Chicago, Aug. 6 (P)-Skillful piloting was credited with saying the lives of 68 per-sons in a Northwest Airlines plane accident late yesterday. The pilot, Capt. George A. Stone of Minneapolis, landed his huge four-engine Stratocruiser on Mid-way Airport's northwest runway and noticed suddenly his propellers would not reverse. Safety officials said a contributing factor was failure of the mechanism. which reverses propellers to help slow the speed of the plane after landing. Stone worked the brakes franti-eally, but their power was insufficient to halt the big plane.
"When I saw the rigid arrow markers, landing lights and gasoline stations at the corner of the field," Stone told a reporter, "I applied full left rudder."
