Phone Co. Rushing To Restore Service

New Haven, Aug. 26 in — The Southern New England Telephone Co. reported today that of the \$5,500 telephones knocked out by last week's floods only 10,355 remain to week's floods only 10,355 remain to be restored.

And among those still out, most of them located in business establishments or homes that were destroyed or so badly damaged that they are still inaccessible.

Said Paul M. Zorn, vice president of the telephone Co:

"It is too early to summarize accurately the cost of the extensive damage to telephone facilities, but it will be well in the millions. The company's first concern, as in all disasters, has been to restore vital communications quickly to all areas."

By Sunday noon, telephones out of service had been reduced to only six per cent of the company's 970.000 total. Repair crews working round the clock in 12-hour shifts will be able to write "all char" on round the clock in 12-hour shifts will be able to write "all clear" on their trouble reports before the weekend, predicted Zorn.

Most telephone trouble occurred in Putnam, Torrington, Bristol, Winsted, the lower Naugatuck valley, Collinsville, Simsbury and Granby, Despite the damage done by the Naugatuck river in downtown Waterbury, telephones lost were few in proportion to the 50,000 in that metropolitan area,



Red Prison Rigors Told By Schmidt

Delake, Ore., Aug. 27 (P)

—Airman Danny Schmidt,
whose marital affairs have attracted widespread atten-tion, has recounted from his oneymoon cottage here some of the rigors he underwent as prisoner of the Chinese Communists.

A B-29 ginner, he was taken prisoner of war Jan. 13, 1952, and was held captive for 32 months.

While he was a prisoner, his young wife, Una, said she had married another man believing that Schmidt was dead.

Danny was reunited with his wife earlier this week and Gerry Pratt, a reporter for the Portland Oregonian traced them to a cottage at Delake, where the Schmidts went for a "second honeymoon."
