We Begin to React
 Our policy reaction to the new Russian policy is beginning to appear, in the words of Secretary Dulles, and in discussions of the approaching federal budget. Fortunately, it does not yet seem to be an imaginative, inspiring reaction.

At the top of our reaction, as it is revealed by budget plans, is an increase in military spending. This is the elemental, visceral reaction whenever we think somebody is being implacable and dangerous. And it is the one reaction everybody always goes for, with a modicum of enthusiasm. To step up our military spending always seems to get the automatic approval of both parties, of everybody.

But, in the present instance, it seems a relatively poor answer to the new Russian policy, and more a diversion of American strength and resources than a creation of it. Russia, at least, is not in a position to take advantage of what the readjustment of American policy is supposed to be about.

Next, nearest the top of our policy reaction is a proposal, which again seems to be receiving prompt political support, to increase our spending for our Foreign Information Service. Such an increase would increase the number of ways in which we would tell the rest of the world about ourselves and our policies.

How good this proves to be depends upon what we have to depend upon. How good it is, rather than on how loud and often we say it. And the truth is that, if we do right things and push right policies, the good word and the good impression about us makes its way around the world, and into the minds of men of its own power, without too much need for words.

So our first two answers to the new Russian tactics in the world seem to be guns and words. That leaves the third traditional weapon, dollars. Here the policy is shaping up at the moment is merely one of not cutting our present rate of foreign aid expenditures. That is likely to be succeeded, very soon, by a proposal that we spend a little more.

Of the three weapons, dollars are perhaps the most efficient for us, and best designed to meet what the Russians are now trying to do, but dollars, so far, stand last on our list.

So, at first glance, we seem most eager and willing to do those things which will do us least good in the world. In fact, we seem more adjusted to a revival of the cold war, in its old form, than to the new phase of the cold war.

But that we should reach for old, known weapons, even though they may not be much good for the test at hand, is natural. And it is particularly so when the real weapon we ought to reach for is actually something almost intangible, in the realm of ideas rather than in the realm of material things. Mr. Dulles happened to be on the trail in his speech the other night, when he urged a revival of the spirit of doing good in the world for the sake of doing good, when he said it was the things of the spirit which will make America great, with its material greatness merely a by-product, when he urged that we stand for freedom and the blessings of freedom everywhere and for all.

For the type of propaganda, political, economic, cultural offensive Russia is now waging in the world, our best answer is to be America, and to act America, and to act ourselves, to act as a free agent, and not as a nervous reactor to Russia.

Not how many guns we have, or what words we say, or what dollars we spend will determine us in the world. It will be doing good.

Lausche Is Willing
 The impetuous decision of Governor Frank J. Lausche of Ohio to stand as a favorite son candidate in his own state, but to make, in his own hitherto strictly enforced policy of "not seeking," and it comes after praise for him from the Democratic South. So it could build up into a thing which gives the Democratic National Convention next year something of a choice, as contrasted with the lack of choice reflected in the present fast run being made by Stevenson.

As the five-term Democratic governor of a state generally considered Republican, Lausche is named as a "middle of the road" Democrat. Some Republicans like to vote for him, and some Democrats don't like to vote for him. That is much the same as it is with another "middle of the road" political figure, President Eisenhower himself. If some Republicans vote for Lausche, he in turn is capable of at least being for some Republican. For instance, he praises President Roosevelt, and he is something of an ironist, but perhaps an encouraging and creditable ironist, that much of Governor Lausche's prospects, support should come from the South. But it is, after all, nearly 30 years since the South did its job in the only Catholic ever a candidate for the presidency. There has been time for a healthy change, and the fact that Southern senators now take a lead in favoring Lausche seems an obvious sign that some change has taken place.

There is a possibility, then, that Lausche may develop into the only real alternative to Stevenson offered to the Democratic National Convention. Officially, we would guess that, if the party could bring itself to nominate a middle-roader, it would find him quite a vote getter.

Help!

Egypt Threat To Israel in U.N. Council

(Continued from Page One)

Israeli Ambassador Abba Eban was prepared to reply that the attack was necessary to bring Egyptian troops which had been harassing Israeli police, laundries and fishing boats.

President Ishak Ben-Zvi in Jerusalem yesterday charged the Arab countries with seeking the "annihilation of Israel" and said the Egyptian attack on the Galilee boats was part of such a campaign.

The Council was expected to hear both sides, then adjourn until next week when members hoped possible action.

In the past the Council has never gone farther than a censure of one side or the other and a request that both sides work with the chief peace supervisor, Canadian Maj. Gen. E. L. M. Burns, to prevent further bloodshed.

British, French and U.S. delegations already have started talks on the situation. An informed source said they were not working on any concrete proposals yet, and added, "the question now is whether a resolution condemning the Egyptian attack will be adopted."

Some delegates assumed that some kind of censure against Israel eventually would result.

British File Protest

Britain protested against the attack yesterday in a note handed the Israeli ambassador to London, Eban, at his residence. This followed up statements of regret from government spokesmen in both London and Paris.

The United States was reported in Washington to have notified Israel that, in view of Sunday's incident, it needed more time to consider a week-old Israeli request to buy some \$50 million worth of U.S. arms.

