New Building Code Adopted By Board Following Hearing

A new building code for the town was approved by the Board of Directors last night and will go into effect within a couple of weeks.

The Board voted on the building code ordinance with virtually no discussion after a brief public hearing in the hearing room of the Municipal Building.

The action came after months of intensive work by a building code revision committee composed of town officials and representatives of the building trades. The committee, headed by Director Harry Firato, was set up four years ago.

The new code will replace an antiquated and narrow code which gave the building inspector no discretion in permitting the use of new-developed methods and materials. The new code, a uniform code being adopted by municipalities in Connecticut, is more comprehensive and flexible.

Urged speaking for the contractors in the Manchester Contracting Assn., urged the Board to pass the ordinance as did Alexander Jarvis, local building contractor.

The only reservation was expressed by A. B. Hamilton, general superintendent of the Hartford Gas Co., who proposed an amendment concerning regulation of gas appliances and their installation.

Proposed amendments will be considered later, since it appears much easier to adopt the code as is and make minor changes later, according to advice General Manager Richard Martin gave the Board last night.

There was no public expression at public hearings on additional appropriations to the current budget and the Board voted the appropriation, which include \$1,100 for election, \$4,185 for interest on notes for the purchase of the Globe Hollow land, \$3,510 for the work portion of that purchase, \$1,000 interest on notes sold to finance the start of a new sewage plant, and \$1,000 for repairs to the Municipal Building.

Set Subdivision Bond

The Board set \$75,000 as the amount of the bond for the subdivision and Jarvis turned the bond over to the manager. The bond is to guarantee the installation of certain utilities and will be returned to Jarvis when the utilities are installed.

The Directors made two technical changes in resolutions they passed concerning the purchase of Globe Hollow.

Martin reported to the Board that local Boy Scouts have permeated the bounds of the town in accordance with a General Association requirement and have reported on the condition of markers. He took the opportunity to thank the Scouts publicly.

Boys' Martin's Stand

And Director Harry Firato complimented Martin on the stand he took in a letter to Patrick McElhinney, president of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad, over the resumption of passenger service between Hartford and Boston by way of Putnam.

In a strongly-worded letter Monday, Martin scored McElhinney for "what seems to be your attempt to take advantage of the August flood disaster by abandoning the service without allowing the public to be heard."

Mid-Air Jet Crash Fatal to U.S. Pilot

Troy, Ohio, Jan. 18 (AP)—Two Air Force jet fighters—scrambling past each other in simulated maneuvers—crashed seven miles above earth last night.

One pilot, Capt. E. K. Thayer, apparently ejected himself from his disabled craft and parachuted safely to earth. The other, First Lt. J. J. Schulte, 27, was killed. His badly mutilated body was found near the wreckage of his plane.

The crash was witnessed by a Ground Observer Corpsman from his Troy post. In the semi-darkness of twilight he watched the two F-86 fighters collide, then fall about two miles apart of each other.

Both planes were based at Wright-Patterson AFB, Dayton, and were part of the 48th Fighter Interceptor Squadron.

U.S. Jet Pilots Improving Aim By Dart Game

Wendover Air Force Base, Utah, Jan. 18 (AP) - American fighter pilots are trying a new game of darts - played at nearly super-sonic speed high above the earth - to sharpen their shooting eyes.

In a twist on the old game, the object in this one is to hit the dart - with bullets and cannon fire from jet fighters. It's a serious and difficult game that for the first time gives pilots a chance to test their aim on a target as hard to hit as enemy aircraft, maybe harder.

The Naval Ordnance Test Center at Inyokern, Calif., invented the new target, and both the Navy and the Air Force have adopted it. Air Force sharpshooters from Tactical Air Command are here now working out new techniques and looking for ways to improve the target.
