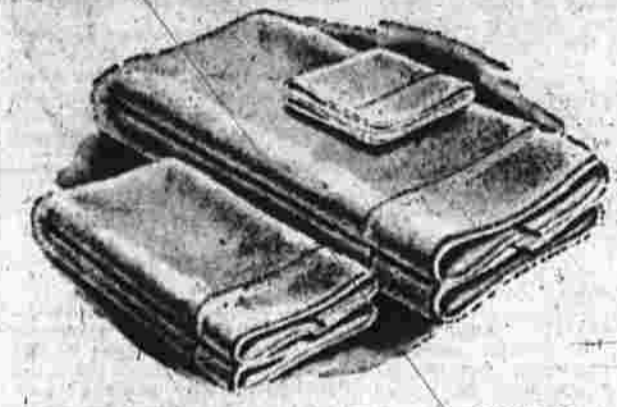

### Hard Liquor Unpopular At U.N. Delegates Bar

United Nations, N. Y., Dec. 21. Whisky with water, or on the rocks — Scotch, Irish or bourbon cocktail — was the most popular drink at the U.N. delegates bar this year but they drank more orange juice and coffee than hard liquor.

The four-part-time bars — the one the delegates lounge in about 24 feet long and the others are smaller — become fairly crowded when an Assembly session crowd.

One of the U.N. staff whose job is to keep an eye on twin problems of bar behavior and supply says the 1955 Assembly produced few hard-drinking drinkers among the delegates.

**Alcoholic Pace Slow**

One or two quick drinks before lunch, or a long drink late in the day while a moot point was talked over, was the general alcoholic pace for most delegates. But sips of coffee, orange juice and drinks like ginger ale kept the bar staff busy.

The Russians used to stun the bar. This year, behind the smiling new look of late summer, some began to show up. They were led by veteran Jacob Malik, graduated from being the "great stone face" of old Security Council days to a hearty backslapping type.

Malik, confided himself to orange juice, explaining he doesn't like the U.S.-produced Vodka served here. After repeated calls for Soviet Vodka, the man who buys the stuff for the bar says he now has a deal to put in both Russian and Polish Vodka next year.

Other central European drinks — the slivovitz — plum brandy, and kumel are also available. They don't sell heavily.

### Union Aide Raps Brownell Charges

New Britain, Dec. 21 (AP) — A field organizer for the United Electrical, Radio & Machine Workers of America (IUE) last night said charges against the union by Attorney General Brownell are "false and cooked up."

Brownell asked the Subversive Activities Control Board yesterday to declare the U.E. a Communist-dominated organization, which would deprive the union of National Labor Relations Board services.

"Brownell has never been a friend of the U.E. and there is no basis for his statement that the U.E. is dominated by Communists," said former state representative Nicholas J. Tomaselli, of New Britain, field organizer who conducted the U.E.'s recent bitter strike against Landers, Fray & Clark Corp. here.

He said all national and local offices of U.E. presently involved, with the CIO Electrical Workers in a strike against the Westinghouse Division of the General Electric Co., signed non-Communist affidavits in 1949 in compliance with the Taft-Hartley law. Since then, he said, U.E. has been using NLRB services.

### Government Signs New Primary Bill

Hartford, Dec. 21 (AP) — Gov. Ribicoff signed the new state primary bill yesterday and immediately one of its provisions became law.

