### Alaska Air Unit Operates Close To Soviet Craft

Yuma, Ariz., Sept. 28 (AP)—Sharing a resemblance to a Russian pilot is a little closer, but it's still far from the Alaska Air Command's first Soviet entry team seen in Yuma.

Commanded by Col. Donald D. Hubbard of Warren, Ohio, the team carries the Alaska Air Command's hopes against seven other crack units in the U. S. Air Force's world-wide air-battle readiness competition scheduled here Oct. 2-7.

"When we are on the job in Alaska," Col. Hubbard said, "Siberia is only 20 miles away. If they go out over the Bering Sea, so do we. And that puts us even closer together."

Intelligence reports put Russian air strength east of the Dray Mountains as well as scores of 10,000 aircraft of all kinds and some of them as close as they can get to the North American continent for what Col. Hubbard termed frequent "spotting" missions.

"These are runs into the Alaskan radar surveillance to see what kind and how quick a reaction we can get. The purpose is to test the alertness and probe for weaknesses in the defense."

As director of operations for the Alaska Air Command, Hubbard is very conscious of this.

"We have a scramble when we pick up Soviet aircraft on our radar scopes," he said. "I'm sure that Capt. Patrick F. Donnelly of St. Louis, Mo.

"While we are keeping them in sight, it is easy for both our flight and the Russians to get within an inch of each other on the glass. He did not say exactly how close they would be but even 20 miles is close for a couple of jets.

"The Russians probably will agree with Col. Hubbard when he says: 'As we would probably be the first to be tried if this country were ever hit by an attack, I feel a lot better if we took first in this contest.'

It would be nice to have a winner where a win would be cracked most. Col. Hubbard will have to argue that point with crack teams from seven other Air Force areas next week.

### FBI Chief Asks Boost in Local Police Forces

Washington, Sept. 29 (AP)—FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover today called anew for more manpower on local police forces. He said "adequate provision for successful local police operation is certainly a national security problem."

Also, Hoover said, citizens should help in the fight against crime, by cooperating in law enforcement.

In a signed editorial in the October issue of the FBI's Law Enforcement Bulletin, Hoover praised what local law officers have done with modernized and aggressive methods in attacking the spiraling crime of the post-war years.

"While the crime total increased 65 per cent in the past 10 years, police organizations with a nominal gain of only 17 per cent in personnel accounted for 48 per cent more cases cleared by arrest," Hoover said.

Noting that an expected decline in crime after "the war years" of the war years had failed to materialize, he said:

"Major offenses passed the unrecorded two million mark in 1952 and have continued to mount in the past two years. How are we to meet this problem?"

"Today the greatest handicap to strong local police are inadequate manpower for proper functioning and insufficient funds for suitable salaries, facilities and training."

"Statistics for the past decade indicate the urgent need and the value of increased manpower."

The FBI director added however that "the crime cannot grow at the very rate of the past decade and should not be the sole responsibility of the local officer." He said it is "both logical and necessary" for the general public to cooperate with law enforcement officers to preserve the well-being of society.

### Rockville-Vernon New Budget \$26,954 Less; \$1,207,147 Request Listed

Rockville, Sept. 29 (Special).—A budget asking for expenditures of \$26,954 less than those made last year will be presented by the Board of Finance to the annual Town Meeting Monday evening.

The budget for the coming fiscal year calls for \$1,207,147 as compared with the \$1,234,101 spent during the past year. It is \$120,000 less than the \$1,327,147 for making a net saving of the town.

Officials have pointed out that if the yearly filling of tax lists is to be minimized the maps are necessary. This request was voted down at a recent Town Meeting. The budget breakdown follows:

General government, \$4,907.20; public safety, \$7,600; highways, \$1,100; health, \$2,200; education, \$2,672.20; library, \$4,000; recreation, \$2,000; miscellaneous, \$1,000; High School Committee, \$15,000; publishing history, \$2,000; cemeteries, \$5,500; veterans' funeral, \$2,000; at the American Legion Auxiliary last evening, \$2,000; contingent fund account, \$2,000; county tax, \$12,000; interest payments, \$29,700; redemption of bonds, \$200,000; equipment, not replacement and alterations, \$12,000; making a total estimated expenditure of \$1,207,147.

The estimated revenue for the year ending Aug. 31, includes from property taxes, \$659,811; interest and dividends, \$1,000; interest from use of money and property, \$282; proportionate share of state taxes for general purposes, \$10,500; grants from the state, \$2,500; state grants, \$2,500; state grants from unspecified sources, \$145,270; Agriculture, industry and commerce, \$2,588; grade school tuition, \$200; high school tuition, \$12,000.

John Gottler, chairman of the Board of Finance, today said that he felt it was his duty to defend the school budget. He was disturbed when he said that \$26,954 cut from the budget would make it impossible for the incoming Board of Education to function as it should, without asking for additional funds.

