U.S. Reported Studying Israel Plea for Arms

(Continued from Page One) Macmillan held the same position. American delegates attending the Big Four conference here decried any comment on the Israeli report. An Allied official, however, two days ago made it clear the Western powers had decided positively against making any large shipment to Israel.

The Israeli informants said when the list is submitted to the United States the stress is likely to be on defensive equipment including anti-aircraft weapons, anti-tank guns, anti-submarine equipment.

Sharett also expects to see Macmillan and French Foreign Minister Antoine Pinay in the next day or two.

He is still awaiting definite word whether Moscow will meet him. The Israeli diplomatic mission in Moscow applies 10 days ago for the meeting. The Soviet statesman then sent word that he "probably" would see Sharett in Geneva. No more has yet been heard.

Sharett has arranged to fly back to Jerusalem Sunday. Aides said if he has not been Moscow by that time he may return. It is his intention to draw the Russians' attention to the risks of one-sided arm-peddling and to the conflict between the Soviet campaign for disarmament in Europe and their program of rearming the Arabs in the Middle East.

Sharett also has sought new security guarantees from the Western powers — guarantees stronger than those embodied in the American-British-French declaration of 1950 pending re-evaluation of the existing frontiers of the Middle East.

Macmillan reportedly told him Britain will not go beyond that declaration which is considered strong enough.

Peiping Squeezes Peasants To Raise Industry Capital

By JIM CARY
Tokyo, Oct. 27 (AP)—Red China, driving for international power, is squeezing its peasants harder than ever to raise capital for its industrialization, experts here believe.

It is moving ahead rapidly with a frequently interrupted farm collectivization program.

Peiping Radio is now carrying thousands of news weekly on its program.

Analysis, which study these voluminous reports and ask questions, feel a new intensity of development is underway. Famine—no novelty in China—and many sporadic epidemics are among the possible consequences, they say.

However, nothing recently comparable to the chaos of the Russian collectivization movement in the 1930s, he predicted.

Nevertheless, the Chinese have cast in the middle of what is perhaps Communism's greatest gamble.

As one expert put it:

"The peasant, lured by promises of land, credit and at least some support to the Communist revolution, has got land, but now he is probably going to lose it. He may become a mere wage earner. Individual ownership is being long range Communist goal.

The new intense collectivization drive began in part from a directive by Chairman Mao Tse-tung last July 31. He laid down the theoretical basis for what China has called a "profound movement of socialist transformation."

Since then, particularly in the past few weeks, Peiping Radio has talked enthusiastically of new farm co-operatives established and supervised by "rightist elements" opposing them.

Oct. 17, Peiping reported the number of producer co-operatives had reached 600, involving 1,800,000 peasant households. A year ago it was 300,000 with 1,500,000 households.

Communist China's farm collectivization drive has been hailed by the United States as a "bold step."

Redistribution of land began almost immediately, apparently reaching the peak in the "landlord purge" of 1951 and 1953. Some say up to four million were killed.

Aircraft Builds Plant Addition

Pratt and Whitney Aircraft Division of United Aircraft Corp. will build a 500,000-square-foot addition to its North Haven branch plant that will be used for the manufacture of jet engine parts.

Army, Air Force Plan Huge Joint Maneuver

Camp Polk, La., Oct. 28 (AP)—The Army and Air Force begin testing some of their newly developed maneuvers here Monday in exercises scheduled to last through November 15.

Before the six-week maneuver ends, the top brass of the armed forces will have a better idea of the effectiveness of their guided missiles, new jet planes, atomic weapons and electronic devices.

A war time atmosphere has prevailed in the western section of the state for several weeks now.

Highway 171, which runs north and south along the western edge of Louisiana, and the southwest edge of highways in the southeast have been jammed with convoys bringing in equipment for the joint test.

All general in charge.

The men who will train the headquarters for the project have arrived and are all set to start. Gen. O. W. Wyland of the Air Force is in charge of the exercise.

The troops, including 100,000 soldiers and 50,000 airmen, are expected to start arriving Monday at Camp Polk, La., where a new installation deactivated in the summer of 1945 is expected to result in a permanent base.

