## Union Merger Held U.S. Gain

New York, Dec. 1 (AP)—AFL President George Meany said today the imminent AFL-CIO merger will enable organized labor to "make a greater contribution to the well being and security of our nation."  
Meany said the merger plan was not perfect, but was the best that AFL and CIO leaders could work out after long consideration and would pool labor power for greater gains for workers.  
The AFL chief spoke in a keynote address to AFL delegates at the final approval to the much debated merger plan. It will bring together nearly 140 unions in a single 16 million member federation.  
Meany said a major aim of the merger is to win new state and national legislative gains. In recent years, he said, unions have measured legislation "by how much or how little they have been hurt" instead of progress from the union standpoint.  
No Illusions  
"I have no illusions that we can go into this merger and iron out all our difficulties in a matter of a few days or a few weeks," Meany said.  
"But you know what the stakes are in our obligations to carry out the principles of the founders of our movement."  
"We will make this merger work, not just to protect the achievements of the past, but so we can go forward to a better day for the workers and make a greater contribution to the well being and security of our nation."  
Meany said there never had been any need for the CIO to split away from the AFL 20 years ago. He said if there was any good reason for workers to combine into unions there also was reason for "unity among unions."  
"Good or bad, we do know one thing about this labor movement," Meany said. "It has built up the standard of life of the working man and contributed to the American way of life. This cannot be denied and there is nothing imminent about saying so."  
Ignore Bill from Lewis  
Meanwhile, the CIO ignored a dunning note from John L. Lewis for alleged past-due dues.  
Lewis, president of the United Mine Workers Union (UMW), an independent labor organization not

## West Protests Red East Berlin Views

Berlin, Dec. 1 (AP)—French sources here said today the U.S., British and French ambassadors in Bonn have sent a protest to the Russians against the Soviet contention that East Berlin is no longer occupied and is to be regarded as part of the East German Communist Republic.  
These officials said the protest maintains that Berlin must continue to be regarded as a four-power city under agreements that date back to 1945.  
The French indicated that the protest has been sent to Soviet Ambassador G. M. Pushkin in East Berlin. It stems from the statement of Soviet Maj. Gen. P. A. Dibrova that East Germany is now sovereign and East Berlin is the capital of that sovereign state.

## Toll Hits 14 At Midpoint Of S-D Day

With Safe Driving (S-D) Day half ended in the eastern time belt, the national death toll from traffic accidents stood at 14 today.  
At noon East Ohio had four fatalities, Indiana, Louisiana and Michigan, two each, and Illinois, Kansas, Minnesota, and New York one each.  
Nov. 17 Toll 69  
For comparative purposes the Associated Press counted the traffic fatalities for Thursday, Nov. 17. The total for the 24 hours was 69.  
In Illinois motorists today were warned of hazardous driving conditions in many areas in the north and central portions due to snow or freezing rain.  
In Indiana, a car police said without lights smashed into the rear of a semi-trailer near Richmond, on U.S. 40, killing Robert M. Johnson, 44, of Centerville, Ind. He died at 1:27 a.m. (EST) as he was being extricated from the wreckage.  
Less than 90 minutes after the start of S-D day in Illinois, Gerald La Grow, 27-year-old pastor, was killed when struck by a truck. The accident occurred at 1:25 a.m. CST.  
L. T. Ball, 22, of Plymouth, Mich., was killed at 2:19 a.m.

## Benson Bares Party Farm Aid Program

Chicago, Dec. 1 (AP)—President Eisenhower sent a message of encouragement to the Republican National Committee today and Chairman Leonard W. Hall said that "there is no question in my mind" but that the President plans to campaign actively for the party next year.  
The President told the committee he will "do everything in my power next year to help you report the (Republican) record accurately and fully to the country."  
Asked whether he believes this means the President plans to participate actively in the campaign, Hall told a newsman that "there is no question in my mind."  
When members of the committee heard the President's message read by Hall, they arose, applauded and cheered.  
One Republican leader at the meeting, who could not be quoted by name, said the President's statement "might be construed as an indication the President plans to take an active part in the campaign."  
The President sent a 300 word telegram to members of the committee meeting to make arrangements for their convention starting next Aug. 29 in San Francisco.  
In his message, the President said: "You have a splendid record to submit to the voters in 1956. I personally am proud of Republican achievements for the peace and the prosperity, the security of the American people. I shall do everything in my power next year to help you report the record accurately and fully to the country."  
Outlines Goals  
The President outlined these goals:  
"Continued progress in the healthy expansion of our economy."  
"More equitable sharing of the productivity of that economy."  
"Rising levels of health, education and welfare for all."  
"An untiring search for a just and enduring peace."  
"In striving for these goals, the President said, 'You and Republican candidates everywhere will be motivated by a common conviction in the immutable principles of the American system. So inspired you will present to the American people both a record of brilliant accomplishment and specific proposals and plans for the future that are worthy of their acclaim and their vote.'"  
The President congratulated the committee for what he termed "the great job done under the dynamic leadership of Leonard W. Hall," chairman of the Republican National Committee.  
He gave them his best wishes in all their efforts through the months ahead.  
"The President reminded the committee that they are planning for the election next year of a President, of Senators and Representatives, and of state and local candidates."  
"No job is more important," he said, "you approach it as citizens."

