### Peron Pushes Newest Drive To Smother All Opposition

Buenos Aires. Argentina, Sept. military men staged another abortive revolt.

Suspend Guarantees to a "state of siege" for Buenos Aires today bulwarked President Juan Peron's new drive to crush his opposition.

The all-Peronista Senate unanimously okayed the bill last night after the Peron-dominated lower house voted it though 109-12 in compliance with Peron's demand for emergency powers to "annihitate" his foes.

Peron was expected to affix his signature today, transforming into law the measure affecting the capital's 3½ million citizens. The whole country was placed under a state of siege for 13 days after the unsucceasful Navy revolt against the government June 16. The new restrictions applied only to Buenos Aires, however.

It appeared the chief effect of the measure would be psychological since Peron already had the appealal powers under a "state of internal war" clamped on the country in September 1951, after (Cautinused on Page Elsvan)
