





The canon law of the Episcopal Church requires that whenever the House of Bishops puts forth a Pastoral Letter, it be read to a congregation within one month of the date of its receipt. The letter read by the Rev. Mr. Williams yesterday was issued in Hononlulu in September.

Hartford, Oct. 18 OP—Mitchell Sviridom, State CIO president and a member of the State Flood Recovery Committee, today proposed a temporary state income tax "as the fairest way of paying for flood costs."

He said that the state could raise some \$40 million over a two-year period by assessing a 3 per cent levy on the amount each person pays in federal income tax.
