Reds Explode Nuclear, Blast, Reports Reveal

Washington, Nov. 11 (AP)—Russia has set off another atomic test.

This was announced yesterday both here and in London. The U.S. Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) said the Soviet Union has "recently" days conducted a further atomic test in its 1955 series. A British Defense Ministry spokesman said the test was "of the nature of the Russian test—whether it involved atomic or hydrogen devices."
British sources said the new Russian series began just after the July Summit Conference at Geneva where leaders of the Big Four met to seek ways of ending world tensions.
Last Monday the United Nations General Assembly's Political Commission rejected Soviet and Anglo-American proposals aimed at getting the Assembly to urge the atomic powers to halt such experiments.
The United States, which has refused to halt its testing, said it was studying the safety of various explosive force tests in the Nevada desert. The announced purpose was to study the safety of various weapons in handling and storage.

Secret FBI Report Aired at Red Trial

New Haven, Nov. 11 (AP)—Two confidential FBI documents were examined by the judge in federal court yesterday in the trial of eight alleged Communists.

The documents made their appearance as prosecution witness Ronald M. Gay of Los Angeles wound up three days of testimony. Gay described his Communist Party activity in Bridgeport between 1942 and 1948. He said he was a former Communist.
Under defense questioning, Gay said he signed two documents in 1950 for the FBI, after they had contacted him in California. The defense demanded the documents be produced as evidence to see if they would contradict some of his testimony. But after the statements were examined, Judge Robert P. Anderson, the defense withdrew the demand.
The defendants are seven Communist Party members and a New Jersey woman charged with conspiracy to teach or advocate the forcible overthrow of the government. The trial is in recess until Tuesday.

Indians Certain Prohibition Can Work for Them

New Delhi, Nov. 11 (AP)—Many Indians are convinced their country can accomplish successful prohibition. Politicians and newspapers, with important exceptions, are backing a prohibition inquiry committee, which has recommended that India achieve total prohibition in stages by April, 1956. Its recommendation probably will be approved with little modification.

The committee says prohibition can work in India for these reasons:

"The relatively small magnitude of the problem of drink; the general law-abiding nature of the people; the assured support of womenfolk; the resistance of the average family to drinks being served at home and inhibitory teachings against drink which have prevailed for centuries."

Anticipating comparisons with foreign experiments, the committee analyzes reasons for the failure of previous attempts at curtailing drink. Its findings on the United States said:

"The law was defective; enforcement was... without proper coordination and from the very inception prohibition came under persistent attacks from powerful and organized vested interests."

"The Hindu Standard of Calcutta and New Delhi commented: 'The committee is well justified in saying that we are faced with far fewer difficulties than other countries in enforcing prohibition.'"

Soviet Architects Hit For Housing Shortages

Moscow, Nov. 11 (AP)—Pravda blasted the Union of Soviet Architects today, pinning upon it the responsibility for shortcomings in Soviet housing.

The Communist Party newspaper echoed previous denunciations of nationally known architects and warned that the steady look in Soviet skyscrapers must go. Responsibility for that look, at least so far as this capital is concerned, has been laid upon the Mayor of Moscow, M. A. Yanson, and his deputy. Among the architects on the plan is the chief of the Soviet Academy of Architecture, who left New York for Moscow yesterday after a visit to the United States.

The visit of the Soviet housing delegation to the United States apparently now must be held off until the national architects' congress they must "master the best achievements of domestic and foreign construction" in Party Boss N. S. Khrushchev's campaign to standardize Soviet building.

Complains of Waste
Pravda also took the complaints of waste in Soviet building and construction. The unjustified architectural extravaganzas, the unutilized hours of the past, have brought about over-expenditure of a great amount of state funds during recent years, funds which would have been sufficient for building more than a million square meters of housing for Moscow.

The Soviet Union still suffers from an acute shortage of housing. Pravda denounced such things as "the building of a new building of sanatoria and railway stations, spires and steeples and similar gingerbread which it said were detrimental to the needs of the people and contradicted the line of the party and government in architectural and building work."

Peron Asserts Argentine Left In Good Shape

President Juan Peron says his former government in Argentina is in good financial shape.

The new government's charge that he practically bankrupted the nation was made "to give the appearance of a crisis which did not exist," Peron said in a statement today.

The statement, volunteered by Peron, criticized a financial report of the Argentine people made after the September report of the Peron administration, which was in such bad financial condition a stern belt-tightening program was necessary.

Peron said the report was designed to "impose unnecessary sacrifices on the people," and said the economy of misery to the benefit of the oligarchy-capitalist class.

He asserted another objective of the Peron government was to submit Argentina to "colonialism" by obtaining foreign loans.

His statement assailed Argentine generals who played a role in the overthrow of Peron's government, which stripped him of his rank.

Among military men there are few men of honor and many who are ambitious, Peron said, and among priests there are few with virtue and many ambitious.

Peron's quarrel with the Roman Catholic Church and his appointment of the Cub Scout Council as the official religion of the Argentine people, and played a role in the uprising against him.

Peron declared that reports he had acquired a great personal wealth while ruling Argentina were false, he said, and that he had been reduced to poverty since his original exile in Paris. He has been working in all the countries of the world and has written a book to be tentatively entitled "Force Is the Right of the Weak."

British Restate 1950 Pledge on Israel Frontier

London, Nov. 11 (AP)—Britain today strongly reaffirmed support of the 1950 pledge by Britain, the United States and France to prevent any changes by force in the Israeli-Arab frontier line.

A Foreign Office spokesman said "The policy of her Majesty's government is based on the 1950 declaration" by the three powers guaranteeing Palestine peace.

He told a news conference Britain "warmly welcomes and supports President Eisenhower's statement reaffirming the policy expressed in the declaration of 1950 and the U.S. warning against a resort to force."

The Foreign Office statement appeared aimed at dispelling any doubt that Britain is determined to protect peace in the troubled Middle East.

British newspapers had noted that Prime Minister Eden said in a speech Wednesday that, on the side of the Arab states, he had sympathy and some quarters interpreted this as backing down on the 1950 declaration.

The Foreign Office spokesman said: "The Prime Minister, when warning whatever side resorted to force would forfeit the sympathy of the United Kingdom, referred in a speech Wednesday to the 1950 declaration, which remains fundamental and unchanged."

Ex-Turco Start Anti-Ret Speeches

Portland, Ore., Nov. 11 (AP)—Three ex-turco former soldiers who spent 18 months in Red China began a series of anti-Communist lectures today in a downtown Portland church.

Dr. Thomas Wyatt, pastor of the Wings of Healing Evangelical Church, said some of the talks may be broadcast. Curial and ABC networks carry some of the church's programs.

The three former U.S. soldiers were captured by the Communists in Korea. When the Korean fighting ended, they returned repatriated. While they were in China, the Army gave them dishonorable discharges. Later they asked to come home and returned to this country last July.

The three are Lewis W. Griggs, 28, Jacksonville, Tex.; William A. Cowart, 25, Dallas, Ga.; and Otto G. Bell, 24, Hillsboro, Miss.

They were held by the Army for court-martial until early this week when the Supreme Court ruled that, as civilians, they were not subject to military trials for incidents occurring while they were in the service.

Their lawyer, George T. Davis, San Francisco, said he will seek to have their discharges changed from dishonorable to honorable and also try to get some \$30,000 back pay for them.