Gottler said that the cut in textbooks and instructional supplies would reduce the quality of the textbooks, to 82 cents per pupil. He added that if the Board would make it possible for an additional appropriation, or pay for supplies bought in advance of next year's budget, this would be pointed out, was presented upon by the town officials.

Using 1947 for a comparison, Gottler said that the town had 1,290 people that year, where 2,460 are currently estimated. In 1947, he said, the school budget was \$231,625, explaining that the budget had increased almost 100 percent since that time. He said that the enrollment had doubled. He said that the budget of the 1947 budget was for instructional supplies and textbooks. For 1955, the Committee figured three percent of the budget was for these purposes. He said that the cut made by the Board of Finance has now reduced the figures to 1.3 percent.

Gottler, in closing his remarks on the budget reduction in the Board of Finance, said that more new equipment had been added, and that more repairs and general improvement had been accomplished in the past year than in the 10 previous years that he had been a member of the Board of Education, with the assistance of Federal funds. He indicated that the money requested was necessary and emphasized again that

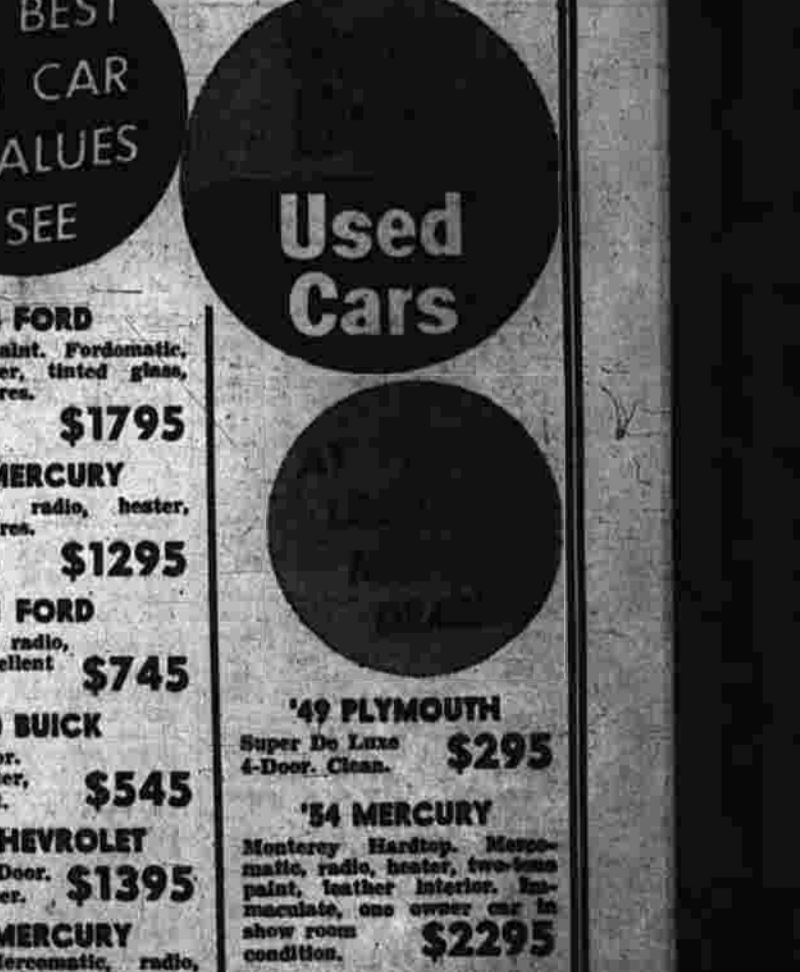
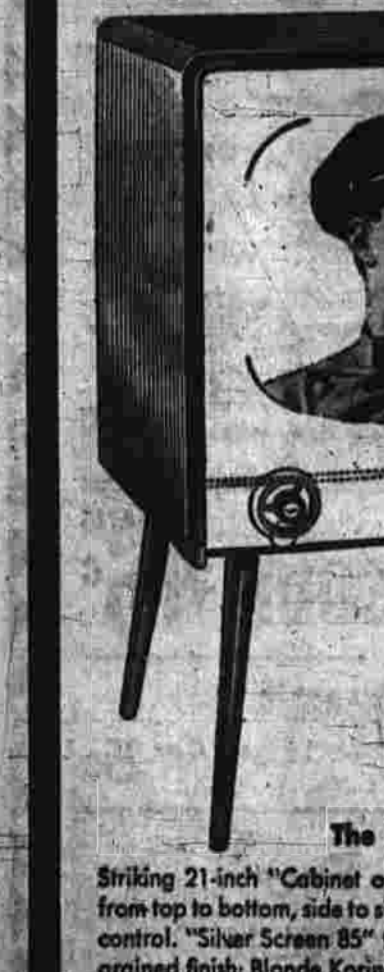
