Churchill's bid for peace during the last 10 years for peace and goodwill toward man.

Churchill was slowly to be put on a pair of half-moon glasses and told Clark: "I think it is a charming idea for the city of Philadelphia to award the Benjamin Franklin Medal to an English representative."

"I shall always cherish the medal for sentimental reasons," he said also as a work of art, worthy of Jacob Franklin's skill and fame.

"I shall cherish it too, because I am a half American myself," he said.

Churchill spoke of the Philadelphia's great work for a 17th-century American friendship when Franklin was again in London from 1773 to 1775. He said the spirit of Franklin would be hard to build up still lives.

"I earnestly hope that we have reached the end of misunderstanding, and that we shall move forward steadily together toward a world, which, though full of difficulties, is not without hope and will not be without hope so long as Britain and America stand together," he declared.

Churchill, whose mother was Jewish, stressed the need for the great developments of science which Franklin himself would appreciate made the need for world understanding more important.

"Mr. Clark arrived here in a flash from the ocean," and he said in a good instance of how the very difficulties of space can be diminished by hard to build up still lives.

After the brief speeches, Churchill examined the award medal closely.

"It certainly is a magnificent piece of sculpture," he said.

He showed it to Clark's attractive dark-haired wife and to the American charge d'affaires in London, Washington, who headed the gift list.

About 30 other guests packed the tiny reception room of the Benjamin Franklin House, now headquarters of the British Society for International Understanding.

A coal fire roared in the original fireplace, and over the mantel was an old color print of Franklin in his motion picture, wearing his "plain brown suit of simple homespun." Brass candlesticks with tall red candles flanked the portrait.

Tax Deduction Seen for Some Flood Victims

When is the loss deductible? Casualty losses are deductible only in the taxable year when they occurred. Since most people pay their taxes on a calendar year basis, they can deduct from 1955 income only for losses suffered in 1955.

There are two kinds of casualty losses that may be deducted. One is a non-business loss suffered by a taxpayer whose home, pleasure boat, automobile or other property is damaged or destroyed.

The other is loss to business property, including buildings, equipment and inventories.

As business tax bookkeeping may involve such complex items as capital gains, the rules for deducting business losses become pretty complicated. It is best for any businessman who does not have his own tax adviser to seek help from the Revenue Service.

Here are the general rules concerning non-business property: 1. Any part of your loss which is reimbursed by insurance is not deductible. That is, if you figure that your home was damaged to the extent of \$1,000, but your insurance covered \$1,000 of the loss, you would have no more than a \$500 deductible loss. If the insurance payment was greater than your loss, you would have to report the excess as added income.

If you do not collect on your insurance by the end of the taxable year, you should estimate how much of the loss will be recovered from insurance, or from a suit for damages, and deduct from your 1955 income only the remaining loss.

If your estimate turns out later that you are not to receive any more than the amount of your insurance, you will have to add back the amount of your deduction to your 1955 income.

appeal from lower court refusal to grant a new trial grounds of newly discovered evidence.

The high court gave no indication when it would hear oral arguments on the appeal before handing down a decision.

The court admitted the case under its motion doctrine, which customarily does not show how Judge had ruled.

On the second phase of the appeal, the judge unanimously refused to consider the case on grounds of alleged error in denying Sheppard a new trial.

After hearing future oral arguments of the court, Dr. Sheppard's conviction to stand, he must serve a 10-year term in prison from the date of his admission before.

May Renew Town Clerk Issue Here

The controversial question of putting the town clerk on a salary instead of permitting him to retain his office may come up for renewed discussion at Tuesday's meeting of the Board of Directors.

Atty. Jay Rubinow, president of the Citizens Committee of Manchester, reportedly plans to urge the Board at that meeting to speed up adoption of a number of amendments to the charter proposed by a number of local organizations.

At the last session of the Legislature, conducting bills sponsored by local Republicans and Democrats died when no political agreement was reached on them.

The Democrats wanted the clerk salaried and elected, while the Republicans wanted him appointed and elected. The GOP insisted on salary and appointment by the general manager.

Public Hearings Seven public hearings are listed on the agenda for the Board which meets at 8 p. m. in the hearing room of the Municipal Building.

One of the hearings is on a proposed new building code which is on file in the town clerk's office for inspection. The code differs from the present antiquated code in many respects.

As Water Commissioners, the local legislators will hold a hearing on the installation of sanitary sewer pumping station and line for homes on Ayres, Jatchfield, and Portland Sts. The estimated cost is \$122,000.

Five other hearings concern additional appropriations in the budget of \$1,100 for elections; \$4,135 for interest on money borrowed temporarily to buy the park land portion of Globe Hollow; \$2,810 for the Water Department.
