affair with Turner. Her father was dead and she lived with her widowed mother, whom she helped to support.

Continuing with the chronology of the story, the finding states that Turner left Cambridge Springs on July 31, 1955, four days after Miss Hatch's disappearance. According to the report, he drove to Magnolia, Mass., the home of his father-in-law.

Purpose of that time was suspected by police authorities, as well as insurance company investigators, of being involved in two suspicious fires, one at his hardware store, and another at his home or riding about in his truck or automobile.

Blood stains found in Turner's automobile on his return to Cambridge Springs in August, 1955, aroused the suspicion of Pennsylvania authorities, but they were unable to prosecute for lack of a corpus delicti.

Turner questioned in '53

The identity of Turner's suicide police reported that he had been questioned previously in Pennsylvania in connection with the Hatch's disappearance. They told reporters he had returned to his home in Cambridge Springs, Pa., and had received a long suicide phone call.

Dr. Marzialis Urges Parents Start Salk Shot Series Soon

Dr. Nicholas Marzialis, town health officer, today urged Manchester parents to start their children on the Salk shot series of anti-polio vaccine as soon as possible.

Two considerations are involved in having children get the shot, he said. One is that some of the vaccine now on hand in Manchester will be outdated next month and therefore will probably be wasted unless it is used now.

The other is that the Salk shot series takes eight months to complete, with the second shot coming one month after the first and the third about seven months after the second. If a youngster is not vaccinated before the peak of the polio season late next summer, he must start on the series immediately.

At the present time, the State has expanded the limits of the group eligible to receive the vaccine to include children between the ages of 3 and 12 and pregnant women. Formerly, only children between 5 and 9 were eligible.

The State expanded the group even though not all children in the 5-to-9 group had received their Salk vaccine at hand was used before it became outdated.

the body of Henschel aboard. The other chutes, however, sank before they could reach it.

The seaman was the first experimental model of a long-range seaplane invented by the Navy last January. It made its first flight July 14, and put on a brilliant performance at Baltimore last month for Adm. Arthur B. Clark, chief of naval operations, and Adm. Earl H. Taylor, First British Sea Lord.

The medium bomber category, carry a 30,000-pound payload and operate from water, were virtually anywhere in the world. The Navy said its primary missions were mine-sweeping and photographic reconnaissance.

Rockville, Dec. 7 (Special)—A runoff election for the position of city treasurer appeared more unlikely today as Republican candidate Joseph P. McManus voiced his disapproval of putting the city to the expense of such an election.

The runoff election loomed as a result of a tie vote between McManus and Democratic candidate Robert Pus in Tuesday's election. Both men received 1,507 votes.

McManus, who had earlier expressed himself as unfavorable to other than a special election, said this morning he was anxious to settle the question with Pus, but was against doing so by the "flip of a coin" as had been suggested by Pus.

Proposed Tests

McManus said he wanted to eliminate every element of chance. This morning he proposed that a test, including questions about accounting, and about the duties of the city treasurer's post be given both candidates, with the one gaining the highest score receiving the post.

McManus is business manager of City Hospital. Pus is a certified public accountant.

McManus said, "This is apparently makes necessary the conduct of a special election by Pus, but as in the Rockville City Charter of 1923, a tie vote is resolved at an adjourned city election.

"I regard it as regrettable that the Charter provides for a method involving so much expense to the city and that I feel strongly that provision should be amended to provide a simple and inexpensive way of resolving the vote.

"It occurs to me, however, that either Pus or I could resolve to serve and that this might be settled between ourselves. I am influenced in going along with such a proposal because of my thorough disapproval of putting the city to the expense of another election solely to decide the holder of this office.

"I shall, therefore, agree that, as a matter between Pus and myself, we can decide which one of us shall withdraw from the contest and thus save the voters of the city such expense."

Present Salk Plan Seen Satisfactory

Washington, Dec. 8 (AP)—A special advisory group has called for continuation of the present system of giving youngsters three shots of Salk anti-polio vaccine, spaced out over about eight months.

Gen. Leonard A. Schole reported the recommendation yesterday after a meeting with the experts including representatives of the medical and health professions and the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis.

One finding in the vaccination program last summer was that a single shot protected 75 to 80 percent of those getting it against paralytic polio. Because vaccine supplies are short, the group decided to give just one shot to all in the susceptible age, 3 to 4 years.

After the day-long conference, however, Schole reported the specialists unanimously favored keeping on with the present method. He said "It was found that there is enough scientific evidence of the duration of immunity after a single dose to lead to any recommendation for a change in the present dosage."

Rockville-Vernon Religious Unit to Use Gym For Showing of Film Strip

Rockville, Dec. 8 (Special)—For the second time in recent weeks the Board of Education has faced the issue of separating the church and state as it discussed the possibility of a religious film in a public school auditorium.

The issue was brought up by Raymond Ramsdell, assistant superintendent of schools, who said the Rockville Congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses had requested the use of the Northeast School gymnasium for a public showing of a film explaining the principles and teachings of the religion.

After considerable discussion on the matter, the Board voted five-to-two in favor of allowing the group to use the gym.

Talent Objects

Objection was raised by Board member John G. Talcott Jr., who felt that although the Board has allowed other religious groups the use of the school for social functions, this was an entirely different matter, since the Jehovah's Witnesses were planning to use the gym for what he called "propaganda purposes."

He emphasized that his views on the subject were not religious ones but rather civic.

Taking issue with Talcott, Board member Leo Flaherty Jr. said he felt that to turn down the request would be to disregard the government's principle of freedom of religion.

Talcott and Board member Mrs. Hope Ford voted against the motion allowing use of the gym by the group. The Board recently rejected an offer to distribute religious Bibles to school children.

In other business, Flaherty informed the Board that under the General Statutes, the town was spending money illegally for education.

Board Without Budget

He said under Section 84a, towns may expend money without a budget for a period of 90 days. Therefore, since the town is technically without a budget, he said, it had no authority to spend money for its schools.

The budget was recommended to the Board of Finance at the annual Town Meeting, and in October, again recommended at a special Town Meeting last month.

Flaherty said, however, that since it was because of the budget in the case of education in coming up with a suitable budget, and that in the case of the seasonal school, towns are authorized to spend under state authority, probably the town would not have to "close down its schools" because of the statute.

He did say that he felt the Board should at least authorize the superintendent of the situation, and that the Board should not be asked to purchase bills to be paid but merely approve them as educational facilities.