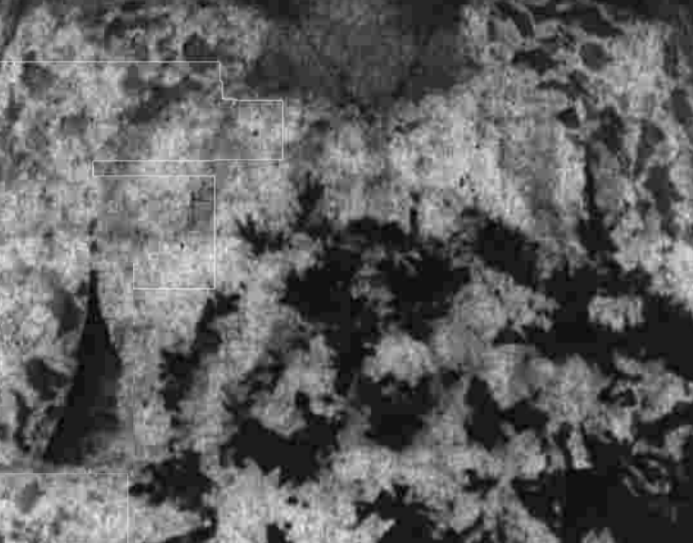

Ex-Rabbi Jailed In Munich for Restitution Fix

Munich, Germany, Dec. 21 (AP)—The Bavarian Ministry of Justice today announced the arrest of former chief rabbi Aaron Ohrenstein. He will begin serving a one-year prison sentence. The ministry said Dr. Ohrenstein was arrested yesterday as he was heading a plane for Switzerland. He was ordered to begin his sentence immediately. The 46-year-old former head of the Jewish church in Bavaria was convicted in 1952 with three others of certifying 111 false claims for restitution to Jewish victims of Nazi persecution. Witnesses at the trial testified some of the claimants did not exist and others had left Germany years before the Nazi crackdown.

Argentine Plot Nipped in Bud

Buenos Aires, Argentina, Dec. 21 (AP)—Provisional President Pedro Aramburu's press office announced today a plot aimed at stirring up public unrest had been smashed with the arrest of 18 persons in Mendoza. The announcement said five retired military men and 13 civilians were arrested in the West Argentine city at the foot of the Andes mountains. No details were given. There have been persistent rumors of a coup in Mendoza since the overthrow of Juan D. Peron's dictatorship in September. It was the second time within a week the government has reported crushing a plot. An Army announcement Monday night said a conspiracy aimed at creating unrest had been smashed at La Plata, a city formerly named Eva Peron (25,380) fine originally levied. The communiqué said 24 persons including a retired colonel and a noncommissioned officer, all former supporters of Peron, had been arrested. There was no official indication whether those arrested in Mendoza were linked with the alleged plot in La Plata. Two weeks ago the federal administrator in Mendoza seized temporary control of the provincial police headquarters, reporting the police still had some "characteristic" of the Peron regime. The police chief resigned and a lieutenant colonel took over. Government forces have been alerted for some days against possible sabotage, strikes, arson and other acts rumored being plotted by former Peronists to harass Aramburu's five-week-old regime. Such disturbances apparently would be aimed at exploiting rising living costs that have followed the government's economic reforms. There has been no solid indication, however, of any serious challenge to the government. State's Auditor Joseph Downes Is Dead at 49

Norwich, Dec. 21 (AP)—Joseph B. Downes, 49, Democratic State auditor for 14 years, died yesterday. He had been ill for some time. He was appointed State auditor in 1941, when Robert A. Hurley was Governor. Before that he had been Democratic registrar of voters and had served three terms as State Senator. He was Democratic leader of the Senate in the 1939 session, and president pro tempore in the 1941 session. He was a native of Norwich, and studied music at Yale. He married Jane K. Sullivan in 1921. He was a member of the original Citizens Committee for Better Government which sponsored council-manager government here. He also served as chairman of the Governor's commission on inter-governmental cooperation. A speech made by Governor during a session of the State Senate in 1938, still remembered because of the unpopularity with which it was met, had been written by Downes. # Origin of Christmas Cards Traced Through Rockville Man's Collection

By ROBERT SHAW  
Rockville, Dec. 21 (Special)—Santa Claus hasn't been around too long. Arthur G. Lyon Jr., of this town, insists.

His evidence is a collection of 20,000 Christmas cards, dating back to 1849. But despite Santa's late arrival, the Christmas spirit has always been with us, Lyon says, watching his wife, two sons and daughter from the family Christmas tree.

