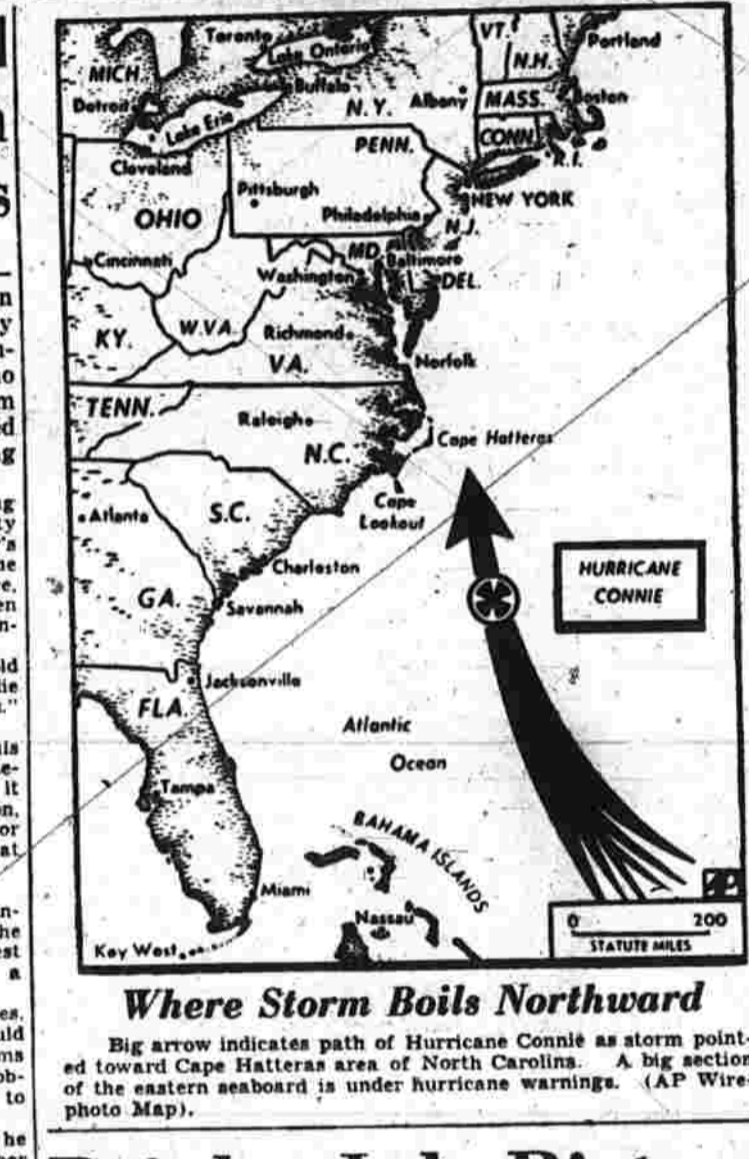

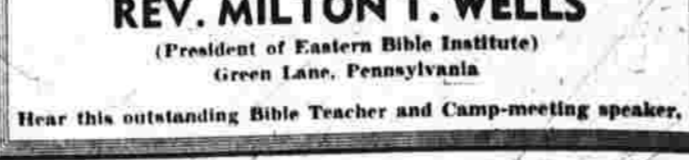

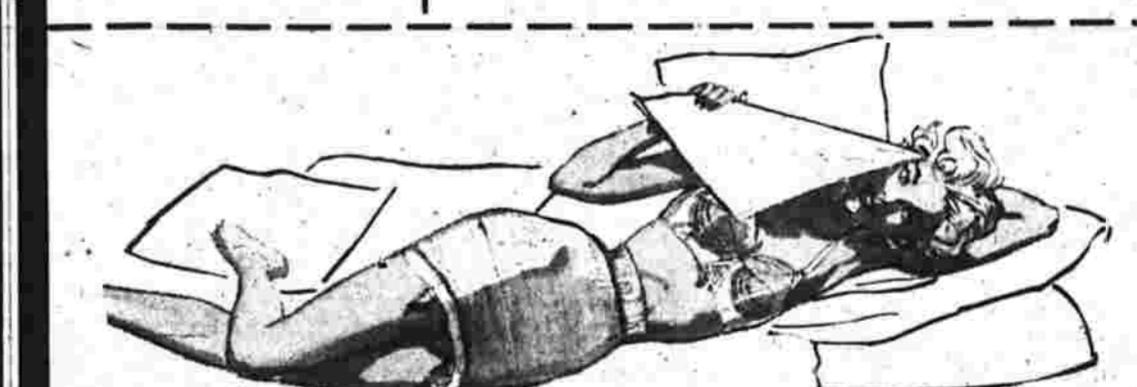

Meanwhile, George Thompson, a British scientist, said today he believes harvesting of atomic energy of the hydrogen bomb type for peaceful purposes will be accomplished "in a generation."

And Sir John Cockcroft, Britain's atomic scientist, said in a statement today that he believes it was possible to achieve "all we can do."

"All we can do," Cockcroft told government at the 12-nation Atomic Energy Conference, "is that it is an interesting subject on which Britain will work, but we are in no position to make forecasts."

A spokesman for the Atomic Energy Commission today said that British scientists announced July 11 that they had produced a new type of atomic reactor, which he called "the atom's heart."

"We are working on it," Cockcroft said today. "We do not know what the Russians are doing, so I don't say whether we are in front of them or behind."

