Library Lines

It is not necessarily a bad thing which is novel. It might be good. Since we are not likely in any case to succeed in any diplomatic or military project to free the satellites, perhaps it is good that there can be such a thing as evolution within these satellites.

The evolution going on inside Poland is obviously a combination of two things—the steadfast resistance of the Polish people to too much Russian domination, and the growth of wider wisdom in the present leadership of Russia itself. The result seems to be that for the historical moment at least a partial victory has been won by the Polish people, and a partial retreat has been made by the Russian masters. The Russians have given up, for this period of weakness and light in the world at least, any semblance of full scale drives against the peasants or against the Church. The conditions of Polish living have been relaxed, so that Poland is beginning to feel more like Poland than like a Russian satellite. American correspondents visiting Poland today find adherents of the old Polish government in exile apparently living—some and some even public lives.

For all this there has now come a dramatic pay-off, as Hugo Hasko, no less than the premier of the Polish Government in exile in London, turns up in Warsaw, proclaiming himself still no Communist, but saying that the future for Poles is in Poland, not in London. The great majority of Polish exiles will still have none of this. They observe, cautiously and rightly, that what exists today may not exist tomorrow, and that the welcome for exiles in Poland today could turn into arrest tomorrow.

But if the present trend should persist, if Russia continues to treat Poland more as an ally than as a possession, and if the government of Poland itself develops into something more Polish than Communist, then it can be seen that there would be a gradual deflation of propaganda and policy drives aimed at "liberation" of the satellites. We might come to a point where Poland seemed to have gained through its own resistance, through wise Russian policy, some portion of freedom. Then, it could be the problem which once seemed hopeless and something that could be resolved only by force may no longer seem hopeless, or needing force. For the decent, happy living of the Polish people, one must hope so.

Keep It Six And One

The majority of Manchester citizens, quite probably, agree with neither of the extreme parties in the issue of Sunday sale of liquor, which is to be decided by our referendum vote tomorrow.

The restaurant owners, on one extreme, are motivated primarily by economic considerations. They think they could make more money if they were open selling liquor seven days a week. They think they lose money, now, because they can't sell liquor on Sunday. Manchester people, they think, go elsewhere to dine and drink on Sunday. As for the Sunday traffic going through, it doesn't stop in Manchester, because it knows it can't get liquor here. Part of all this is true. Undoubtedly, some of our restaurant owners would make a little more money, perhaps a great deal more money, if they could sell liquor on Sunday. Their contention that this would add significantly to the general prosperity and progress of Manchester is, however, a bit of campaign froth. It might well cost Manchester, as a community, in many ways.

On the other extreme of the issue are some of our churches, ministers and lay religious leaders. What those who are in the forefront of the campaign against Sunday sale really favor is total abstinence, which they would probably like to try to achieve, again, by total prohibition. They would probably consider it ideal if the sale of liquor were banned seven days a week.

In this they certainly do not represent the wish of the Manchester majority. We doubt that they even represent the drinking habits of all the members of their own congregations. Total prohibition has already been proved an historic mistake, which did much more harm than good. We are still paying a penalty for it, in the kind of drinking habits it fostered, in the disrespect for law it encouraged.

Between these two extremes, it is probable that most of the rest of us are actually a little indifferent to the issue. But when we do take an interest, we find certain conclusions which seem logical and sensible. Our civilization does owe some respect to the Sabbath. It is right it should be a different kind of day. Manchester has a certain atmosphere as a community, which is should try to preserve. Part of that atmosphere has been that it has not tried to pose as a hot spot on Sunday.

The potential trade for drinks on Sunday is not, as the restaurant owners would like to suggest, that of the pretty little family dinner out. It would consist largely of those who think they can't get along without liquor for any consecutive number of hours, and who, therefore, are the more dangerous drinkers. Many of them would be part of the Sunday flow of traffic, which is dangerous enough even when it is sober.

As between the two extremes on the issue—the one which would like to be able to sell liquor all the time—the other which would like to be able to prohibit the sale of liquor all the time—Manchester is actually living under a compromise. One side gets six days a week. The other gets one. That compromise happens to work out well enough in practice. It seems good for the community. We ought to keep it in effect, which means we should vote so tomorrow.