The oval-centered, flower-bordered woodcut scene on the card Lyon holds is unrepresentative of the Yuletide season as pictured on modern cards, and is characteristic of the English Christmas cards printed before the popularization of Santa Claus in the early 1900's. Lyon believes the card was printed in the 1850's.

And in an illustrated copy of "The Night before Christmas," printed in New York by a New York greeting card firm, Santa is conceived as a poly-poly, but small, so that his fitting into a chimney would not have to be too imaginative.

And one of the earliest and most realistic of Santas to appear on American cards is a humorous toymaker, clothed in a bear's suit because of North Pole temperatures.

German influence

Santa is an old Dutch legend, originally St. Nicholas. His Americanization followed German influence in the rise of the greeting card industry since the middle 1800's, Lyon explains.

Christmas cards caught on fast to this country, but the processes for manufacturing them, embossing, intaglio, "hand-drawn" and snow-fall effects were kept secret by German illustrators. Through them Santa became a famous figure, and appeared on almost all cards shipped to this country.

English cards printed before that are unusually un-Yuletike, consisting for the most part of king's courts, dancing jesters, damsels and young men, children and the dea, of that day, all romping for the most part not to Christmas greetings but to old nursery rhymes. Lyon has several cards of Kate Greenaway, a famous illustrator and friend of Ruskin and Robert Louis Stevenson, in which children are pictured with animals in sunny settings above "Tues".

"Christmas Greetings may thus be in happy estate and joy be thy follower."

The three periods of the Christmas card, the English with its characteristic "un-Christmassike" illustrations, the English with its American with its capitalization on Santa Claus, and the present, combining Santa and religious themes, are well represented in Lyon's collection. Through the life of old children's books, playing cards, and

photographed documents and photographs. Silver and Stamps

Lyon attributes the birth of his interest in "paper collecting" to "too much silver." As a teller in a Lowell, Mass., bank in 1918, he was confronted periodically by a gentleman who made large coin deposits.

He later became acquainted with him, and found him to be an avid stamp collector. Soon after, Lyon says, he "got the bug" himself, and also began to collect stamps.

From stamps he branched into coins and then greeting cards. He was forced to sell the stamp collection in the 1929 stock crash, after it had been appraised at \$5,000.

The same collection today could easily be worth \$30,000, Lyon says.

Stamps are a coming attraction in the Lyon household. While Mr. and Mrs. Lyon have collected the card market, sons Arthur Jr., 30, and Robert G., have begun stamp collections of their own.

Lyon admits leading an "active life." When not busy with his collection or at his job as publicity director for the State Labor Department, he serves as president of the Northeast School PTA and as an official member of the many hobbyists' groups he belongs to.

"Came to chief to sons — How often have I told you not to talk with someone in your mouth?"

Search Old Albums

The hunt for old Christmas cards is carried on through family albums obtained from private sources, antique shops, and between collectors. At present 500 of Lyon's Yuletide cards, the Santa variety, are on exhibit at the Northeast School.

The rest of his collection is neatly filed and carefully preserved in a crowded second-floor hobby room in his home. There is here not only his collection but his wife Alice's thorough file of old children's books, playing cards, and

## Eden Cabinet Shuffle Gets Mixed Reception

London, Dec. 21 (AP)—Prime Minister Eden announced a wholesale reshuffle of his government today but British newspapers gave the change a mixed reception.

Eden put seven cabinet portfolios into new hands, raised one department to cabinet rank and dropped another from it, liner said.

One of Sir Anthony's closest friends said that the new cabinet was actually only three new members joined the cabinet. Even some Conservative papers expressed doubts and Labors "nature" by — jeered at what they interpreted as a game of political chairs.

The works ministry was raised to cabinet status and Patrick Buchanan-Hepburn, Chief Conservative floor leader in Commons, was named minister to replace Nigel Birch. Ministry of Penalties was dropped from the cabinet.

