Chief Seeks Children's Aid To Prevent Holiday Blazes

Bolton, Dec. 18.—With Christmas-marked flames of fire retards being decorated for the week-end, Fire Chief Peter Masolin has distributed a timely issue of a small paper, "The Junior Fire Marshal," to all the Junior Fire Marshals of the entire student body of the Elementary School.

The paper, supplied by the Volunteer Fire Department, carries several interesting articles but major emphasis is placed on Christmas fire safety. Warnings include the fact that a spark from tree lights has caused a bad fire as have frayed light cords.

Families are advised to select a small tree rather than a large one, to keep it outdoors until a day or two before Christmas and to set it in wet soil or water when it is brought indoors. It should also be kept away from radiators, heaters, fireplaces or stoves. It should not block an exit.

There should be no worn or frayed wires, no loose sockets, no tree light sets. New sets should bear the seal of the Underwriters' Laboratories and the switch for turning the lights on or off should be a safe distance from the tree. Ornaments should be fireproof, or

Wapping Fire Officials Ask For New Building

Wapping, Dec. 19 (Special)—During a recent meeting of the Fire Department, Chief Charles Jones, Assistant Chief Charles Jones and Lt. Raymond Blinn were appointed a committee to investigate the matter of expanded fire protection.

Because of the rapid residential growth in the north and eastern sections of the town, pressure is being brought to expand the town's fire protection.

The present firehouse was built in 1925 and the town at that time purchased one pump which is still in operation. In 1945, another pump was purchased.

When the present firehouse was erected, the site was based on its geographical location in the center of the town. The problem of getting to fires from that site to the northern and eastern sections of town has been that much of the town is on an uphill grade and heavy fire apparatus is slowed down considerably.

A site for the new fire company was discussed recently and will probably be located on the upper Billington Rd. or Dart Hill road. The site is about a mile nearer to the new homes being built than the present site.

The committee will have to consider the type of fire equipment to be located at the new quarters, obtaining men for a new fire company and the changing of the town's fire alarm code. The department's regulations will have to be sent to the Board of Fire Commissioners for their approval. Then all expenditures would come before the Board of Finance and eventually to a town meeting for approval.

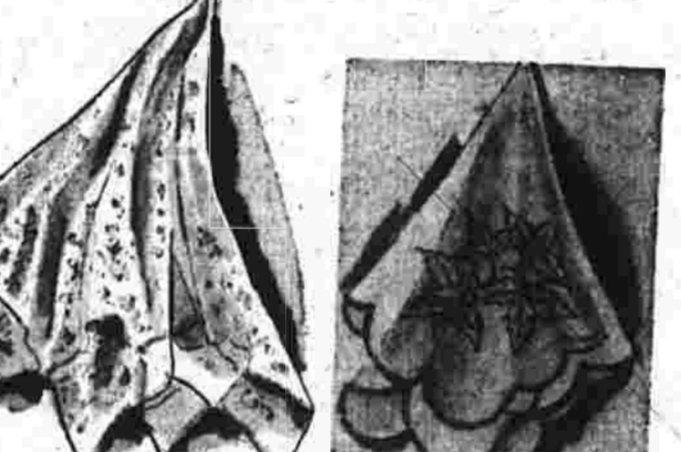

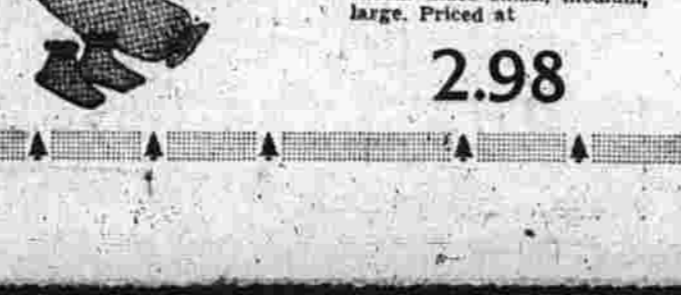
