Increase in Aid To Asia Nations Seen by Britain

Singapore, Oct. 17 (AP)—The Colombo Plan nations opened a conference here today and preliminary reports Britain prepared to almost quadruple its contribution to the Asian development program.

For the first six-year period of the plan donor nations have contributed about 7 billion pounds (\$14,000,000,000) to carry on economic development schemes in South and Southeast Asia.

At the opening session H. G. Casey, foreign secretary of Australia, and Lester B. Pearson of Canada, two donor nations, emphasized they were in favor of continuing the development plan, including the Philippines and Ceylon, joined in stressing the need to carry on projects launched in the last six years.

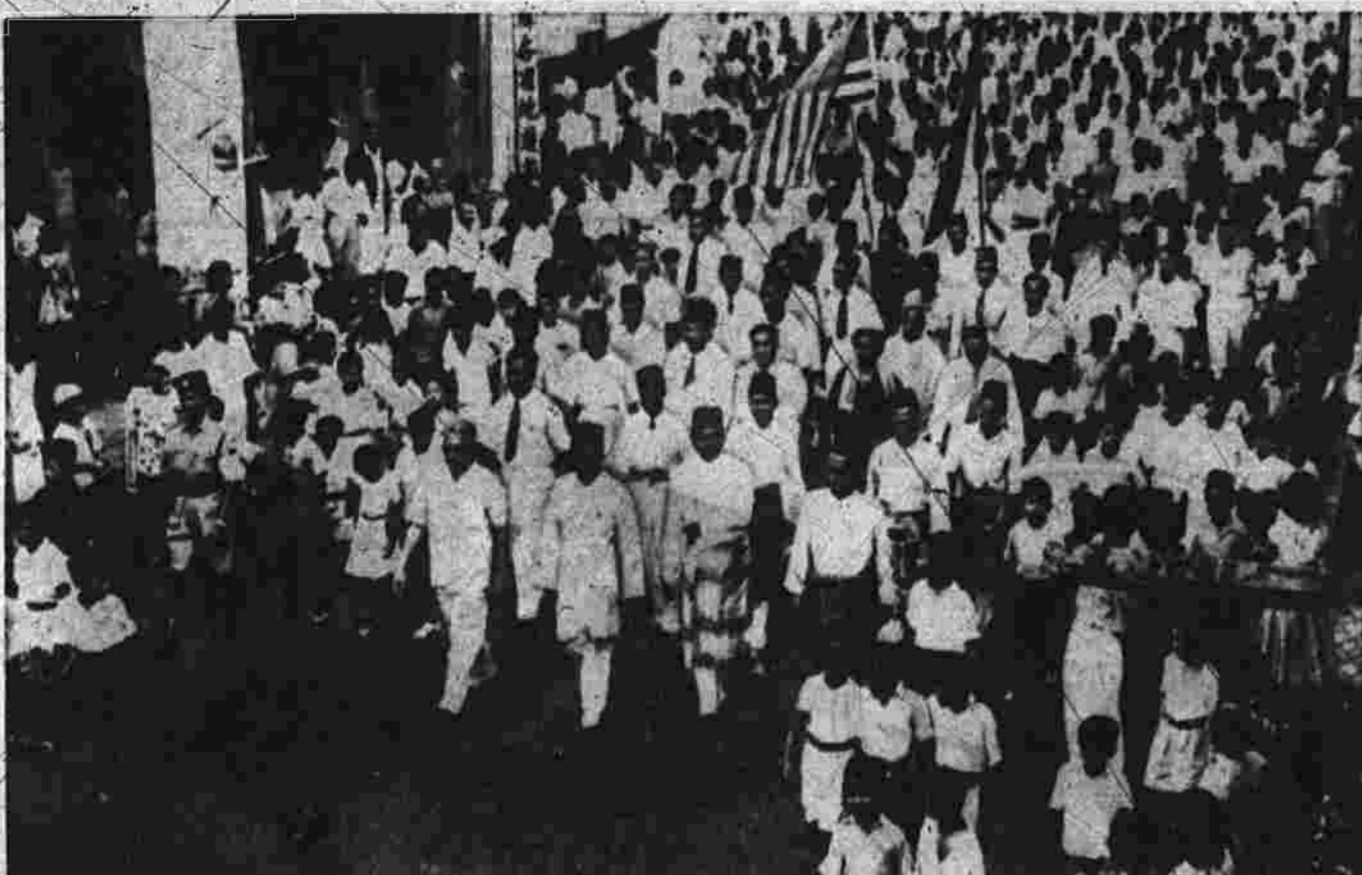

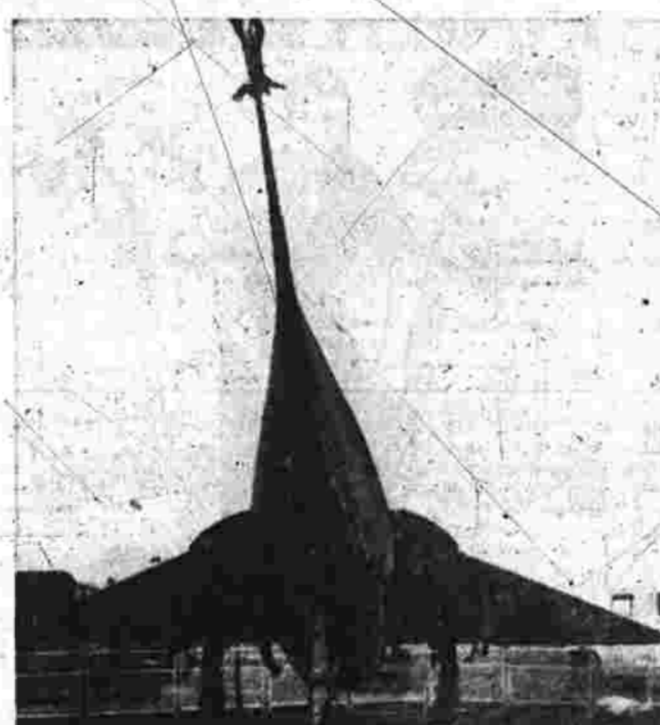

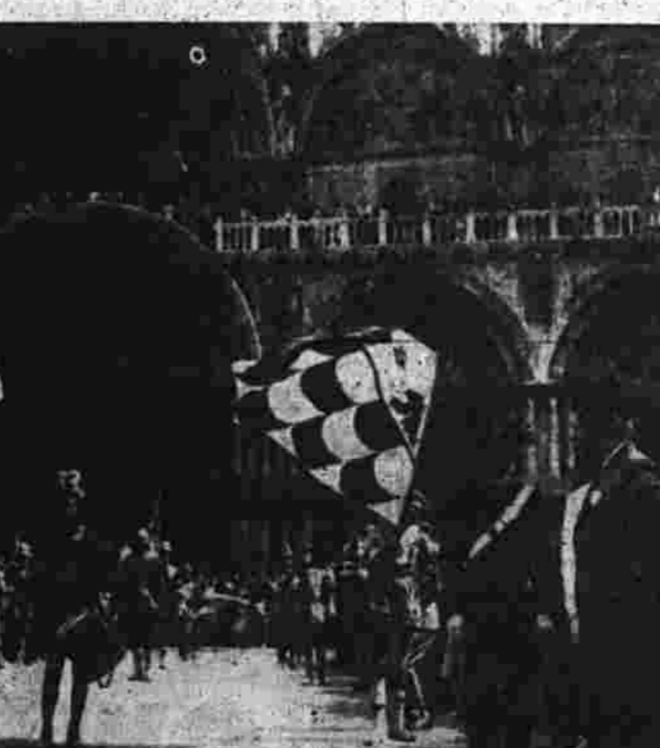

# Nature Loses Battle with Men, Machines: Operation Eagleville a Success

 Coventry, Oct. 17 (Special)—A tonnage of 120 volunteer workers, heavy equipment from 10 area construction outfits, three fire departments and local police created a community machine over the weekend to seal the 1 1/2 mile long, 200-foot deep dike above Eagleville Dam against the flood-swollen Willamette River. And this morning, Operation Eagleville was still underway, going into its 40th hour, with the 100-foot wide, 200-foot deep dike area just south of the dam completely filled in.

Richard Gallatin, Coventry fire chief and second section man, reported this morning that the dike was a new six and one half feet above the waterline, and extends back toward Eagleville Dam for a distance of approximately 50 feet at that point.

