#### Reaction To The Message

What is wrong with our world can be seen, clearly enough, in the reaction to the Christmas message of Pope Pius XII.  
It so happened that he touched on the world problem represented by man's possession of atomic power. It so happened that he said some things everybody really knows to be true. And it so happened that, when speaking for humanity itself, he happened to endorse some proposals which have been made by the State, and some that have been made by the West.  
Specifically, he warned the world not only against the use of atomic weapons in war, but even against further test explosions of atomic weapons. These are policies being urged by Communist propagandists and Communist diplomats, and by the diplomacy of neutrals such as Nehru of India.

"Well, here in this country at least, as distinguished a presumed thought leader as the New York Times goes through the message, picking out those things in which the Pope seems to agree with American policy, and applauding his fine Christian wisdom in these matters. Then it also weeds out those instances in which the Pope seems to agree with somebody else in the world, and finds that, in these instances, the good Pope has been a little 'simple'.

"He warns us not only against the use of atomic weapons in war, but against further test explosions of atomic explosives, which might cause increased density of radioactive products in the atmosphere and generate conditions very dangerous for many living beings." The issue is not a simple one. Scientists do not agree as to how much radiation life on earth can endure. Strategists argue that if our possible opponent continues to experiment with these instruments of hell no must we. If there is no further experimentation power relationships may be stuck at their present level—not necessarily a good thing.

#### A Thought for Today
