The Mixture We Are
 Cola G. Parker, the new president of the National Association of Manufacturers, unveiled a real diatribe in his New York speech the other day, and we're glad he did, not because we necessarily agree with his argument and point of view, but because he stated some facts which might as well be emphasized.
 Here are a few samples of his eloquence:
 "Uncle Sam is the biggest spender, the biggest borrower, the biggest insurer, the biggest guarantor, the biggest spender, the biggest borrower, the biggest insurer, the biggest guarantor."
 "The Hooper Commission reports, 'In 1929 the public wealth represented only 15 per cent of total national wealth. In 1948 the public wealth amounted to 27.3 per cent. . . . Is this creeping socialism?' Maybe it is socialism that has stopped creeping and is now walking. I wonder—are we going to let it run?"
 "Just let me remind you of some instances of government control: complete federal control of credit, government guarantees on half of our home mortgages, as many as 12,000,000 getting government checks, 20 per cent of all power produced by government, farm prices determined by federal action, government control of silver and gold purchases, 2,000,000 civilians on the federal pay roll, one-fourth of our land is government owned and no fewer than 104 government agencies, banks and instrumentalities of all kinds engaged in making, guaranteeing and insuring loans."
 "We have gone completely overboard on security. Everything has to be secured, jobs, wages, hours—although the ultimate in security is all the slave labor camp and the salt mine. There are totalitarian masters take care of everything—including a guaranteed annual wage of zero — by means of the hand of free, the bayonet and the big lie."
 "Thus Mr. Parker's painting of what is, to him, a horrible picture of the land of free individual enterprise gone soft and socialistic. But, although his view of the situation, may be extreme, his facts are facts."
 "And that is perhaps important in a way Mr. Parker in particular would never realize. What he is saying is, in effect, that we are already socialistic to some extent. He is saying that we are no longer, in fact, the land of free, individual, capitalistic enterprise he would like us to be. He is saying, in fact, that we are a mixture of capitalism and some variety of socialism."
 "He happens to be saying these things because he deplores them. But he also happens to be telling us, and the rest of the world, some facts we do not usually admit, about ourselves, or proclaim about ourselves."
 "We do not usually tell either ourselves or the world the real truth about what kind of system we do have. We label it capitalistic, free, individual enterprise and let it go at that. That is our usual claim and boast. And it is now supposed to say anything else about ourselves, or tell the fact truth about ourselves, indicates that we are attacking and denouncing it, as does Mr. Parker."
 "But we could, couldn't we, take the same facts and make quite a case out of them? We could say, couldn't we, that what we really have here in America is a compromise between capitalism and socialism, in which we provide some measure of security for all and at the same time preserve a
