Bolton Residents May Aid Disaster By Red Cross Contributions

Bolton, Aug. 23 (Special)—Local residents who have sought means of helping in the hard-hit areas of the state in the current disaster, were given the opportunity yesterday to contribute to the American Red Cross in a special fund drive to be held in relief work.

On Lane Chidings, vice-chairman of the Manchester Chapter, called a special meeting of the Board of Directors to discuss the disaster in Connecticut and arrange for an emergency organization to handle local problems.

Matthew Moriarty of Manchester was appointed Chairman of the Red Cross committee which will appeal directly to the people for contributions toward relief of the severely damaged areas of the state.

A special plan was made for contributions from individuals or groups. Miss Jeanette Bunker, local director of the Red Cross, will be in charge of the fund drive.

In a proclamation issued yesterday, Mrs. Moriarty said that Red Cross will give families with adequate resources "outreach" plans to help them rebuild their homes, replace their furnishings and clothing and pay for their medical bills.

Major Arthur Mann of Sunset Lane was also busy this weekend helping meet the tremendous need of Red Cross, the Governor also urged that voluntary contributions be sent to local chapters.

First Channel of Real Peace

If Connecticut adopts a policy of trying to give help that is real to the individuals, industries, businesses, and cities and towns injured by the great flood of 1955, that is going to be a long and complicated task. To mobilize and without delay resources, it will give outright grants to help them rebuild their homes, replace their furnishings and clothing, and to buy food for their tables. No strings will be attached to the grants. No repayment will be asked."

So here, with an experienced organization already in charge, is a beginning of the provision of the kind of help that is real. It is help that goes first to the emergency human needs which are greatest. What can be done in this way through private contributions, can be subtracted from all that has to be done later, when and if, as we hope, the principle of real help is applied all up and down the line to all individuals and interests who have suffered loss.

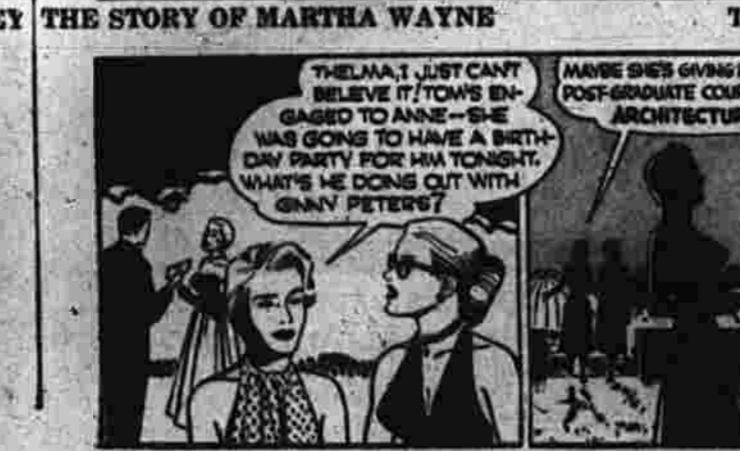

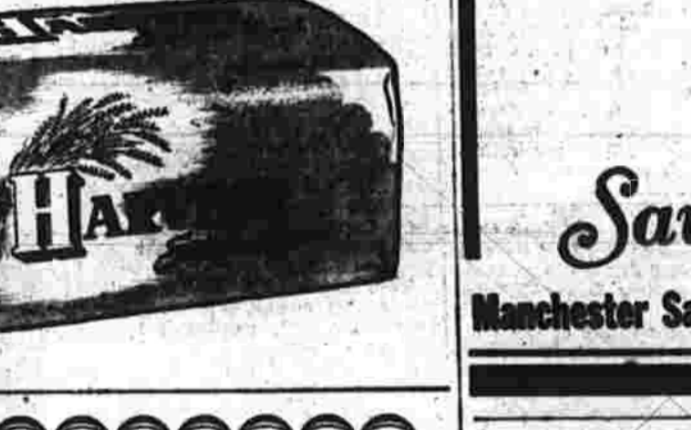
