





State's Largest Water Power Plant in Action

Berlin, Nov. 25 (P)-The Connecticut Light & Power Co. announced today that its new water power plant from the confluence f the Housatonic and Shepaug Rivers, between Southbury and Newtown, is now in operation. It is the largest water power plant in Connecticut.

The addition of this plant to the company's Rocky River plant in New Milford, upstream from Shepaug and the Stevenson plant at Monroe, downstream, enables C.L.&P. to utilize the entire 200 feet of fall in the Housatonic beween Rocky River and tidewater, a distance of 32 miles.

Generates 42,800 Kilowatts The new plant has a generating capacity of 42,800 kilowatts, increasing C.L.&P.'s water power

capacity to 115,850 kilowatts and its total capacity steam and water power) to 605,350 kilowatts. The ne Shepaug Dam, 147 feet high at its highest point, more than a quarter of a mile long and containing 227,000 cubic yards of concrete, backs the Housatonic u as far as Rocky River, New Milford, forming Lake Lillinonah.
