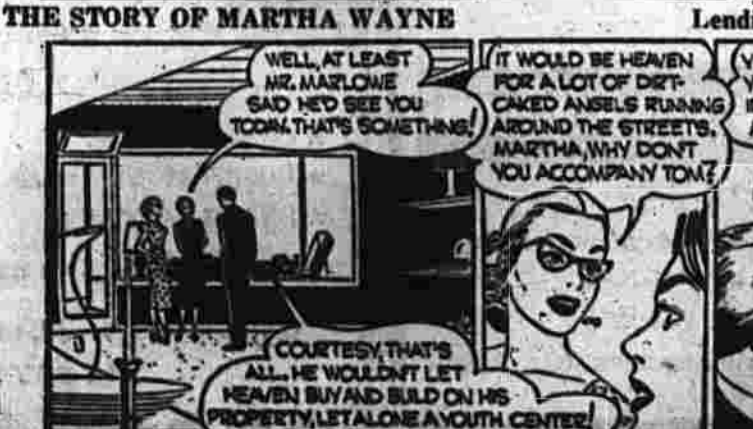

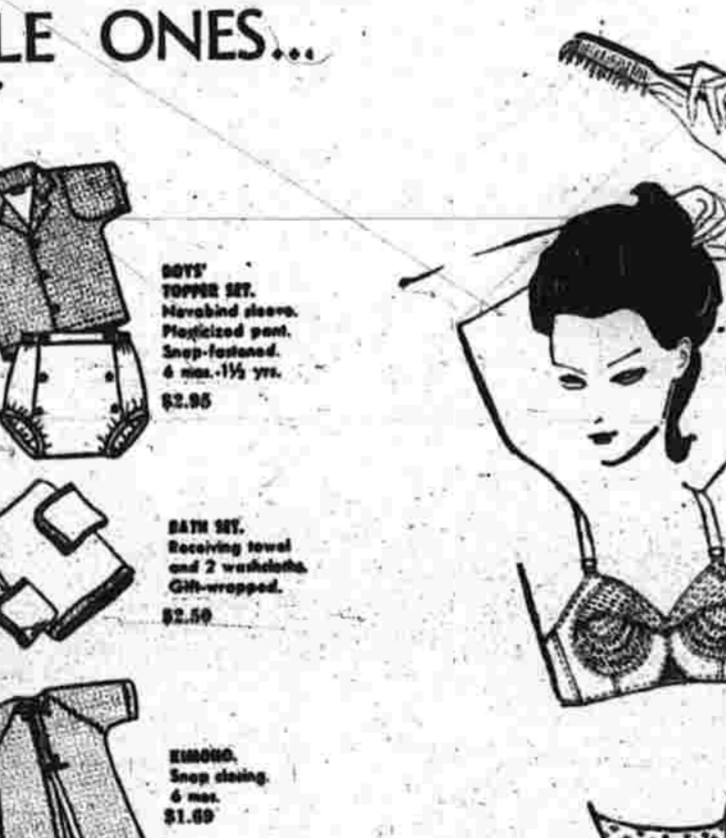