Those removed from the cabinet — generally men over 60 — either went to the House of Lords or to high offices if they already had peerages.

The reshuffle was Eden's answer to increasing anti-Churchill opposition by the Labour opposition, front and failure to cope with Labour Communist pressure abroad.

The United States and other British allies were concerned by Macmillan's replacement by Sir Walter Monckton.

After serving as foreign secretary for eight months, Macmillan has been considered free even from many Conservatives. His record of industrial and economic indecisiveness toward the growing rift in the Middle East, where the Communists are making an all-out bid to muscle in on the diplomatic and economic fronts.

Respected by Vishinsky, Lloyd, 61 years old to Macmillan's 61, used to needle the Russians with wit and effectiveness when he was second in command at the Foreign Office several years ago and is expected to bring considerable color to a normally staid job.

Nearly all the Soviet government and Communist party leaders were at the more-covered airfield to greet the returning leaders. Among them were Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov, Premier Georgi Malenkov, former President Klement Voroshilov.

Cordons of fur-hatted soldiers with bayoneted rifles lined the sides of the airfield at a respectful distance. There was no welcoming near or far. They stood in their places. But when the planes landed and the leaders stepped from them, the soldiers stepped forward and held up their rifles to salute. In Tashkent, they addressed a conference of cotton growers of Uzbekistan. Khrushchev called for more qualified leadership in Soviet agriculture, but also stressed "the growing role of the Soviet Union in international affairs" according to the Tass News Agency.

He also told the cotton farmers their accomplishments were due to the government program for development of heavy industry, particularly machine building.

Bulganin and Khrushchev are expected to give a full report of their Asian trip at a meeting of the Supreme Soviet scheduled to open Friday.

"Instead of increasing this, they ought to use up the unexpended balances," Byrd said. "I am opposed in general to piling up these unexpended balances because Congress loses all control of the money. We ought to be tapering them off."

Secretary of Defense Wilson told a news conference yesterday that there should be a "substantial" increase in reserve funds for foreign military aid. He said these reserves had shrunk from a peak of \$3,500,000,000 on June 30, 1953, to about \$4,400,000,000 now.

Wilson said some military items require a long time to make and that money should be available for them in advance so firm contracts can be let.

Byrd said he is not raising objections to any "reasonable" expenditures in that field. But he insisted that contracts could be let under advance congressional authorization without actual appropriation of the money until it is needed.

some pine trees only about 50 feet from where it was standing."

It descended like it was in good mechanical condition but it seemed just to come in too low. It hit the top of the trees, hit the dirt, then burst into flames. I saw it burn for a few minutes.

The flight was 642 from Miami to Boston. Stops had been planned for Washington and New York.

Wreckage was strewn along a path of about 200 yards. The wings were sheared off and the four engines burst from their mountings.

Small bushes started up in the day woodland and fire fighters fought for several hours before being able to approach the twisted mass which had been the cabin.

The cabin appeared to have been ripped open. Crumpled pieces of a disintegrated wing shape. A small part of the after cabin broke off and remained virtually intact except for a split along the top.

One big pine tree was snapped and it lay across the rear of the wreckage, still smoking. The firemen began removing the bodies.

The main part of the wreckage was only a short distance from the few houses in the area, just across highway 17 which had a chicken coop some distance from the house was torn down but no houses were hit.

The plane sheared off the top of a 100-foot tall pine and took the top out of a large oak tree. It swept a path about 100 feet wide.

Johnston of the Twpal County Highway Patrol said the plane struck the ground 66 yards from where the first fire hit. Then it skidded 26 yards where it knocked down an oak 12 inches in diameter.

Sixty-five yards farther on was the largest portion of the cabin still intact. This was the tail section and rear end of the fuselage. The bodies were found some 15 yards beyond the tail section.

