Bolton Town Boards Will Decide Insurance Group Question

Bolton, Nov. 10 (Special)—Sunday between the hours of 2:30 and 4 p.m. the town boards will decide whether to accept or not to accept an insurance group question.

Last night 15 members of the Board of Selectmen, Education, Finance, Fire Commissioners and Insurance Agents met at the Elementary School and agreed the problem would be referred by a vote of each unit.

Spreading for the group of agents who reportedly asked the boards for an opportunity to state their proposals, J. J. Crockett said that as taxpayers and insurance agents they felt they should be sharing in the town's business.

He also stated they would furnish to the town since it would benefit the town since it would furnish expert advice of a group of qualified agents.

If the boards indicate their approval of the principle of purchasing insurance through such a committee with a sharing of commissions by local agents, the agents then propose to work out the details of how this could be done. If the boards decide against the idea, the agents said last night they would abide by the decision.

In discussion of the proposal it was brought out that an advisory committee could effect economies, could eliminate the chance of duplication of coverage and would eliminate politics from the purchase of insurance. Raymond Jewell, who writes a large proportion of the insurance now in effect, drew a laugh from the group when he declared any politics in the present method of purchasing standing as a Democrat in a predominantly Republican town.

UConn Ousts Eight In Dormitory Raid

Storrs, Nov. 10 (P)—The University of Connecticut expelled eight freshmen yesterday for taking part in a 1,000-man party raid on the girls' dormitories.

As soon as the eight were expelled, campus police arrested six other students on charges of breach of peace.

The party raid broke out Tuesday night, with the student mob marching a mile to the girls' dormitories.

The girls accommodated the raiders by tossing parties out the windows, the shouting and hollering lasted an hour and a half, and in between lines several campus cops were pelted with missiles.

The campus security police arrested Thomas E. Walsh, Ridgefield, Dwight Peterson, East Haven, Frank S. Wilson, Housatonic, H. Anthony T. Bazylova, Stamford, and Frederick W. Anderson, East Longmeadow, Conn.

Names of the two other students expelled were withheld.

Martin Compiles Actions of Board

The office of General Manager Richard Martin has completed the compiling and publication of a 207-page index of the actions taken by the Board of Directors during the 2-year period from May 1952 to May, 1955.

The task was undertaken by Martin and his office staff.

The index lists the actions taken by the Board and gives the date they were taken and the number of the page in the book of minutes where the action is described.

The former California governor said in a letter to Edwin W. Pauley, chairman of the fund raising event here, that he would be delighted to accept the post. However, Pauley said yesterday, Warren's Court duties will prevent the Chief Justice from attending the dinner Nov. 26.

The library, now under construction at Independence, Mo., will house the former President's personal papers. It will be presented to the people of the United States.

Ex-Red Says Party Controlled Factory

New Haven, Nov. 10 (P)—A self-described former Communist said yesterday that for a time 40 or so Communists controlled the union at a Connecticut plant employing 9,000 people.

Roger M. Gay, formerly an inspector at the Bridgeport plant of the General Electric Co., now an executive of a small aircraft parts firm in Los Angeles, testified at the trial of eight alleged Communists.

The prison camp was originally built for 20,000 prisoners, but it was not long before it was bulging with more than 60,000 people. This figure included some 300 German generals and 17,000 children.

Gay said the Communist tried to win the friendship of fellow workers by helping them with personal problems, on this way winning support they could set command on the basis of their political opinions.

Diabetes Drive Starts Sunday

The annual Diabetes Detection Drive will be carried on here as elsewhere in the nation the week of Nov. 13, Dr. Howard J. Lock-

hart, who will head the local drive, announced today. Since 1949, when the search for diabetes was launched here, an average of 800 persons have participated annually, according to Dr. Lockhart, and a number of diabetics have been discovered each year.

In announcing the local drive, Dr. Lockhart said a new device will be used this year to collect urine specimens. Called a "dry-pak," it is merely wet then emptied to dry.

The specimen then can either be mailed to Manchester Memorial Hospital or deposited at any drug store where it will be picked up at the end of the week. The dry-pak can be obtained at any drug store next week.

The tests are conducted free of charge, and are aimed at stamping out diabetes, which still ranks eighth in the list of known causes of death by disease.

The drive, which coincides with Diabetes Week, is conducted locally by affiliates of the American Diabetes Assn. and by more than 800 county and state medical societies, with the cooperation of industry, labor, civic and fraternal groups and women's organizations.

Diabetes is a chronic disease which develops when the body cannot utilize all the food that is eaten, particularly carbohydrates.

The most common symptoms are excessive thirst, constant hunger, frequent urination, loss of weight, itching, easy tiring, falling eyesight, and slow healing of cuts and scratches.

The persons most susceptible are those who are overweight, past 40, or closely related to diabetics because of hereditary factors.

However, doctors say anyone can develop the disease at any age.