Builders, dump trucks, and power shovels have poured over 60,000 square yards of sand into the area, Gallatin said. The earth movement is adding a new sand layer even now, as food waters recede throughout the dike.

At 4:30 Saturday morning, when the water above the dam was flowing at its normal flow, the dike area was reported to be approximately 100 feet wide and 20 feet high.

Then, rapidly, the river began to rise, and in less than two hours was trickling over the crest of the dike, crumbling earth away in its retreat, and threatening the two-mile stretch of low-lying lands along Rt. 31 which had been inundated Aug. 19.

Fire departments from Coventry and Eagleville rushed to the site to begin a sand-shifting operation. By 11:30 a.m. the barricade was approximately 100 feet high and water was lapping against the first layer of bags.

First lieutenant Goodwin Jackson "got on the phone and enlisted the aid of a number of volunteers" from Coventry, Eagleville, and other nearby towns, and after a few minutes of discussion and planing, the operation continued the afternoon.

Construction and digging hand companies sent heavy earth-moving equipment to the site. The operation was abandoned and the dam moved in and pushed up to such extent that the water was rising one half an inch every half hour, and Chief of Police Edward Howard was called out to a threatened shift in the wind from north to west would add three inches to the existing water height of two feet.

Ward Rosebrough of Columbia said he was on duty to check on the dike, but that the water was climbing up in the Pine Lake Shore area, and he was called to the scene to see if the dike was being breached.
