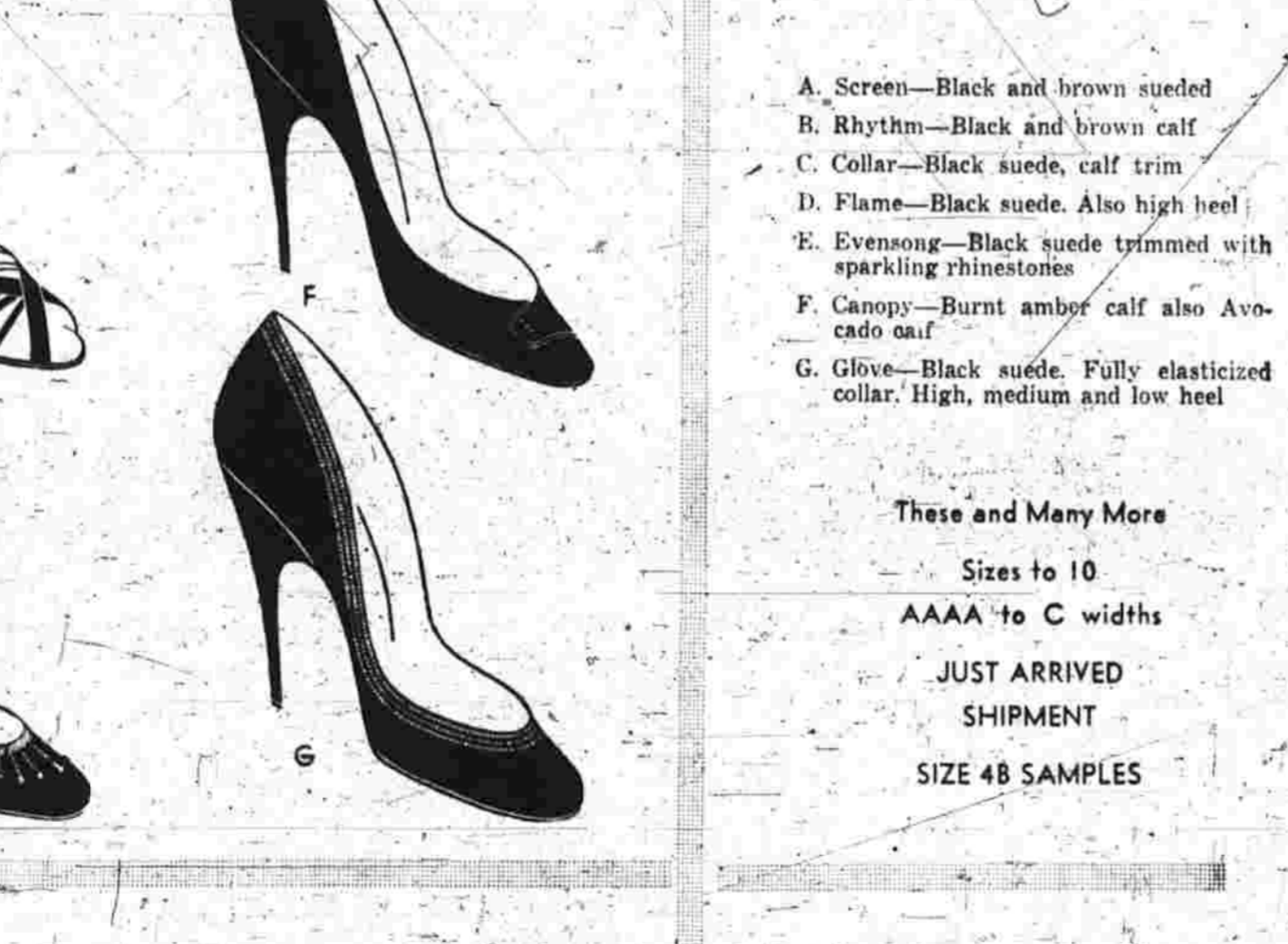

Spectator in Jury Jeopardizes Trial

Shawnee, Okla., Oct. 5 (AP)—The trial of Polk v. Polk, County Sheriff Jim C. Hazard, almost broke up here today when special counsel Judge J. Ross Spurr disallowed a spectator sitting in the courtroom.

The allegedly seated juror, John Talley, said he wandered into the courtroom from the back of the trial.

Unfamiliar with procedure, he said from the jury box and was sworn in by Judge Spurr.

After three minutes he was removed from the jury box and ordered the trial to continue. Hazard is being tried on an aggravated assault charge, stemming from a May 25 beating of a Shawnee newspaper reporter, Jim Brantshaw.

Efficiency Of The Vaccine

First official reports on this season's efficacy for the Salk vaccine against polio are encouraging, but not overwhelmingly so.

There was from 25 to 50 per cent protection in the children who were vaccinated this year, than among those in the comparable age group who were not vaccinated.

