

The make-up clinic for antipolios inoculations for Manchester children, which had been acheduled for Wednesday, has been postponed for two weeks. Dr. Joseph Barry, school doctor, announced today.

He said the postponement was a precautionary move decided on after three possible cases of polio were uncovered in Manchester earlier this week.

In announcing the postponement, Dr. Barry said it was considered desirable to delay giving the shots of the Salk vaccine until cooler weather had set in.

No new date for the clinic has yet been set, but Dr. Barry said it would be during the week of Oct. 12. A detailed schedule announcing the postponement of the clinic is in accordance with a recommendation of the State Health Department that injections not be given during the height of the polio season. Today, Dr. Barry said September is considered the peak polio month.




