# An open letter to American Fathers

Dear George,

I am writing to you because I know your son is abou to join one of the armed forces. This may be causing you some concern, so I thought you might like to know what happened to my boy.

Of course, his mother didn't want him to go at all, but if he had to go we wanted him to be with the right outfit. We didn't want him to shirk a duty to him country, but we felt he was a little young, afraid he would be tossed into battle scared and unprepared.

One thing in particular worried me. Remember that old saying, "As the twig is bent, so grows the tree"? Well, I'd done all I could to make the boy a man, and I wanted to be certain that whoever was taking over the job would do it right.

If I had ever been in the service myself, maybe it would have been easier for me to advise my son which one to join. As it was, I didn't have much to do with his choice, but now I'm glad he volunteered for the Marines.

Yesterday he came home on his first leave and we talked late into the night. He talked about the things that had impressed him most - what a real fellow his drill instructor turned out to be, how he learned to be a crack-shot with the rifle, what it means to be on a team that really clicks. But all the time he was opening my eyes to some other things, too. Now I know why the Marine Corps is such a famous outfit.

Somewhat to my surprise, I find my boy is already in-tensely proud of his outfit - proud of his buddies, his officers and the whole Marine Corps. He takes great pride in the fact that four out of five of his officers started out as he is doing - as enlisted men. Furthermore, he's proud of himself and a little of that has rubbed off on me. I guess all of the armed forces are tops in their line, but the Marines seem to have something extra ..

His training must have been thorough - he has self-confidence he never had before. If this is a sample of Marine Corps training, his mother and I know the twig is being bent in the right direction. He looks and acts like a man who can take care



# Top Court May Close Door On Future Bias Arguments