Some hunters claim cleaning the body cavity of deer before frequent urination, loss of weight, itching, easy tiring, falling eyesight, and slow healing of cuts and scratches.

few days ago if he had been willing to be carried aboard the plane. But he insisted that when he did get on he was going to be able to walk up the 40-step ramp.

Now he is able to do that. Yesterday he walked up and down a 20-step flight of stairs at the hospital a half-dozen times.

Will Address Nation

In going up the ramp to his plane, Eisenhower will pause on the seventh step at a microphone in place there and address the nation briefly on television and radio. He probably will express thanks for the prayers for his recovery and for the tens of thousands of "get well" messages he has received.

He also plans another brief informal talk on arrival at the Washington airport.

There will be a "welcome home" reception there and greetings from crowds along the route from the airport to the White House, which Eisenhower left Aug. 14 for a Colorado work and play vacation. He was stricken at Denver Sept. 24.

After a weekend of rest at the White House, the President will travel on Monday to his farm at Gettysburg, Pa. for further convalescence.

His eagerness to get started was apparent yesterday when he posed for photographers with President Carlos Castillo Armas of Guatemala. Standing in the hospital corridor in a beige robe over light yellow pajamas, Eisenhower talked about a "night and early" departure for Washington tomorrow.

Shows Old Vitality

He did so in character, Edward T. Follard, veteran White House reporter for the Washington Post and Times Herald, who represented the colleagues at the picture-taking session. Follard later wrote:

"When President Eisenhower rode from the Washington National Airport to the White House yesterday afternoon, the thousands who line the streets may notice a change in him.

"He is heavier than he was before his heart attack—leaner, but sharper.

"He is down now to his 'West Point weight,' which his doctor says is 'excellent.' He weighs 172 pounds, the same as he did 46 years ago when he was a cadet.

"The loss of weight since he entered the White House is much, but it seems to have taken place where it would be most noticeable—in the abdomen under his chin. He is now less jowly than he was.

But Follard also reported that Eisenhower retains his familiar condition, and his eyes are as blue and keen as ever. He has all his old vitality and sharpness, too, that man-in-motion aim that has always characterized him."

Top Court May Close Door On Future Bias Arguments

Washington, Nov. 10 (AP)—The Supreme Court may have laid down for the last time arguments about racial segregation in any state—that is, that it is supported by public tax money, like schools, parks, or playgrounds.

It has already laid down the doctrine giving its reasons at length that this sort of segregation is unconstitutional. It may never again bother to give its reasons in ruling on any future case of this kind.

May Affirm or Reverse

In any such case appealed to it from a lower federal court, the Supreme Court may simply say "affirmed" or "reversed," depending on whether the lower court has acted in accordance with, or contrary to, the high court's doctrine.

An indication of this can be read into the way the Supreme Court handed a couple of segregation cases this week.

In any appeal to the high court from the ruling of a lower court, the lawyers on both sides state their arguments in writing. The nine justices of the Supreme Court get copies of these arguments.

The lawyers can't walk up before the justices and argue orally. It is only when the justices want more information than is contained in the written arguments that they ask the lawyers on both sides to appear in the court and speak their piece.

In the 1800s the Supreme Court of that time blessed segregation with a ruling which said Negroes could be kept out of public places reserved for whites, provided that the Negroes, while kept separate, were given public facilities equal to those of the whites. This became known as the doctrine of "separate but equal." For half a century no later Supreme Court knocked it down.

As a result, segregation continued in public schools and other public places throughout the South and in other states. But in 1954 the present Supreme Court unanimously wiped out the "separate but equal" doctrine in the case of public schools.

"That kind of segregation," the court said, "was unconstitutional and must stop. But the ruling dealt with schools. Did the Supreme Court mean segregation was illegal in other public places too? For instance, in parks and playgrounds?"

Two Test Cases in Lower Courts

Already two test cases were moving through the lower courts. Maryland had segregated public parks and beaches. Georgia had segregated public golf courses. A U.S. Court of Appeals, which covers Maryland, cited the Supreme Court ruling in the school case, said it applied to parks and beaches, and ordered segregation in Maryland's public parks and beaches ended.

But another U.S. Court of Appeals, one which covered Georgia, ruled that it was all right to have segregation on public golf courses. Both cases were appealed to the Supreme Court.

The court considered the written arguments of the lawyers in both cases but called none of them to state their cases orally. It had heard long oral arguments in the school case.

The court, deciding its ruling against segregation in public schools applied to segregation in other public-supported places. Apparently it felt it neither had to listen to more oral arguments nor explain its own position further. So in ruling about as brief as it could make them, the high court did this:

It said the lower court was right in following the Supreme Court's ruling in the Maryland case. It said the other lower court was wrong in ignoring the Supreme Court's lead and approving segregation on Georgia's golf links. That meant segregation on those golf links had to end.