This estimate, as it stands, represents a maximum 50 per cent efficacy for the vaccine, as against the 90 to 95 per cent efficacy which was claimed for it last March.

But this is an important consideration on the side of the vaccine. A large number of the children who were vaccinated received only one shot.

It is also significant, however, that the bulk of the children present form, is not the final answer to polio. Dr. Salk himself is working to improve it. Some of the latest work is to get a vaccine which is more efficient, which confers immunity for a longer period of time, which is made from live virus instead of a dead one, and which does not have the natural elements of danger which require such close control and testing of the Salk vaccine.

In the meantime, the Salk vaccine stands as a worth while middle stage development, between the absolute effectiveness of the past, and the more perfect vaccine of the future.

Our Beside Manner

This nation is instinctively demanding, from the bedside of its convalescing President, the utmost in care, the most in attention, the most in respect.

President's associates to be making any slightest turn in his condition.

We have, obviously, been getting our wish. The bulletins from the bedside have been complete, detailed and candid. All the details of the President's condition, all the implications of his illness, have been talked over, publicly, by competent authorities. There is, obviously, no possibility that we do not know everything.

That is what we want. But while we are getting it, it could be a pleasant development on our part. It could be that, when we are being treated as a mature nation, we could also manage to behave in a mature fashion.

If we have invited ourselves in, live in intimate information association with the presidential bedside, we might also demonstrate that calm, even that enforced, artificial calm, which is the duty of a nation.

But, on Monday, after we had been informed, according to our wish, of the precise condition of the President the evening before, that emotional national thermometer, the stock market, indulged itself in an open display of worry and hysteria.

There had been something disquieting in the President's condition the night before.

In the middle of Monday, the continuation of the news from Denver brought better news. The stock market temperature went back toward normal.

Fortunately, we can think of the President as being somewhat insulated against our own bedside nervousness. But suppose the day comes when he is able to move back into our world enough to read or hear what we are doing?

Then the bedside relationship would have to be open, both ways. Are we then going to continue playing political games with the President's illness, making up behind our backs, bestowing his political meanings for him?

Or should we start worshipping about the President rather than about ourselves?

Peshtigo Fire Held Greater Than Famed Chicago Blaze

By JOHN R. KNOX

Boston, Oct. 5 (AP)—On the same October day 74 years ago the United States was struck by two of its worst fire horrors.

It is this Oct. 5 that Peshtigo, Wis., was hit by a fire which led to the setting aside of October week, at about this time each year in the United States.

It is reported to be the first special "week" of the kind and one in which the public is not exhorted for any reason, but only to join in a common effort for its own safety.

Virtually every fire department in North America observes the week which, this year, begins on October 6.

It was on October 8, 1871, that Chicago's famed fire broke out. It was the most helpless in combating a fire which according to tradition was started the night before by a cow kicking a lantern. Before it was fully under control, it had destroyed nearly 18,000 buildings, took an estimated 200 lives, and cost \$200,000,000 in property.

New York (AP)—Well, guess what? Darned if good old National Newspaper Week hasn't rolled around again.

And as usual, caught us with our adjectives down.

The public, as usual, hasn't tired of any accolades. There have been no mass parades, no widespread excitement.

This is pretty much the way we hoped the populace would take the occasion. If no group has showed up to shower laurel wreaths upon us and ferry us twice around the town square in triumph, we are consoled by the more positive fact that no indignation marcher on the other hand, has marched upon us with the cry:

"Hang the editor."

So far as we have been able to find out from a careful check of the records, no editor ever has been hanged during National Newspaper Week.

One of the purposes of National Newspaper Week, of course, is to show that no editor really deserves hanging.

The other purpose is to emphasize the importance of a newspaper to a community.

There are all kinds of newspapers and they serve many purposes. At the worst a newspaper is a mirror of community amusements; at the best a newspaper per se is a community alarm clock.

A good newspaper works from a very simple standard. It alerts and informs the citizens about what is going on. If your daughter is graduated as valedictorian of her high school class, it will chronicle this event. It also will chronicle the fact, even though you are a leading advertiser, if you should run away from home with the strawberry blonde wife of the mayor.

Birth, marriage, life and death, crop failures, new buildings, deaths, appearances in court, all these are standard news items in every newspaper.

A good newspaper will go farther. It will chronicle the dreams and defeats of the community and its members. It will wait for elected authorities to uncover and attack official wrongdoing. If it

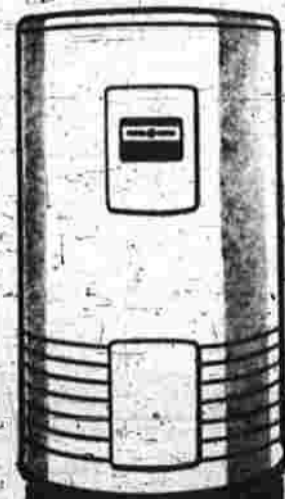