Dr. Homi Bhabha, head of India's atomic energy project, said today that a way will be found to control fusion energy "within the next two decades."

Strassman Holds Sides

Chairman Lewis E. Strauss of the American Atomic Energy Commission has so far declined to comment on Bhabha's prediction.

Cockcroft directs British attention to the fact that atomic energy will improve the nuclear power projects that by the end of the century a ton of uranium will do the work of a million tons of coal.

He said developments in "breeding" of atomic fuel would play a key role in the program. A "breeder" reactor is one in which at least as much fissionable material is created as is consumed in keeping the atomic reaction going.

Hebron Millerism Era Recalled, Prophecies Left Scars

By SUZAN FENDLTON
Hebron, Aug. 10 (Special)—It was about 11 years ago when the craze known as Millerism was in full swing. William Miller, a man from Putnam, Mass., soldier in the war of 1812, earnest Baptist, and fervent believer in the second coming of Christ, was its central figure.

A deep and earnest student of the Bible, he took his prophecies literally, continuing his study for 34 years, having his research on the Old Testament prophecies, in particular those of the Book of Daniel, stressing New Britain; the year of 1843, the year of the second coming of Christ, was its central figure.

He had lectured eight days and as a result invitations poured in from other large cities, New York, Portland, Maine, Portsmouth, N.H., where he was heard in parks, churches and halls, then back again to Boston. Omnia portenta adhaec appaerunt in diebus, strange, unaccountable lights all about the town.

On April 3, 1844, he was in the city of New York, then the fearful falling of stars in 1833, when the heavens seemed to be raining their contents upon earth and beholders fell on their knees and watched to see if the North Star would fall too.

Yet April 3 came and went and the world continued on its accustomed way. This caused a great shock of bewilderment to the believers.

Then something happened which brought waverers to their knees again. The greatest comet ever seen appeared suddenly at noon in the sky.

An error in calculation was now discovered and the date was set at March 21, 1844. Now he believed that he had finally seen away their property, which they would have no use for after the date set and to get their white robes ready for the ascension.

Other "miracles" happened, too numerous to mention. The job of exaltation increased, strange and eerie hymns were sung.

But in spite of all, March 21 came and went and the old earth set a congregation afloat. And what a congregation! The news spread rapidly to adjoining towns and from Baptist, Methodist and Congregational churches, came requests for him to visit them and preach his gospel. Episcopallians and Unitarians, and of course Roman Catholics, held aloof.

Hebron had its share in Millerism, according to stories handed down. William Miller, he believed, to his dying day that the end was close at hand. And what did Elder Joshua Himes do but turn Episcopalian, being received into the fold and placed in charge of a church?

Very large waves at Norfolk, Va., as they might to evacuate it to safety.

The Air Force, Marine and Navy planes all along the Eastern seaboard were put in hangars or down inland to safety.

Navy ships put to sea to ride out the storm rather than be battered against rocks. Small crafts moved by the thousands inland to streams and creeks. The super-carrier Forrestal, still unfinished at Newport News, Va., was made as secure as possible in her berth.

A hundred miles off Cape Cod, construction workers through the night trying to secure a 100-foot-tall concrete tower being built at sea. A Coast Guard tugboat carrying a launch and a highway patrolman stood by for emergency duty along the North Carolina coast.

The Federal Civil Defense Administration put its units on a 24-hour basis in the threatened area.

The American Red Cross hurried 41 hurricane disaster experts to strategic points along the coast and prepared to open shelters in North Carolina.

The Civil Air Patrol, Air National Guard and "teen" organizations were alerted to take over communication facilities at possible emergency landings.

North Carolina's Gov. Luther H. Hodges, attending the National Governor's Conference in Chicago, was prepared to fly back home on a moment's notice.

The Coast Guard cancelled all leaves and other military establishments were in alert. The Air Force threatened area.

What couldn't be moved off escaped beaches were taken down. In some sections, ranches taped storm windows. Antennas were taken down. Windows were shuttered.

High water closed some beach roads, especially along Long Beach.

On Long Beach, Fla., a lot of the storm. The Coast Guard said 800 residents and vacationers were stranded on Roanoke Island, a fishing and summer resort south of here, but they were in no immediate danger. Another 100 bedded down last night in disaster camps at the fishing village of Buxton, north of here.

Connie generated into a big storm six days after she formed far out in the Atlantic. She soon started on the same general course taken by last year's big blow.

Hurricane Carol last year waited until she got to Long Island before smashing ashore and into New England, killing 66 persons. Hurricane Edna hit the Cape Cod area, eastern Maine and parts of Canada, killing 11.

Hurricane Hazel came later to wreak havoc from the Dutch Caribbean coast all the way into Canada.

Insurance Men Pessimistic

In New York, the insurance men who will foot the damage bill expressed belief today that Hurricane Connie will strike a highly section of the East Coast, from North Carolina to New England.

The National Board of Fire Underwriters on the basis of private forecasts, charted the likely but potential course as follows:

The hurricane appears likely to strike the coast between Wilmington, N. C., and Cape Hatteras by tomorrow morning.

Then it would move in on a northerly direction toward Portsmouth, Va., and Baltimore, Md.

From there it would move in a northerly direction across eastern Long Island and to the southern New England and Cape Cod area.

W. P. L. Carden, general adviser of the board, stated that this was a prediction and not a guarantee, but advised precautions in the area mentioned.