### Barnard School Cardiac Exams Findings Bared

Preliminary findings from the cardiac screening examinations of the seventh grade students at the Barnard School show 13 suspected cardiac cases out of a total of 143 examined.

According to Dr. George A. P. Landberg, who released the statements, the number of suspected cardiac findings could be considered normal. He indicated perhaps two or three of these cases could develop into serious disorders. The majority could be classified as functional murmurs, not too likely to become serious, Dr. Landberg said.

Dr. Landberg, president of the Manchester Heart Assn., said the objective of his group through program to try to find the incidence of heart disease among the children of the community.

Last year, the first screening was held among senior class members of the high school and physicians from New York and St. Louis came to Manchester to review the results of the program.

The Ford Company paid a fee of \$75,000. The fee is based on 100,000 shares of the estimated aggregate offering price. The actual price, however, may be lower or higher, depending on the underwriters' appraisal of market conditions at the time of the offering.

The filing fee was a record for a common stock issue by an industrial concern.

Many factors were back of the decision to put some Ford stock on the market—among them that of the ordinary stockholders' interest in buying products from a company in which he holds shares.

Speculation on the price has ranged as high as \$75 a share, which would mean the Ford Foundation would receive three-quarters of a billion dollars in cash for reinvestment.

Nevertheless, the offering represents only about 22 per cent of the Ford stock holdings of the fabulously wealthy Ford Foundation.

The prospectus disclosed that dividends equivalent to \$3.27 per share of the capital stock outstanding on Dec. 1 have been paid so far in 1955.

Of this amount, \$1.31 a share was considered extra dividends.

The listing of Ford's profits in the first nine months of 1955 at \$5.85 a share was based on both classes of common stock. It took account of stock splits in connection with the public offering.

This is a 15-for-1 split of class "A" stock and a 21-for-1 split of class "B" stock.