## Bonn Raps Moscow German Unity 'Deal'

Bonn, Germany, Dec. 1 (AP)—Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's government stood solidly today with the western Allies on German reunification policy, ruling out any bilateral German-Russian negotiations on the subject.  
Foreign Minister Heinrich von Brentano made the government's first declaration in Parliament on foreign policy since the Big Four foreign ministers' meeting in Geneva failed to resolve the problem of German unity.  
He told cheering members of the Bundestag, lower House of Parliament, that the "German people are not prepared to strike any deal (with the Russians) jeopardizing their freedom."  
The Foreign Minister acknowledged the Moscow agreement for West Germany and Russia to exchange diplomatic relations. But he added it was up to the Kremlin to make relations between the two peoples anything more than a technicality.  
"As long as the Soviet Union proceeds on the assumption of the partition of Germany and the acceptance of two German states," he declared, there can be no normal relations between our two countries."  
Sees Fate Sealed  
Von Brentano declared that the fate of the German people would be sealed if it tried to exchange the confidence and friendship of its Allies for the sympathy of the Soviet Union. Nor will the German people be induced by any threat or temptation to veer from this straight course."  
He insisted that Germany can fulfill its tasks only if it is free to make its own decisions. He added that any "regulatory neutralization or isolation from any alliances" such as the Russians demand "would be the worst road for us to choose or into which to force us."  
He stressed that inclusion of a reunited Germany within the European and Atlantic communities

## Dulles' Report 'Geneva Spirit'

Washington, Dec. 1 (AP)—A record of the verbal sparring which ended in deadlock of the Geneva foreign ministers' conference was published by the State Dept. today, just two weeks after the meeting ended.  
It showed the "spirit of Geneva" fading with Soviet Foreign Minister Molotov accusing this country of wanting to establish "centers of espionage" and Secretary of State Dulles calling "almost infamous" Molotov's implication that only Russia was interested in disarmament.  
Molotov also accused the western Big Three of "seeking to interfere with Soviet affairs" in some of their proposals for increasing East-West tourist attractions, and said it appeared they "did not wish to reach an agreement."  
Frivolous Remarks  
Dulles called that the latest of many "frivolous" remarks by Molotov.  
A conference ended in disagreement Nov. 16. Last night the State Dept. put out a 307-page printed report on it which, like the report of the summit conference published a month ago, contained new substantial news.  
Some of the text, however, had not previously been made available and it was the first time the

## Canada to Offer Admission Plan In U.N. Today

United Nations, N. Y., Dec. 1 (AP)—Threatened by votes from both sides of the Iron Curtain, Canada doggedly took her plan to bring 18 nations into the United Nations before the special Political Committee today.  
Canadian delegate Paul Martin, chief mover behind the 27-nation resolution to admit all 18 applicants, prepared to introduce it soon after the opening of the membership debate this afternoon.  
Verdict Rests in Council  
The 27-nation committee will give the much discussed Canadian proposal its first public airing. But its fate rests with the Security Council, where Nationalist China has threatened to veto Communist Outer Mongolia and Russia has warned she will turn thumbs down on the whole package deal if any of the five Red candidates are rejected.  
The Soviets announced they would speak today in the committee debate. It was assumed they would make clear at the outset their insistence on all 18 or none.  
Sponsors Confer  
The 27 sponsors of the "package-deal" resolution held a private conference yesterday to decide how

## Teacher Shortage Held Tremendous

Washington, Dec. 1 (AP)—The White House Conference on Education today called on the American public to remember that there is a tremendous shortage of teachers who "work with our most precious resource—our children."  
The call for attempts to get more teachers came on a day when the conference seemed almost certain to go strongly on record in favor of federal aid to schools, particularly for building.  
The report on teachers listed three things for every community to keep in mind:  
1. Teaching must have prestige comparable to other professions.  
2. The salaries must be high enough to keep teachers in the classroom and not permit them to be lured to other fields where the pay is better.  
3. The teachers' job must be presented in such a way so it will attract talented people to the profession.  
The conference also came up with this definition of what it is looking for in the nation's classrooms:  
"A good teacher is one who has an active interest in children and youth; has a broad educational background; is professionally qualified and competent; possesses good physical and mental health; has a good moral character; manifests a desire for self-improvement; can work constructively with other professional workers, parents and the community; and is proud of teaching as a profession."  
Last night's session proved to be long and wearing.  
166 Roundtables  
Discussion table chairmen, sitting in two coffee-gulping teams of eight until 2 a.m., simmered down the views of 166 roundtables which had discussed school finance during the evening. Each of the two teams designated one of its members to "refine" the findings.