Horror In Turkey

The full story of what happened in the recent riots in Turkey, supposedly merely demonstrations over the issue of Cyprus, is just beginning to come through the Turkish censorship, and it is not pretty. For what was unleashed, the spread of a false alarm; and then tolerated by the connivance of Turkish authority, while British diplomacy also smiled on it, was not a mere demonstration, but a savage riot in which Turkey reverted to a horrible tradition of violence along racial and religious lines. The damage done to property owned by Greeks, Armenians and other non-Turks is estimated at \$300,000,000. The streets are still full of debris and wreckage. The riots were well organized, operating on the basis of a check list of establishments they planned to destroy.

The Greeks have known all this from the first. The world as a whole has not known it. Yet governments presumably must have known it in such a situation, the Greeks are wondering what has become of all the exalted condemnation, by nations such as the United States, of racial and religious persecution. They wonder why we do not dare criticize the British policy on Cyprus which led to all this, as we would criticize a similar policy on the part of one of our presumed enemies in the world. They wonder if we prize Turkey as a military bulwark so much we are prepared to forgive such Turkish barbarism.

Since the thing was so much more horrible than the world knew at first, there has to be a revision of its possible consequences. Greece's resentment will not subside casually, and British insistence on holding Cyprus as a necessary for military security in the Middle East may, in the end, that a great gap in that security. Meanwhile, the United States hangs' once more, on the painful dilemma caused by the fact that some of our friends consider it necessary to perpetuate colonialism in order to defend freedom. Sooner or later, if we are to mean what we should mean to the world, we must stand for the freedom of peoples, even when they are dominated by our friends, and against racial and religious persecution, no matter where it occurs.



Mechanical Icing Crisps Lettuce

Seal Switch Fails, Friends Fined \$171

Laramie, Wyo. (AP)—That fresh head of lettuce you have in your refrigerator would be so fresh if it wasn't for the mechanical icing of refrigerator cars here. Refrigerators of produce — 60 to 80 cars — now can be iced in less than a half hour.

The average time for icing a car is about 45 seconds.

Homer Whitlock, manager of the operation says it is the only completely mechanical icing system in the nation. From the time the lettuce is put on the car, it is not touched by human hands. A conveyor moves 300-pound blocks of ice to a platform level with the tops of the cars. Another machine chops them into 50-pound hunks and tips them into the bunkers at each end of the car. One man controls the electric-powered machine.

Bar men chop up ice adding pieces to the bunkers and a salt machine follows with the correct amount of salt. Another man closes the hatches and the train starts on its way east again.

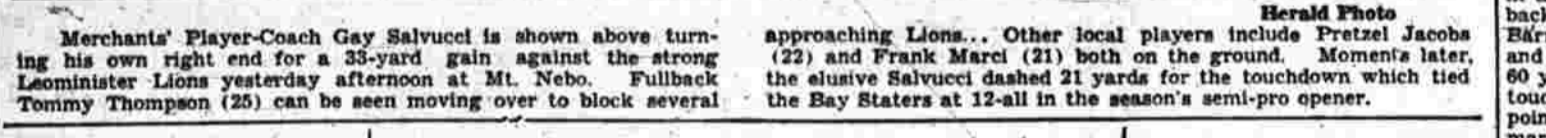
Merchants Forced to Rally to Tie Lions

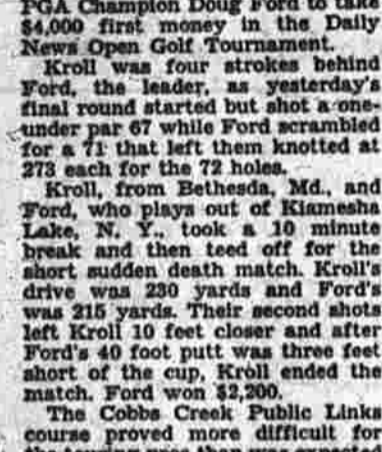

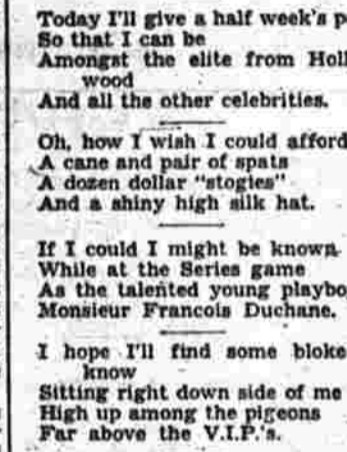
