

HAMILTON STANDARD PEOPLE HELP EACH OTHER WHEN FLOODS STRIKE

More than 55,000 pounds of food, clothing, and household items were contributed by Hamilton Standard employees and distributed by company trucks to Hamilton Standard families who suffered in the recent floods. The flood relief drive was conducted by the Recreation-Welfare Council, to which all employees automatically belong. Contributions were received in the recreation building, sorted and packed by volunteers, then transported to depots near the areas where the floods did the most damage or quickly shuttled to employees' homes. Loads were taken to ten towns in Connecticut and western Massachusetts where some 450 employees live. Massachusetts where some 450 employees live.

In addition to these supplies, employees gave several thousand dollars in cash to meet specific needs of the flood victims. The Hamilton Standard plant buildings, which are above the flood zone, sheltered hundreds of people from the nearby Rainbow area who were forced from their own homes.



Legion Clears UNESCO Of Communist Charges

Washington, Sept. 13 UP—As a for UNESCO publications, special American Legion committee has termed "utterty without foundation" charges that the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) is Communistic.

Summarizing an 18-month investigation of the controversial U.N, affiliate, the 8-member group said in its report:

"UNESCO is not favorable toward world government... is not atheistic and ... is in no sense or degree Communistic."

At Odds with Other Study

The special group thus placed itself at odds with the Legion's Americanism Commission which has said it has evidence there are a number of Communist sympathizers in UNESCO.

The 40,000-word report was made last May 5 to the Legion's National Executive Committee which 11 months ago refused 51-6 to send a representative to the U.S. commission for UNESCO. A printed copy of the report became available today.

The report is destined for submission to the Legion's national commander, was out of town and could not be reached for comment.

The report discussed more than two dozen charges against UNESCO and said it found none to be borne out by facts, Among the charges:

State Labor Parley Ione Whirls Ignores Appeal for Off San Juan Dock Union Ends Walkout Ending Rent Curbs

New London, Sept. 14 (P)—Delegates to the Connecticut Federation of Labor convention sat in stony silence today as a plea to oppose rent control was read to them. The plea came in the form of a telegram from Charles M. Burton of

Hartford, president of the Propnecticut, Inc.

Pending before the convention is a resolution calling for repeal of a law passed by the 1955 legislature which will end rent control in Connecticut on midnight, March 31, 1956. Burton argued that rent control works against employment in the building trades. His telegram said:

"Frozen income for building owners is not consistent with the principle of high wages for building trades. Plumbers, painters, electricians, and so forth, are getting two and a half to four times. "More than one-half million people in Connecticut are unalterably opposed to rent control. If unions desire employemnt of their members by owners of rental property, we urge the unions to reciprocate by defending property rights , 'against' discriminatory laws." Higher Minimum Wage Former State Labor Commissioner John J. Egan expressed the

hope that Connecticut will raise its minimum wage, now 75 cents an hour, to a "practical basis."

He did not, in a speech to the convention, say what he would onsider "practical," but expressed the opinion that 75 cents is too low. Egan's successor, Renato Ric-cuiti, predicted in a convention yesterday that the minimum wage question will "surely be of prime importance" at the 1957 session of the Legislature. Egan, a veteran labor man who recalled that he attended his first federation convention in 1908, said he was "proud and happy" that unwas considered tops among such agencies in the country.
