water said, "We start out... with the state stacked in our disfavor... It is said that the GOP... of the 15 Democratic seats... at least next year in the South... the Republicans can count on... only a "very few" of these... to be converted.

He did not elaborate on this point except to say that there would be an improvement in this situation because prominent local Republicans had knitted together "teams that have appeared in the fabric of the party."

**Neighborhood Meetings**

To help in House contests, Simpson announced a series of meetings at "neighborhood level" would be held in 94 Congressional districts in 29 states where his party's margin in 1954 was 5 per cent or less.

Simpson said 69 of these seats now are held by Republicans and 25 by Democrats.

Noting that the GOP needs a net gain of 15 seats to control the House, Simpson told the state chairman: "This will not be easy to do, but with the proper campaign it can be done."

He said his committee will give priority in its campaign to the bright prospect of substantial gains in southern states, as well as other areas where Democratic members are falling the people.

"We will work hard to see that we can win the Congress as well as the presidency in 1956," he predicted.

**Complaints on Patronage**

Republicans in Congress frequently have reflected local complaints that the government has been spending enough government jobs and the National Committee called on George M. Moore, the Civil Service Commission for an explanation.

Moore told the state chairman 90 per cent of federal employees in the continental United States hold jobs that come under the competitive Civil Service system.

Next Tuesday night he can try for the top prize on "the \$24,000 question" CBS television show.

Or he can call it quits and settle for the \$5,000 prize he reached last night in his fourth appearance on the show. It is his again and again. He'll get an expensive automobile as a consolation prize. No contestant yet has tried for the \$24,000.

**Fireman Five Deserts**

McCutchen, who had chosen "fried" and "cooked" as his question category at the start, last night described five deserts and gave the country of origin of each. They were: bombe, habanero, oloykok, slummary and pfefferwe.

Another contestant last night—a widowed grandmother—advanced through the \$5,000 mark by telling the last four years of the St. Louis Cardinals won the National League baseball pennant.

Miss Myrtle Pomeroy, 30, of Hartford, Ga., and Long Point, Ala., answered 12 last night.

Mrs. Pomeroy, who said she has been watching the game since 1930, got the chance at \$5,000 by answering a series of questions in the game's baseball category.

She is currently employed as a housekeeper at Rostys Heights, N. Y., on Long Island. She is the mother of three sons and a daughter and grandmother of six.

Next Tuesday night she will return to the program to announce whether she will try then for the \$15,000 question. She can settle for the \$5,000. If she tries for \$15,000 and fails, she will get an automobile.

### Three Reservoirs Filled by Rainfall

### Dockers Idle Gotham Piers

New York, Sept. 7 (AP)—Manhattan's miles of piers were idled today by a walkout of longshoremen.

The union did not name a specific complaint against the commission, which governs pier operations on both the New York and New Jersey shores of New York harbor. In the past, the union has argued that the commission administered pier regulations harshly.

But he said the union had ordered the men to halt work pending a mass meeting to discuss grievances against New York-New Jersey waterfront commission.

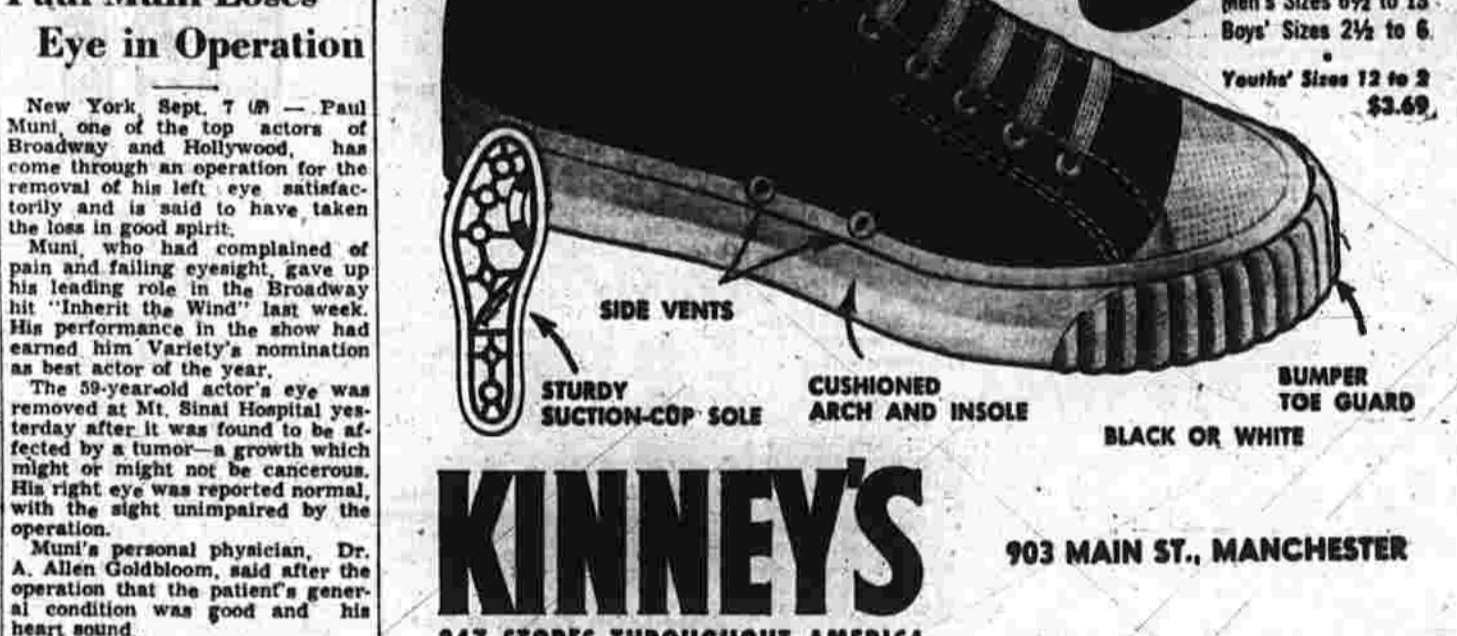
