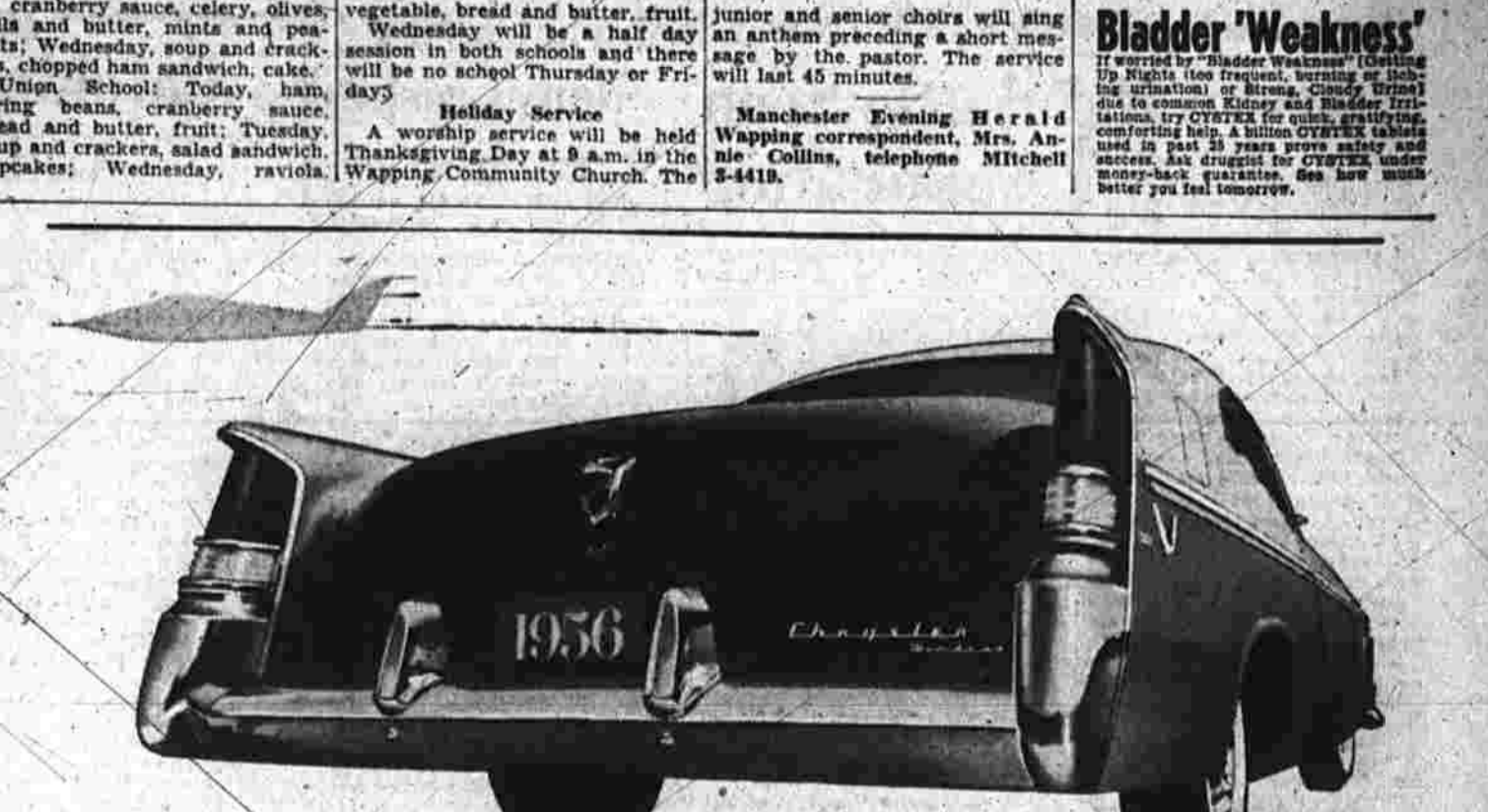

Bolton, Nov. 21 (Special)—The School Building Committee expects to be advertising for bids on construction of the new addition to the Elementary School by the middle of December. Chairman Raymond E. Cooper has announced.

Checking with the architectural firm of Perley F. Gilbert Associates at a meeting Friday night, the Committee was told that plans would be ready on Dec. 2. The preliminary plans were approved on Aug. 29 in a special Town Meeting. He explained that the low cost figure (\$150,000) has been possible because of the exceptionally high utilization of space. The committee is optimistic that construction can begin by Feb. 1. The deadline given for possible occupancy of the completed wing in Sept. 1956.

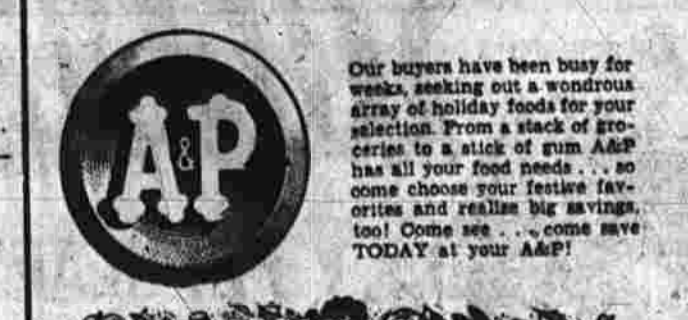
