Introducing the subject, Principal Richard B. Mather said the teachers suggest two closings per month at 1 p.m. to sllow for three hour study sessions. They are currently meeting weekly for an hour in the curriculum workshop. It was said that Andover now allows one such closing per month for this type of work: Springfield and Newton, Mass., on a weekly basis and another Connecticut town, less frequently for parent-teacher con-

A complete curriculum guide, geared to the community, was given as the goal of the teachers in order that they "may know where we're going, when and how." The teachers also felt it would be of much value to new teachers. It was pointed out that much time is lost in the short weekly periods reviewing what has been done. The longer period of three hours twice a month would speed up the work, the Board was told.

John McDermott spoke strongly in favor of giving more thought to curricul m and less to building. He said he would be in favor of released time if that's what is required to accomplish this objective. The Board wished to take time for consideration of the request and voted that it be included on the agenda for the December meeting.




