But, at the same time, if there is any great decent civilization in the world, and it lives with this situation and this problem and yet does nothing about it, until the worst becomes almost inevitable, then that, too, must stand as some sort of a crime against humanity.

So, what might civilization do? It might, and should, try to approach the continent with hands clean of discrimination against the color of skin. But first, and preliminary, it needs to place Africa close to the top of the list of problems faced by humanity, and keep it there.

There is also a danger that while trumpeting our religiousness we do not in our personal and corporate action and attitudes sufficiently display that we really mean what we say.

Thus all the doubt, perhaps cynicism, by churchmen themselves, over their big boom, which, some of them fear, may be "spiritual burn." More church members, however, more juvenile delinquency.

This doubt is, we think, more reassuring than the statistics. For as long as we know it is not merely the numbers who go to church, but the spirit in which they go, so long as we do not assume that quantity is automatically quality, our churches can survive even a period of popularity.

Los Angeles, Sept. 12 (AP)—Former President Harry S. Truman won't be able to be present, but Southern California Democrats are going ahead with their plans for a luncheon here Thursday night.

Gov. George M. Leader of Pennsylvania will substitute for Truman. The former President canceled his trip to California on orders of his doctor to curtail his activities.

Edgar Mahany, MGM executive, will introduce the speakers and various musical, radio and television personalities. The speakers will include Paul Butler, chairman of the Democratic National Committee.
