Rockville, Dec. 27 (Special)—A 1956 Chevrolet sedan sold and ready for delivery, was stolen last night from the Clyde Chevrolet-Buick Co. on Windsor Ave., State Police have reported.

Chef Proclaims Divine Mission To Curb Atom

Paris, Dec. 27 (Special)—Daniel Havaas, the 45-year-old pastry cook who tried to bomb Monmartre's famed bistro de Sacre Cour on Christmas Day, was questioned by police today. Police said he had been arrested for a mental institution without being brought to trial.

After his arrest, Havaas claimed to police he had a divine mission to halt atomic research. He said he planted his small time bomb— which was found and dismantled three hours before it was set to go off— to show the world the dangers the scientists are plotting. "I didn't wish to kill anyone," the cook explained, "but to make a big noise."

Second Bomb Never Found A second bomb, reportedly placed in the Cathedral of Notre Dame, was never found. Havaas was traced through agency of warning letters he had written to Maurice Cardinal, Pelin, archbishop of Paris; the Count of Paris, pretender to the throne; French throne—the British Embassy and others. All were signed "Daniel Saint-Maur; count of Paris."

Police said they found three more partially constructed bombs in Havaas' room. Each was packed with a tube of explosive black powder, an alarm clock timing mechanism, and an electric battery. Havaas told police his father had accidentally shot him in the head as a child while cleaning a gun. He later served in the Army as a medic aide.

He married in 1937 but left his wife in 1944 because "he did not understand my ideas." Havaas said he wanted atomic research halted by communication of the atomic scientists. He told police he had "revelation" in March, 1949, that Pope Pius XII, the Archbishop of Canterbury and myself alone have the power to communicate Christians who indulge in criminal nuclear research.
