From FDR to Ike: Musician Played Top Dates With Red, White, Blue Unit

After 30 years the blemish musician has put aside his favorite flugelhorn and is imparting the technique to school children in Stamford Springs.

Mt. John V. Gworek conducted nearly three decades of service with the U.S. Marine Corps and the U.S. Army. He was the band leader of the "Thunderbolt" band, which was the band of the U.S. Army Band stationed at the Military Academy at West Point, N. Y.

During the processing of his assignment papers and physical examination in Springfield, Mass., a regular recalled Gworek's mother would have compelled the army to discharge him had he failed to pass the band entrance test.

For three years, during the period Gen. Douglas MacArthur served as commandant, Gworek performed with the band. He took part in the colorful graduation exercises at the fort high on the Hudson as well as marching in all parades and great-nobility.

Aspiring to join the only band authorized by Congress, he first shared his clarinet training and studied violin under the late Ralph McLellan of the Philadelphia Symphony. Shortly after he was accepted by the Marine Band, the unit played in Little Rock, Ark., for the 50th reunion of the United Confederate Veterans.

These were the first notes of the musical script which Gworek's playing at presidential inaugurations from Dwight Eisenhower through Dwight Eisenhower.

He was there the cold March day when Franklin Roosevelt addressed the nation with candor saying: "The only thing we have to fear is fear itself."

"Home on the Range" was his favorite and that of course; was a must on our program during his installation in office. For Ike we played the regular marches and I don't recall any special selections being requested by Mr. Truman.

Unknown to many is the fact that members of the Marine Band are selected to play for all official functions at the White House. It is for this reason that they are required to double on string instruments.

Churchill Listens in Rain
During a wartime meeting at the White House between Winston Churchill and President Roosevelt a special concert was scheduled which Gworek rates as the "toughest assignment I played."

He says, "Mr. Churchill wanted a program of America's folk songs and shortly after the concert started it began to rain. And I mean rain. We were drenched but the appeal of the band was proven. For one-hour both Mr. Roosevelt and Mr. Churchill sat in the rain without umbrellas listening to the music."

Winnie's Favorite
Gworek tells of Mr. Churchill's liking for "The Marines Hymn" and cites his request to hear it at a cost of several thousand dollars to the American radio network.

England's distinguished leader was the principal speaker at convocation exercises at MIT, when he decided he would make one request. He asked the Marine Band to play "The Marines Hymn," as a special favor. The additional number, according to Gworek, caused the program to run over the planned air time. Networks were forced to clip a portion of the following commercial programs.

When he first joined the band it numbered approximately 85 pieces. Today it has 85 members including Chet Shields of Manchester who plays a trumpet.

Presented to Royalty
It was during their 1938 visit to

The White House that Gworek, along with 14 other musicians was presented to King George and Queen Elizabeth of England.

A Marine Band member releases under supervision for three hours each day and to keep abreast of coming programs must practice a similar amount in private.

Advancing to the rank of master sergeant was much more difficult for Gworek than it is for other Marines. He has received a promotion in the band and is limited and become possible only when a higher ranking enlisted man is discharged or leaves the band.

There is always a waiting list of men desiring to become a part of the most publicized military music organization and the "old pros" indicate, "A man has to have it in his blood."

Strong Legs
A pair of good strong hiking legs is one of the unheralded requirements, according to the local man. "In the beginning the parades are a thrill, but when you near retirement age the legs really feel the after effects."

John could very well claim he was able to read music before he learned the ABC's for his dad played in the old Rockville City Band and it was he who instructed Sgt. Gworek how to play the saxophone. Later John studied with Jack Crawford of Manchester. He also received tutelage from Jacques Van Pucque, the famous Belgian musician, and William P.

Sanitman, now leader of the Marine Band.

He may wear civilian clothes now, but the striking red, white and blue colors of the Marine Corps Band will be his uniform for life.

The first Polish descendant to retire from the band can truthfully say he heralded the dawn of an era and its closing. He played at the Roosevelt inaugural in '32 and the funeral in '45.

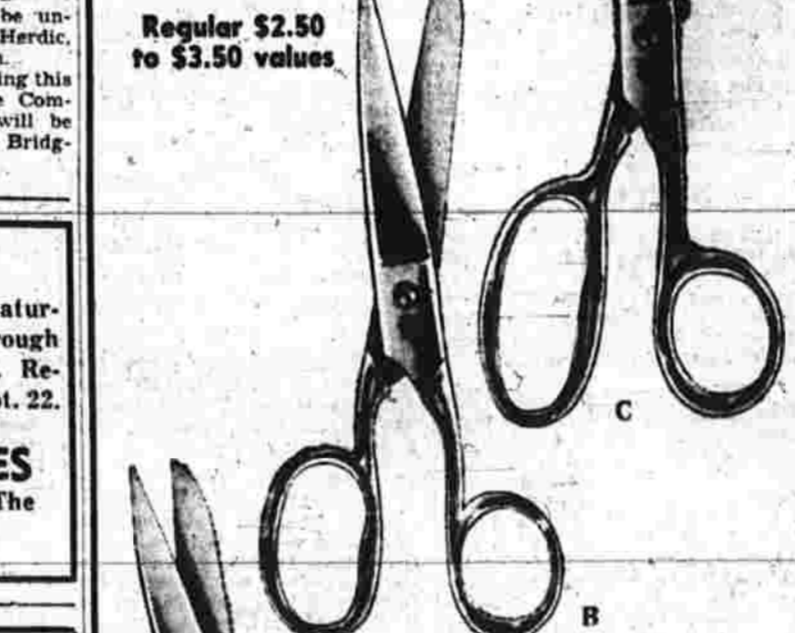