Sagbrush is expected to result in the reactivating of Camp Polk on a permanent basis.

Camp Polk was opened originally in 1941. Headlines in the United States during World War II, it was deactivated in 1945 and reopened in September, 1950 to meet the Korean emergency.

It has been used as a training ground for the Continental Air Command and the Air Force's 1st Air Division. The Army plans to use a 7-million-acre section of the area, including the area around the old base. The area is being used for training of the Army's 1st Cavalry Division and the 1st Air Cavalry Division.

The air war will feature such planes as the F-100 jet day fighter, which has set an official world speed record of 822 miles an hour, manufactured by North American, the firm which produced the F-86 Sabrejet, the top speed of 700 has not been reached.

The Air Force says it has a ceiling of over 50,000 feet and a range of over 3,000 miles.

The F-100, armed with four 30MM machine guns, can be used as both a day fighter and a night bomber.

The F-86F, capable of carrying a 4,000 pound load of bombs and rockets, also will be used.

Known as the "Thunderbolt," it has a ceiling of over 45,000 feet. Its range is 2,000 miles.

The B-27E, Tactical Air Command's new tactical jet bomber, also will be used in both day and night bombardment missions. The B-27E carries a pilot and observer and is in the top line of the bomb class. It can carry a 5,000 pound bomb load.

The 4th Armored from Ft. Hood, Texas, known as the "Breakthrough" division during World War II, will participate as an aggressive force during the 6-week maneuver. Maj. Gen. William N. Gillmore commands the division.

Aggressive Units Designated.

The 4th Armored and other units designated as aggressive will use makeup, a foreign language, fake names and a special insignia.

The aggressors also will wear fringed helmets and a salute with the checked, instead of open hand.

No live ammunition will be used in the mock war. The battlefield setup will be provided by artillery simulators, fire crackers, blank ammunition.

Other units taking part include the 1st Infantry "Screaming" Division, 82nd Airborne Division, and the Ninth Air Force. The Ninth is

\$400 Outlays to Be Bid On; More Detailed Report Voted

Bolton, Oct. 28 (Special)—Two new ordinances were passed by the Town Meeting last night at the Community Hall, which was attended by about 50 people. The Annual Town Report will carry a list of all town expenses by check number, including the names of the payees and the reason for payment. Future town expenditures over \$100 will be put up for competitive bidding, advertised, and the results published.

The two ordinances were among seven proposed for consideration by the meeting as a result of a petition of 23 voters of the town. James Hawsett, selectman, was elected moderator of the meeting, granted the request of First Selectman Charles A. Robbins to speak at the meeting.

Robbins said in explanation of his remarks that the First Selectman in the town agent and act for the town, that the people have a right to expect advice and information from him on town business and that he should advise of any action in the best interest of the town. He also said it was not unfair and unwise to enact a law with such wide potential effect to cover one specific case. This view was expressed, and upheld by the discussion, that proponents of the ordinance had one specific aim in mind, and that it was their duty to advise the town of the consequences of the ordinance.

The ordinance requiring competitive bids was originally submitted with the limitation that they be obtained on all expenditures for capital improvements or purchases of equipment over \$100. It was amended to "over \$500" and the words "capital improvements or purchases of equipment" were deleted. This action changed the ordinance to cover all expenditures over \$500 and it was adopted as amended.

The next three proposed ordinances were termed zoning ordinances by Town Counsel Raymond A. Johnson in his memorandum which said they probably should be taken care of by these agencies through their regulations.

The first one would have prohibited occupying a road which would require travel over another town's roads for access. There was much discussion on this item. The view was expressed, and upheld by the discussion, that proponents of the ordinance had one specific aim in mind, and that it was their duty to advise the town of the consequences of the ordinance.

The second in the group was the proposed ordinance prohibiting issuing a building permit for any building which was not accepted by the town. The purpose of the ordinance was questioned from the floor and although there were several persons present who had signed the petition requesting the ordinance, the ordinance was defeated with no affirmative votes expressed.

Final item for consideration was an ordinance requiring that all planting of trees or shrubs should be made less than 15 feet from the traveled portion of the highway. The meeting expressed the opinion it was in the best interest of the town. The ordinance was passed as requested.