## French Assembly Dissolved Mendes-France Opens Drive to Unseat Faure

Paris, Dec. 1 (AP)—France's election campaign of one to boom started today only a few hours after Premier Edgar Faure's government decided to dissolve the National Assembly.  
The Socialists and backers of former Premier Pierre Mendes-France lost no time in getting under way their drive for votes in the nationwide election, expected to be set for Jan. 5. They turned their heaviest propaganda artillery against Faure and the dissolution.  
The cabinet decision to dissolve the Assembly—the first such move in the history of the postwar Fourth Republic—was announced last night. It gives Faure the early election the Assembly had denied him.  
The Assembly handed Faure a vote of no-confidence Tuesday, largely because of its opposition to his campaign for early elections. The 318-115 vote, however, permitted use of a clause in the 1946 Constitution providing dissolution of the Assembly by the cabinet if two governments were defeated on votes of confidence by a majority of all members of the house within an 18-month period.  
Mendes-France received a no-confidence vote last February, with more than half the deputies against him.  
Outrage Against Nation

## Paz Returning To Take Reins Of La Prensa

Buenos Aires, Argentina, Dec. 1 (AP)—Famed editor Alberto Ginzburg Paz flew home today to take charge once again of his family's newspaper La Prensa—seized by Juan D. Peron and freed by the men who overthrew the dictator.  
A tumultuous welcome was prepared for Ginzburg Paz, who was on nearly five years' exile in Uruguay and the United States.  
La Prensa's hitlering downtown Buenos Aires urged the populace to turn out for a huge greeting. An automobile caravan was arranged to escort Ginzburg Paz from Ezeiza International Airport.  
Ends Peronista Party  
Provisional President Pedro Aramburu's caretaker government, pledged to right Peron's wrongs and restore democracy, issued simultaneous decrees yesterday returning La Prensa to Paz family and abolishing the Peronista Party.  
This done, government officials launched intensive talks with Henry F. Holland, Spanish-speaking U.S. assistant Secretary of State for Inter-American Affairs, Holland flew in yesterday for a three-day visit during a Latin American tour.  
U.S. Ambassador Albert F. Nufer gave a reception for Holland at the Embassy residence last night. Guests included Aramburu, Vice President Isacio Rojas and a host of other high Argentine officials including cabinet ministers.  
Aramburu and Holland sat down on a couch for an earnest half-hour private talk.  
Holland, who is accompanied by Samuel Waugh, president of the U.S. export-import bank, planned to confer today with Dr. Raul Prebisch, the government's economic adviser. The topic undoubtedly would be possible U.S. economic aid for the new Argentine regime, which has inherited many financial problems left by Peron.  
The new government is doing its utmost to make a good impression on U.S. public opinion—often flouted by Peron. Aramburu has declared himself and his colleagues ardently democratic and anxious for close ties with the United States.  
Anti-Holland Leaflets Spread  
Some leaflets proclaiming "Get out, Mr. Holland" were scattered in Buenos Aires by Argentina's small Communist party as Holland arrived. A few hours later government circles let it be known the authorities were considering outlawing the Communists.

## Adlai Agrees With Dulles on Policy Attacks

Miami, Fla., Dec. 1 (AP)—Adlai Stevenson said today he agreed with Secretary of State Dulles that the presidential candidates should avoid "partisan excesses" in discussing foreign policy during the campaign but that wasn't what the Republicans did in 1952.  
The Democratic presidential hopeful made the statement at a news conference when asked for comment about Dulles' request earlier this week.  
"I agree with Secretary Dulles that we should avoid partisan excesses in discussing foreign policy in the forthcoming campaign," Stevenson said.  
"But he (Dulles) went on to say that the Republican party's conduct in the 1952 campaign was an 'admirable' example of restraint."  
"In 1952 the Republicans not only shamelessly exploited the Korean War politically and denounced the Democratic administration for the 'loss' of China and the Secretary himself, who now pleads for restraint, labeled the containment policy as 'immoral' and proposed to liberate the satellites."  
"I hope we Democrats have a higher concept of what constitutes partisan excesses than the Secretary."

Since the Assembly failed to agree on the new electoral law in a month of discussion, the elections presumably will be held under the 1951 system of modified proportional representation. This permits alliances among parties on a departmental (county) level. If any alliance gets more than half the votes, it puts all the seats from the department.

One slight possibility remained for a change in the voting system. The decree dissolving the Assembly was not expected to be issued for several days and during that time parliament theoretically could meet and change the election law — if agreement could be reached on any new system. It was considered extremely doubtful, however, that any such agreement could be reached.

The delay in publishing the decree, dissolving the Assembly was decided on tentatively because of a constitutional provision calling for elections to be held between 20 and 30 days after dissolution.

The law also specifies a Sunday vote, an immediate publication of the decree would put the elections on Christmas or New Year's day. By delaying publication of the decree, the voting can be held off until Jan. 8.

Faure said the final decision on the political date would be made by tomorrow.

The Socialists also blasted the cabinet decision, branding a common-sense declaration.