And in Paris last night, Britain, France and the United States were understood to have agreed to coordinate efforts to help Egypt build the billion dollar high dam at Aswan, on the Nile.

That would get around after Secretary of State Dulles, British Foreign Secretary Harold Macmillan and French Foreign Minister Antoine Pinay conferred in the French capital.

Western aid on the dam would be designed to offset any adverse impact with Egypt the Soviet bloc may be gaining through Chechoslovakia's sale of arms to the nation. That same arms deal has prompted Israel's request for U.S. military aid.

Nasser's letter to Hammarskjold delivered last night by Egyptian delegate Omar Lutfi, matched a warning the Premier gave earlier in Cairo to U.S. Ambassador Henry Byrnes and Sir Humphrey Trevelyan, Britain's ambassador.

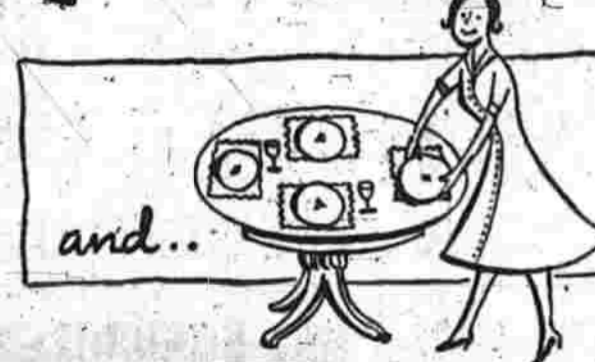

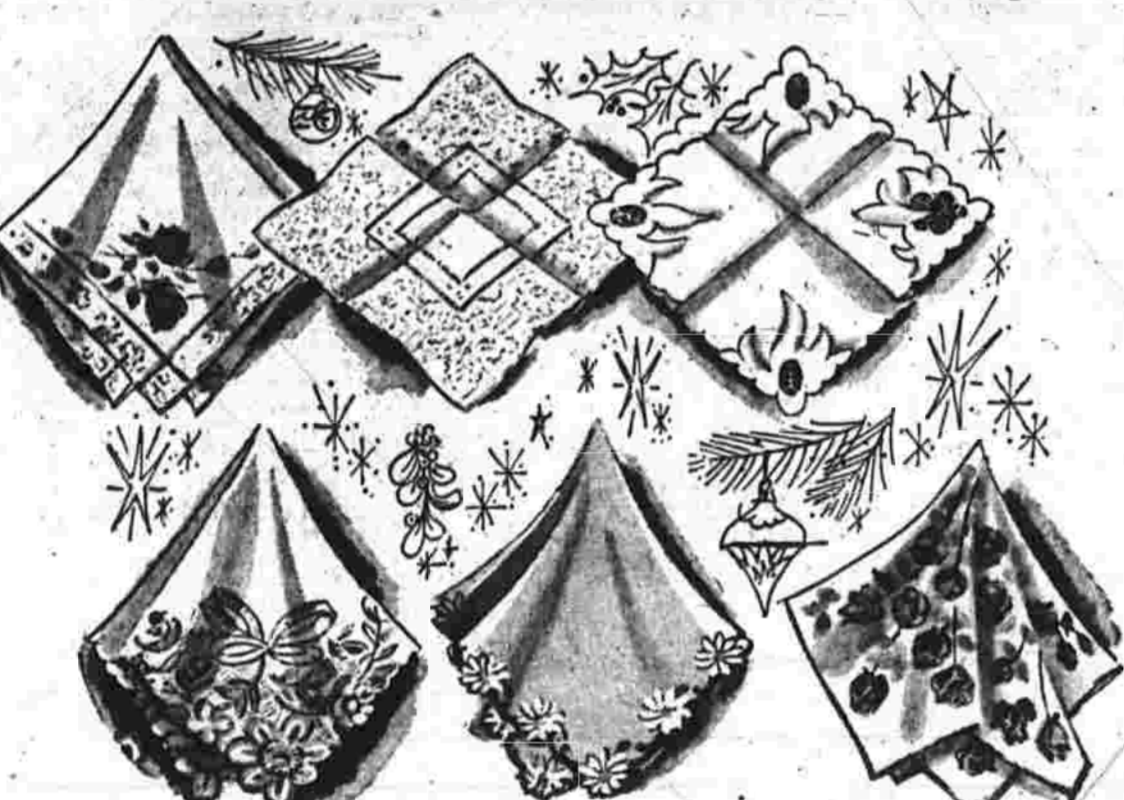

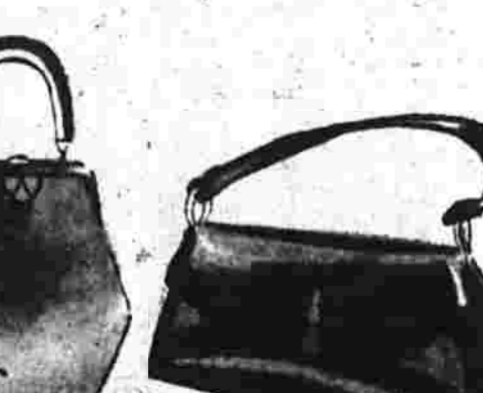