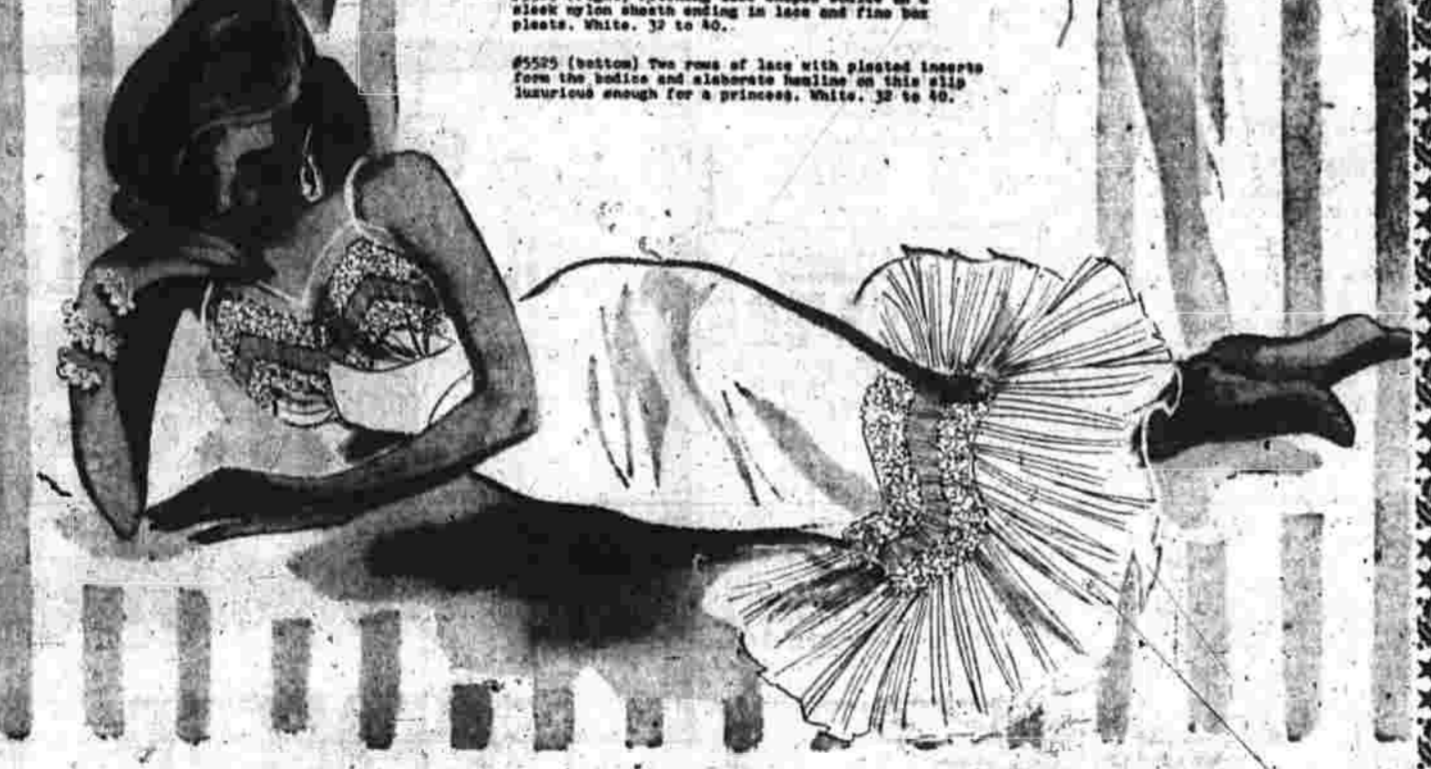

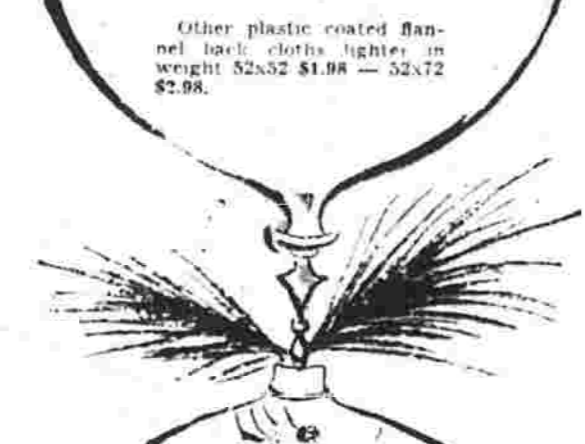

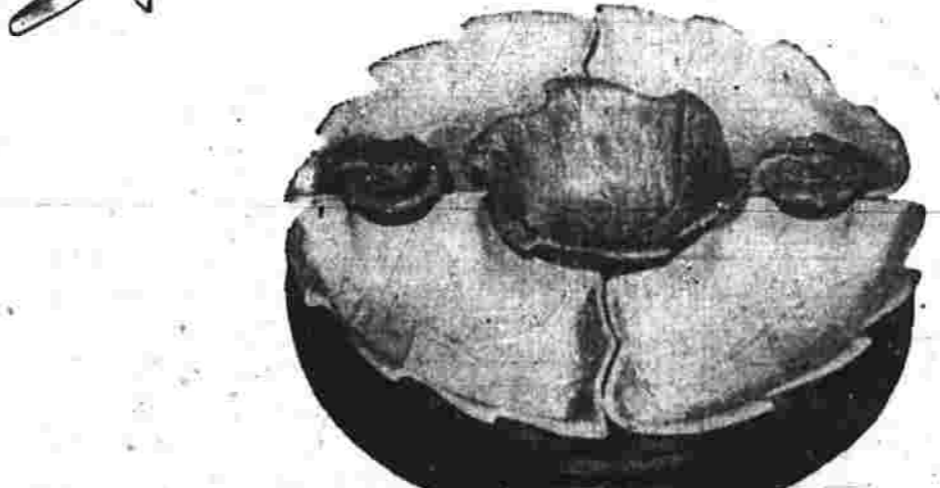
